Trustee Brian Wheatley announced that he had been on vacation with his wife celebrating their 40th anniversary. He thanked his Board colleagues for continuing the work while he was away, particularly Trustee Carla Collins for filling in for him at the MetroED Governing Board Meeting. He gave a brief report on the meetings and events in which he had participated or attended upon his return, including a meeting of the Superintendent's Board Policy Committee, the Future Chefs Challenge at Gunderson, Assemblymember Gail Pellerin's Women of the Year celebration, and his volunteer work with Project Cornerstone in Miss De La Cerda's third grade class.

Trustee Nicole Gribstad reported on the meetings she had recently attended, including the meeting at Graystone Elementary about the closure of the Special Day Class there, and a community input meeting at Willow Glen High School. She requested clarification from Board President Teresa Castellanos regarding her decision to decline her request to attend the California School Boards Association's Coast2Coast Federal Advocacy Trip in Washington D.C. She addressed the District's Comprehensive Safety Plan with suggestions to include gang prevention and student well-being, including education on the dangers of fentanyl and prioritizing the modernization of school facilities before investing in affordable workforce housing.

Trustee Brian Wheatley added to his report to provide an update as the Board President's delegated representative on the Special Day Class closure meeting that was held at Graystone Elementary on Monday. He acknowledged Chief Business Officer Seth Reddy and Special Education Director Chris Metcalfe for answering a lot of tough questions from parents who were worried about their children.

Board President Teresa Castellanos thanked Trustee Brian Wheatley for the update and acknowledged that the situation would continue to be discussed.

Trustee Carla Collins gave a report on the meetings and events in which she recently participated or attended, including several events in recognition of Women's History Month and the community input meeting at Willow Glen High School. She announced that she is looking forward to participating in interviewing the candidates for next year's student board members on Monday. She reminded everyone that Monday is also Cesar Chavez Day and acknowledged the hard work that staff do each day as public servants. She announced that she would be in Los Angeles this weekend to attend another women's conference. She encouraged everyone to attend the upcoming meeting of the Advisory Committee on Use of SJPD Officers scheduled for next Thursday at 6:00 p.m. in the Boardroom. She wished everyone a restful spring break.

Board Vice President José Magaña gave a brief report on the meetings and events in which he recently participated, including the meeting of the Superintendent's Board Policy Committee and his experience participating as a celebrity judge for the Future Chefs Challenge. He announced that tomorrow he would be participating in a day of learning hosted by The Tech in recognition of National AI Literacy Day.

Board President Teresa Castellanos reported her attendance at the Cafecito at Grant Elementary on Friday where the principal shared the results of the Future Chefs Challenge with the parents, announcing that the arepas prepared by a Grant Elementary student had won third place.
