Re: Call for Nominations for Representatives to the Sonoma County Committee on School District Organization (S.C.C.S.D.O.)

Dear School District Governing Board Members:

The Sonoma County Committee on School District Organization consists of 11 members – two members from each of the five county supervisorial districts and one at-large member. Members of the Committee are elected to four-year terms by the voting representatives from each of the governing boards of all the Sonoma County school districts (one vote for each district). *For additional information on the County Committee please visit the SCOE website at www.scoe.org.*

We are looking to fill three seats from Supervisorial Districts 2, 3, and 5 (one seat from each district). Below is an outline of the current/incumbent members on the committee that are seeking re-election. For your reference, a list of school districts by supervisorial district (area) is included at the end of this letter. Many districts are partially located in several areas.

Area 2: Open
Area 3: Open
Area 5: Open, incumbent to seek re-election

Any registered voter who meets the following criteria may nominate him/herself, or a school board may, but is not mandated to, nominate a candidate to serve on the County Committee to fill this four-year position. The term of the position will begin January 1, 2026 and expire on December 31, 2029.

Any registered voter who is a resident of the intended Supervisorial District is eligible to serve on the County Committee on School District Organization, with the exception of the County Superintendent of Schools or her employees, or employees of any school or community college. The duties and responsibilities of the County Committee may be found in Part 3, Chapter 1, Article 1, of the Education Code.

Nominations, which also require a filing of a Statement of Interest, may be sent by mail to the Sonoma County Office of Education to Lacey Goff, or by email to lgoff@scoe.org and must be received on or before **4:00 pm on Friday, October 3, 2025**. Pursuant to Education Code 4006, the County Committee has approved the use of absentee ballots (mail-in and electronic) in this election, which will be sent via email and mail to your Board of Trustees' elected County Committee voting representative during the week of October 13, 2025.
