Why Change?

- Align committees with strategic priorities
- Optimize governance: transparency + flexibility

Brown Act Committees – Overview

- Governed by California's Brown Act
- Provide direct Board advisory
- Formal structure: agendas, quorum, public meetings

- Budget, Finance & Audit Advisory Committee
- **Wellness Advisory Committee** (*new; nutrition emphasis*)

- Operate with fewer formal constraints
- More operational flexibility
- Aim to broaden participation
- Still aligned to district goals

- Membership selected by Superintendent or designee
- Annual update to Board via uniform template

- Expanded access + diversified input
- Strong alignment with district strategy
- Encourages innovation and responsiveness
- Maintains transparency and oversight
