Additionally, student data revealed up to 5.9 months of reading gain from participation in the intensive 5-week program (with moderate to strong effect sizes). The program will again be monitored across several metrics and will include both descriptive and inferential statistics. Student demographics will be summarized (accessibility) and results of the program (using a pre/post study design - using matched pair student t-test) will be presented.
