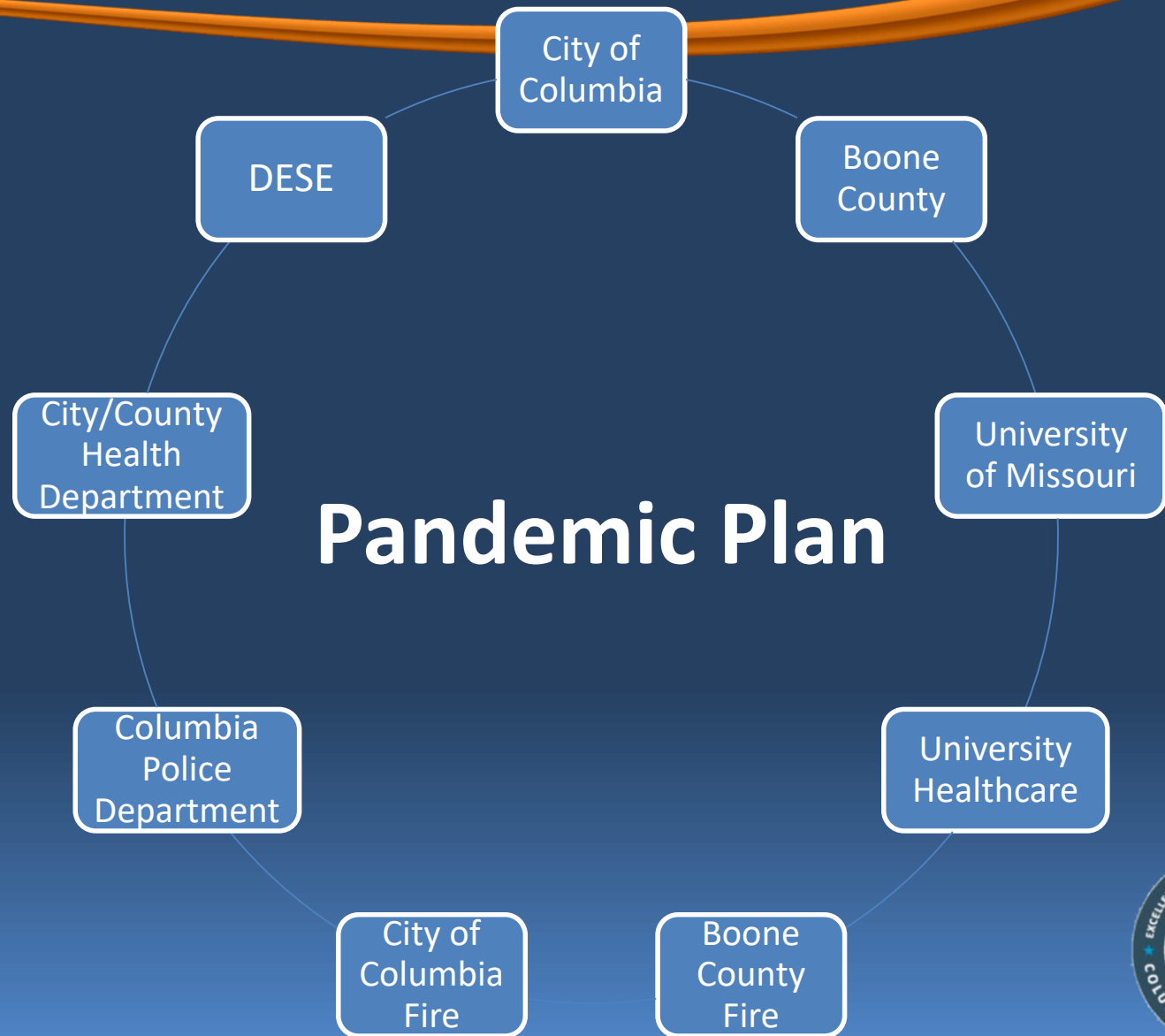

Communication Protocol



What should you do?

- Wash hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- Stay home if you are sick
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when sneezing or coughing and dispose of the tissue in a proper trash receptacle
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose or eyes as germs spread this way
- Maintain a healthy diet
- Avoid sharing drinks, water bottles or silverware with others
- Get plenty of rest

What should you do?

Did you wash your hands?

Stop the spread of germs and be healthy.



WET

Wet hands under warm water.



WASH

Wash hands with soap for 20 seconds.



RINSE

Rinse under warm water.



DRY

Dry hands. Turn off water with paper towel.

What is our Custodian Plan?

- Our Multi-Micro disinfectant is effective against emerging pathogens. Oxivir TB provided to nursing staff is effective against Norovirus.
- Our cleaning program will be followed. This process concentrates on cleaning and disinfecting our most touched surfaces to include doorknobs, push plates, light switch, drinking fountains, handrails, student desks and tabletops, and restrooms.
- Head Custodians have been sent a video explaining the Coronavirus. Area Supervisors are personally stopping by buildings to support staff and check on cleanliness.

Other Considerations

- The Missouri Dept. of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) provides districts with guidance and as defined by state statute when exceptional circumstances cause school closures.
- There would be opportunities for online learning, however not all of our students can, should, and are able to receive education delivery in an online environment.
