Dispatch Call Suspicious Vehicle

At 1029 hours I received a call from the Live Oak Administrative Assistant Diane Lusty. Diane asked me to check on an unknown person sleeping in an older model vehicle near the front court lot.

I arrived at 1030 hours and noticed a maroon Honda Accord parked in the shade with the front passenger seat reclined. I took a picture of the vehicle plate and approached the passenger side. I observed a middle aged Hispanic female asleep in the seat.

I knocked several times on the window to wake the female, and asked why she was parked there. The woman identified herself as student Amelia's mother. She explained in Spanish that she worked all night, dropped her sons off at work, and was exhausted after dropping her daughter off at school.

The woman said she felt it was unsafe to drive and figured she would nap in the car until her daughter got out of school at 11:45 hours. I apologized for waking her and responded to the front office of Live Oak.

I spoke with office staff who confirmed Amelia was a student. I explained that the woman was not a threat and would be gone in about an hour.

I then left the area and returned to Antioch High School without further incident.

Narrative:
On November 30, 2025, at 1616 hours, Sergeant A. O'Brien, Corporal P. Nguyen, and Officer A. Evans were dispatched to Mission Elementary School for a motion alarm activation originating from Zone 49, identified as the D5 Portable. Sergeant O'Brien and Corporal Nguyen arrived on scene at 1618 hours and immediately observed an African-American male wearing a black jacket with a blue or black hoodie or beanie exiting the D5 portable classroom while holding items in his hands. Both officers scaled the perimeter fence to gain access to the school grounds and initiated a foot pursuit.

The subject fled toward the west side of the campus, jumped the west gate leading to the trail area, and continued westbound toward Lucena Way. Sergeant O'Brien lost visual contact with the suspect along the trail. Corporal Nguyen subsequently exited the school grounds, returned to his patrol vehicle, and conducted an area search in the direction the subject was last seen heading. He located the individual near Buchanan Road and Hampton Lane, where the subject was seen jumping the fence from the Antioch Covenant Church property. At this time, the subject was described as an African-American male wearing a yellow raincoat and a blue hoodie with dreadlocks as he ran toward the nearby townhomes. Corporal Nguyen again lost visual contact during this search.

While conducting the area check, Corporal Nguyen located the suspect's discarded black jacket in the church parking lot near a shed. Inside the jacket, he found an AUSD school radio believed to have been taken earlier from Portable D-12 during a break-in that occurred earlier that morning. Corporal Nguyen also discovered what appeared to be a controlled substance concealed inside a sunglasses case in another pocket.

A further inspection of the school campus revealed a black stroller, multiple trash bags, and a backpack next to Portable D4. These items had been used by the suspect, who was observed earlier loading the cart and bags with food items. All recovered property was secured back inside Portable D5. The backpack and the suspected controlled substances were collected by the Antioch Police Department for evidence.

The recovered school radio was secured inside the school's main office for retrieval by staff. Antioch Police Department officers responded to the scene, conducted an investigation, and advised that this incident will be connected to the previously established case for the break-in at Portable D-12.



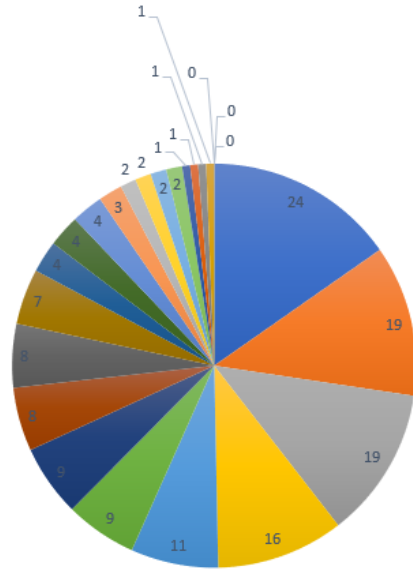

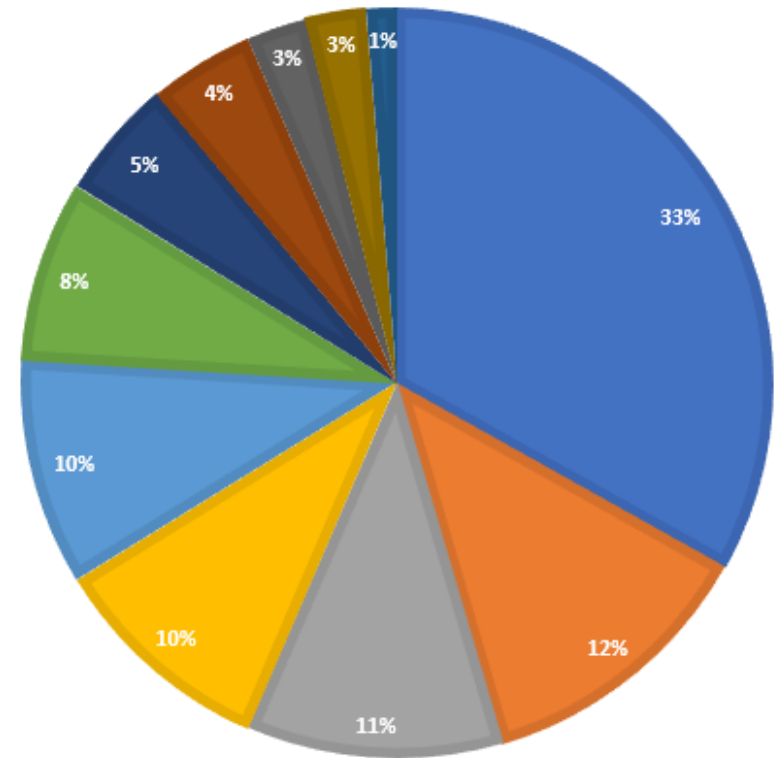
