The attached form records our district and/or school representatives to leagues for the 2025-26 school year. It is a form sent annually to obtain the names of league representatives to every league in the state and to make sure that the league representatives are designated by the school district or school governing boards. It is a legal requirement that league representatives be designated. The education code gives the authority for high school athletics to high school governing boards. The code also requires that the boards, after joining CIF, designate their representatives to CIF leagues. This is a necessity! (Ed. Code 33353 (a) (1)) Once approved by our Board, the signed form specifying the league representatives will be sent to the local CIF Section office. Obviously, the presumption behind this code section is that only the designated representatives of the boards will vote on issues at the league and section level that impact athletics. If a governing board does not take appropriate action to designate representatives or this information is not given to Section offices within the required time frame, CIF is required to suspend voting privileges (CIF Constitution, Article 2, Section 25, p. 18) for the affected schools. At the State Federated Council level, Sections will be asked to verify that their representatives are designated in compliance with the Ed. Code section.			N/A

We have been involved with AVID since 2017.</p>		<p>Graduation rates and CSU/UC completers will be monitored yearly to track the impact of AVID programs on student success. Over the last two academic years, seniors in AVID programs across SRCS have had an average of a 95.6% graduation rate. In addition, over the last two academic years, 27.8% of seniors in AVID programs across SRCS met CSU/UC transfer requirements at the time of graduation. AVID Elementary trains educators to use proven strategies to improve instruction and create a more student-centered learning environment. Metrics for evaluating the impact of AVID Elementary will focus on academic achievement, student agency, and the cultivation of a college-going culture. Santa Rosa City Schools was awarded a Golden State Pathways Program (GSPP) Implementation grant to support Elsie Allen High School and Piner High School to support the development of healthcare-focused integrated pathway programs, which connect core academic and CTE classes, embed early college credit opportunities, student support, and work-based learning. A portion of the GSPP grant award will be utilized to contract with the CTE Foundation of Sonoma County (CTEF) to provide intermediary services, as outlined in the contract, grounded in the five components of GSPP: Integrated program of Study, Work-based Learning, Integrated Student Supports, Regional Ecosystem, and Coherence and Sustainability.		SRCS has a strong partnership with the CTEF and has been working closely with this organization to support the whole school transformation work at Elsie Allen High School. This contract will expand this work to Piner High School. SRCS received approval from the CDE on the revised Golden State Pathways Program Implementation budget in May, 2025. Therefore, a contract to expand this work could not be brought forward until this date.
