Policy 5112.1: Exemptions From Attendance

Each student between the ages of 6 and 18 shall be subject to compulsory full-time education. (Education Code 48200)

However, the Superintendent or designee may grant exemptions from compulsory attendance to a student as allowed by law and in the best interest of the student. Exemptions shall not be used to remove a student from the school for disciplinary purposes.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that exemptions from compulsory attendance are applied equitably across all student demographic groups. Decisions regarding exemptions shall not disproportionately impact specific student populations.

As needed, the Superintendent or designee may require a student or the student's his/her parent/guardian to submit written documentation that the student fulfills one of the conditions specified in law and administrative regulation for which exemption is authorized.
