Atlanta Public Schools is committed to continue providing a robust summer learning experience for all students that addresses both unfinished learning and learning loss experienced by students as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Overview

During **Summer 2022**, APS will offer the following robust programming that is accessible to all students:

Summer Academic Recovery Academy (ARA) ES and MS

A full-day summer program for all **elementary** and **middle** school students that integrates social-emotional learning and comprehensive academic intervention. The students will also have the option to participate in extended learning activities through **Power Up programming**.

Summer Academic Recovery Academy (ARA) High School

High school students will focus on **credit recovery** and graduation.

Other Summer APS 2022 Programming Offerings

Atlanta Public Schools will also offer other summer programming for specific grade levels and interests.

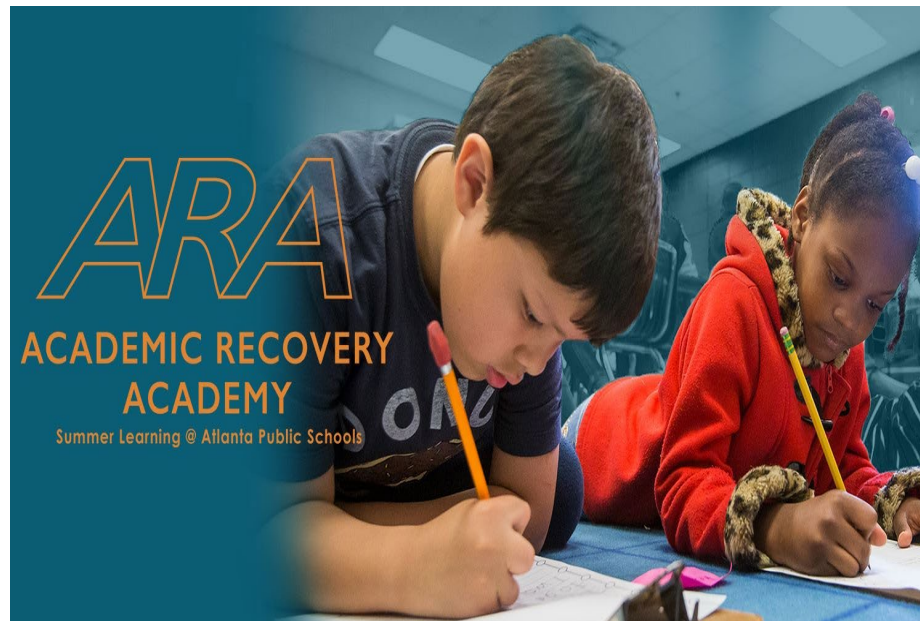

Year 1: Summer 2021 Review



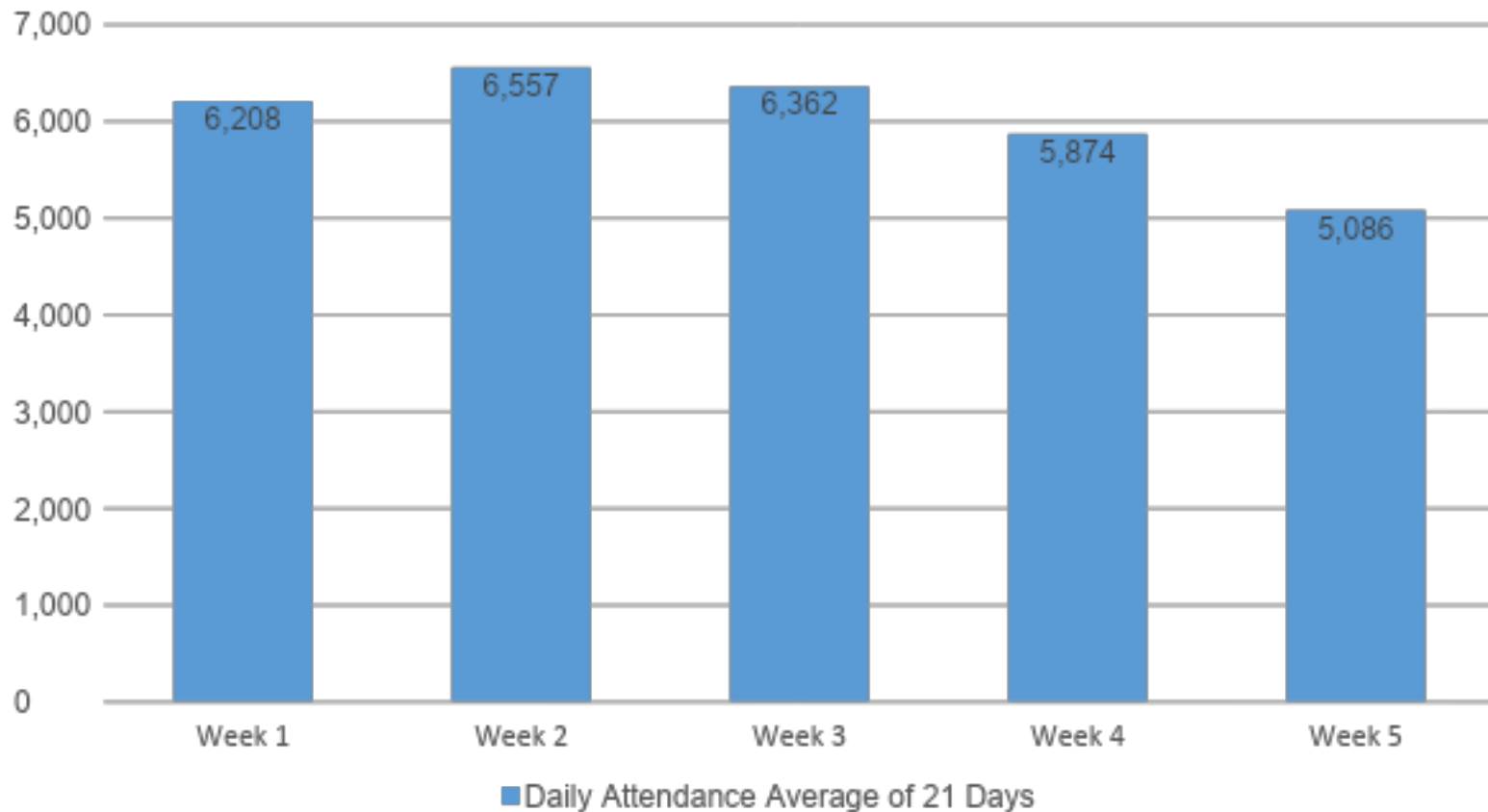
Summer Academic Recovery Academy (ARA) Year1: 2021 Review

- June 2nd-June 30th (21 Days)
- 27-Elementary Schools Sites
- 7-High School Sites

- Student Enrollment at its highest was 11,000+; however, once the program started and the no-show students were processed (July 15). Our student enrollment adjusted to 9,437 students.

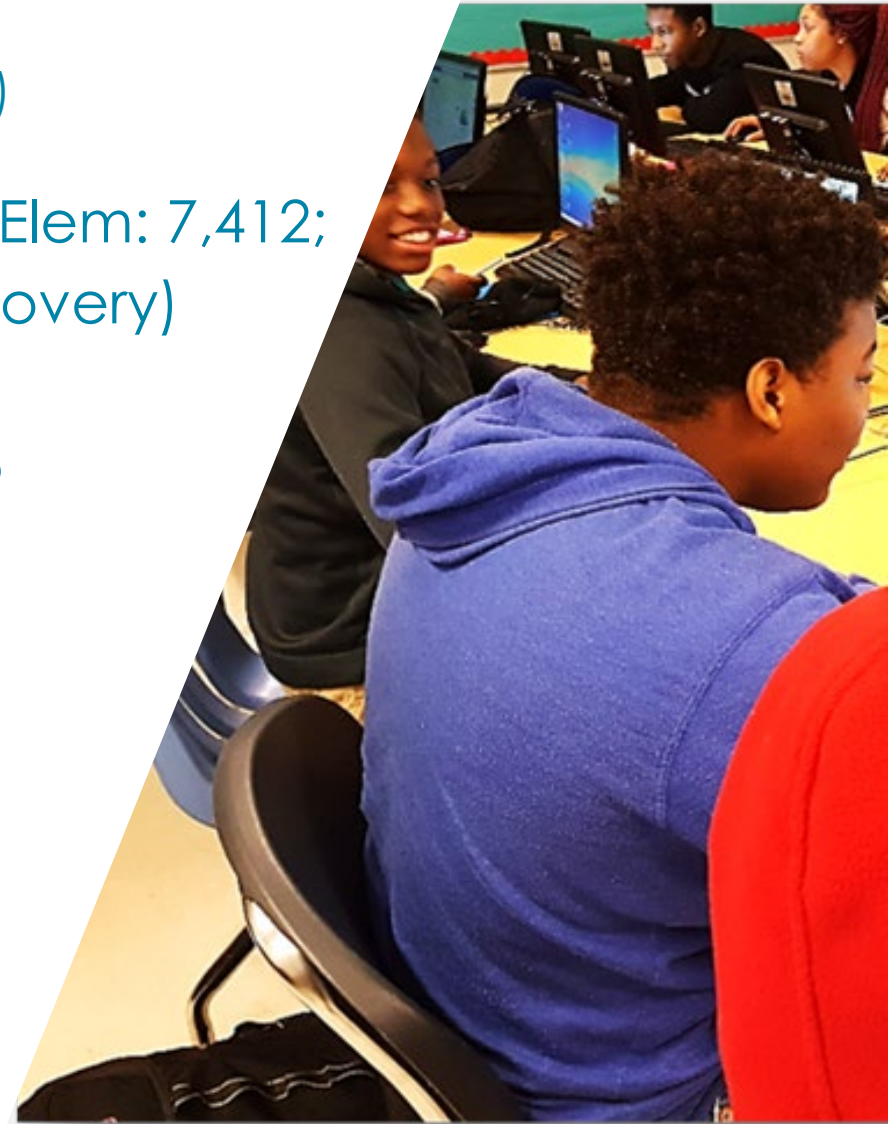

Summer Academic Recovery Academy (ARA)

Elementary and Middle School Full Day Schedule

(Morning): Implement district selected academic recovery programming focused on literacy, mathematics and the integration of social emotional learning four hours per day, five days a week at the designated in-person elementary school and virtual site (current AVA students only).

(Afternoon): Offer APS **PowerUp** programming (i.e., Artportunity Knocks, Inc., STEM/STEAM, Digital Citizenship, Conflict Resolution); approximately 90 -120 minutes per day, five days a week.

Students who **do not attend the academic recovery portion of the day will have the option to attend the **PowerUp** program and families will have to provide transportation to and from the program site.

All APS traditional school students are welcome to sign up and attend ARA.

We will continue to strongly encourage identified students to register beginning **February 21, 2022. Registration will close on April 10, 2022.**

Registration will occur at the school level via 2022 Summer ARA Registration Google Form.

Nutrition/Meals:

Breakfast and lunch will be provided to all students, at no cost to the families.

Transportation:

APS Transportation will be provided for all full day ARA and high school students. Students who do not attend the academic recovery portion of the day will have the option to attend the afternoon *PowerUp* program and families will have to provide transportation to and from the program site.

Level Up Math	Ashley Garner	June 1 – 30	Level Up Math is a summer enrichment program that is available to all APS rising 7th and 8th grade students, who qualify. This program is offered by the APS Secondary Mathematics Department and provides access to higher-level mathematics course work during the summer so that students can engage with pre-requisite content standards. This program provides students with content-focused engagement around transitional standards in preparation for participation in either Accelerated Math 7B/8 or Algebra I.
