<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Continue Phase II plans pending administration’s evaluation of the Summer School experience and the current internal and local health conditions.</li> <li><b>Mitigations</b> in place and others currently under consideration.</li> </ul>	<p>Beginning of the 2021-22 School Year.</p> <p>2021-22 School Year</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Data from the summer school pilot as well as current local health conditions will be considered by the administration to contextualize the decision to continue Phase II into the start of the 2021-22 school year.</li> <li>The District will monitor active confirmed cases, quarantines, student/teacher absence rates and substitute teacher fill rates to make decisions regarding the addition or removal of mitigation measures including masks, cohorting, and moving to temporary virtual learning.</li> <li>Consistent with the 2020-21 school year, administration will move students, classes, grade levels or schools to a temporary virtual format for a short time period as an additional mitigation measure if necessary.</li> <li>Facemasks may be required temporarily as an additional mitigation measure at the lowest level possible e.g. classroom, grade level, school.</li> </ul>
