Dr. Bryan Brown will provide in-person professional learning to a cohort of Elementary Teachers from across SRCS and a cohort of middle school and junior/senior high school secondary science teachers using a design workshop process, including specific strategies to support multilingual students in accessing science concepts and disciplinary science language. The design based workshop will highlight key research from Dr. Brown's Science in the City Culturally Relevant STEM Education book and his research on language and science along with his research on Pathway to Literacy: Using 'Disaggregate instruction' to Promote Science Literacy in which specific strategies are outlined to support science disciplinary language acquisition along with academic knowledge through increased student discourse that builds on students cultural knowledge, along with the rich linguistic knowledge and everyday experiences they bring to the classroom.		This MOU supports Elementary and Secondary science teachers with specific research based strategies to support their multilingual learners with Science concepts and disciplinary science vocabulary through repeated opportunities to engage in scientific discourse drawing on phenomena connected to students' lived experiences. The initial two-day fall session will feature targeted training and workshop opportunities designed to enhance science teaching practices that provide increased discourse opportunities for students supporting language development for multilingual learners. The subsequent two-day spring session will offer educators a forum to share progress, collaborate, and integrate new instructional strategies. They focus on the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and rehabilitation of sports-related injuries, particularly for athletes. Their services often include medical consultations, injury management, and collaborative efforts with schools and athletic programs to ensure the health and safety of student-athletes. They may also provide expertise in managing conditions like concussions and other traumatic brain injuries, working closely with athletic trainers and school staff to support athlete health and performance.		Santa Rosa Sports Medicine, Inc. has been a key partner with SRCS in supporting the health and performance of our student-athletes. Since 2014, they have supported our Athletic Trainers by providing comprehensive sports medicine services and consultations. We are now presenting an amendment to the existing agreement to update the standing orders in accordance with the latest requirements from the Board of Certification for the Athletic Trainer (BOC) and with updates from the Sports Medicine Department at SRJC. This update ensures that our practices remain aligned with current professional standards, and enhancing the quality of care provided to our athletes. Original agreement was board approved on August 14, 2024.			For the 2024/25 school year, over 350 coaches were involved in programs. Student athlete participation in 24/25 shows that 2,097 males and 1,556 females applied to participate in interscholastic programs; which is an increase from the 23/24 year in which 2,058 males and 1,543 females applied to participate in interscholastic programs. For the 24/25 school year 1,071 baseline concussion tests and 95 post-injury concussion tests were administered across all 5 comprehensive high schools sites, and within the 10 interscholastic athletic activities within SRCS that require concussion screening.
