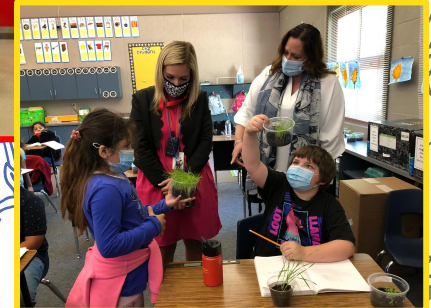
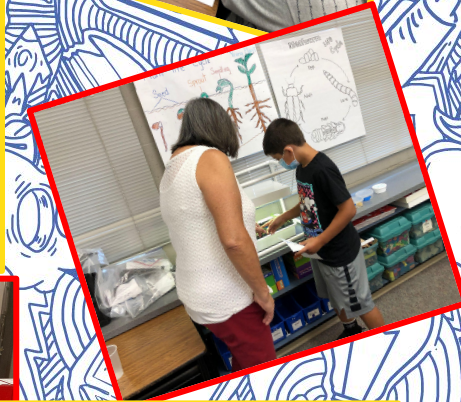
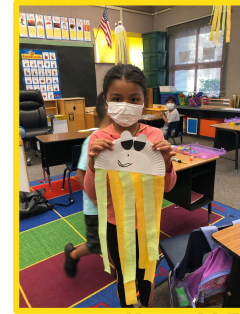
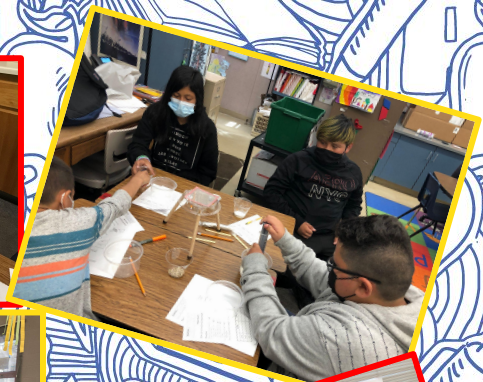
Expanded programming to include partnerships with local environmental education agencies

KA - 6 Academy

Location: Biella Elementary School

Dates: June 7 - July 1

- Open to Kindergarten Academy - 6th Graders during the 2020-21 school year
- Representation of all SRCS Elementary Public Schools
- Focus on literacy and math skills taught through hands-on, inquiry-based cross-disciplinary units
- Additional focus on social emotional learning, restorative circles, and student engagement
- K - 5th Grade: FOSS for One Science Kits
- Approximate number of students served: 191



Extended School Year (ESY) June 14-July 9

Elementary at Luther Burbank
Secondary at Slater Middle and Ridgway High

28 classes with 93 staff members serving 270 students
with Individual Education Plans (IEPs)

- For students in Preschool- Transition (age 22)
- Teachers and Staff inspired and supported students in their educational goals
- Implemented new ways to connect with students and families through ingenuity, resiliency, and innovation!



EXCEL for Youth

Location: Santa Rosa Middle School

Dates: July 12 - 30 (1 week classes)

- Program administered in partnership with Sonoma State University
- Open to students in grades 3 - 7 during the 2020-21 school year
- Focus on enrichment through engaging, hands-on courses such as, *Programming in Python*, *Make a mini Computer*, and *Edible Science*
- Approximate number of students served: 220



High School Credit Recovery

Location: Elsie Allen High School

Session #1 Dates: June 7 - July 1 / Session #2 Dates: July 6 - 29

- Open to 9th - 11th graders and non-graduating Seniors who have failed high school courses required for graduation
 - ◆ Focus on courses students have already taken, and failed
 - ◆ Courses were completed online, with the support of a teacher
 - ◆ In person non-instructional cohorts and supports were offered
- Program Data:
 - ◆ 2685 credits recovered & 537 courses completed
 - ◆ Served non-graduating seniors, juniors, sophomores, and freshmen
 - ◆ An additional group of students completed 421 credits in the 2-week Crossover Program between August 2-12. 20 were non-graduating seniors.
- 54 students, grades 9-11 recovered second semester Math 1P credits in Acellus in order to progress to Math 2P this school year
- Individual Graduation Plan completion was available during summer credit recovery



Acellus Learning Acceleration

Location: Elsie Allen High School

Session #1 Dates: June 7 - July 1

Session #2 Dates: July 6 - 29

- Open to rising 7th - 9th grade students
- Online program to reinforce and strengthen math skills and abilities
- Provides math enrichment
- Number of students served: 64
 - ◆ Rising 8th graders = 27
 - ◆ Rising 9th graders = 37
- Rising 9th grade students receive elective credits upon successful completion = 24





Location: Preston Farm and Bohemia Ecological Preserve

Dates: June 7 - August 6 (4 one week camps)

- Served 137 students ages 6-13 from Title I school sites
- Focus on environmental education, social, emotional and physical well-being in some of Sonoma County's most beautiful locations

Mariachi / Arts Camp

Location: Hilliard Comstock Middle School

Dates: July 20 - 24 (Virtual Arts Sampler Camp)

July 13 - 23 (Virtual Mariachi Ensemble)

July 26 - August 6 (Beginning Mariachi/Art Camp)

- Program administered in partnership with Luther Burbank Center for the Arts
- Open to elementary and secondary students
- Focus on Mariachi, ukulele, drumming and visual arts - virtual and in person offerings
- Approximate number of students served: 63



Migrant Education

Location: Albert Biella Elementary School

Dates: June 7 - 25

- Open to students qualifying as “Migrant Ed” and currently in Kinder Academy - 6th grade
- Focus on enrichment through a social emotional learning based physical activity program from Sports for Learning
- ELA focus with our TOSA
- Approximate number of students served: 62



Mike Hauser Academy

Locations: Hilliard Comstock Middle School; Santa Rosa Middle School; and Elsie Allen High School

Dates: June 7 - 24

- Offered to rising 9th graders in partnership with a variety of Sonoma County companies
- Focus on strengthening math and science skills through STEM activities in real-life work environments
- Number of students served & receiving elective credits: 37

Project Make

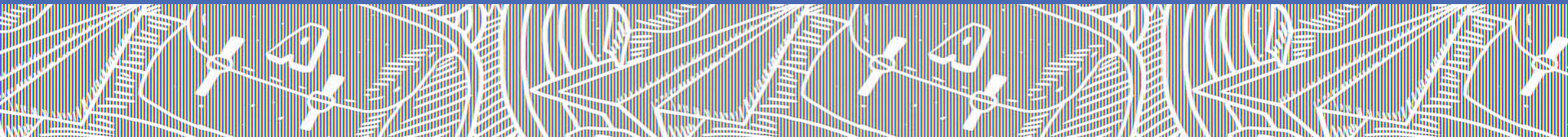
Location: Hilliard Comstock Middle School

Dates: June 7 - 25

- Open to students in grades 4 - 7 during the 2020-21 school year
- Focus on students becoming “makers” of practical, imaginative, and creative hands-on projects.

Offered this year: A Touch of Japan, Culinary Creations, Rockets, Knitting, Comics, Cartoons & Photography, Coding

- Number of students served: 84



Site Jump Start Programs

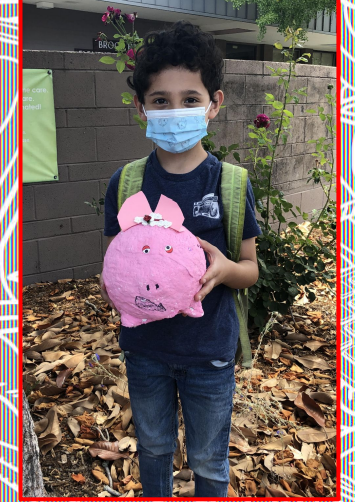
Locations: Individual School Sites

Dates: July 19 - 30

- Programs offered at 10 school sites, including elementary, middle and high
- Focus on English/Language Arts, mathematics, social-emotional support, and getting reacquainted with learning routines/habits
- Number of students served: 611

SRCS Summer Camp Programs

Locations: Cesar Chavez Language Academy, Charter School for the Arts,
Hidden Valley, and Proctor Terrace

Dates: June 7 - July 31

Times: 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

- Served SRCS Elementary Students & SRCS Employee Students.
- Offered by SRCS District Child Care Program on a fee for service and scholarship basis; students were enrolled full time and part time when attending in other SRCS program options.
- Focused on meeting the students' cognitive needs, social, emotional, physical, academic and creative growth of students through indoor/outdoor activities and additional learning support including using Let's Go Learn.
- These programs served 102 students throughout the summer.



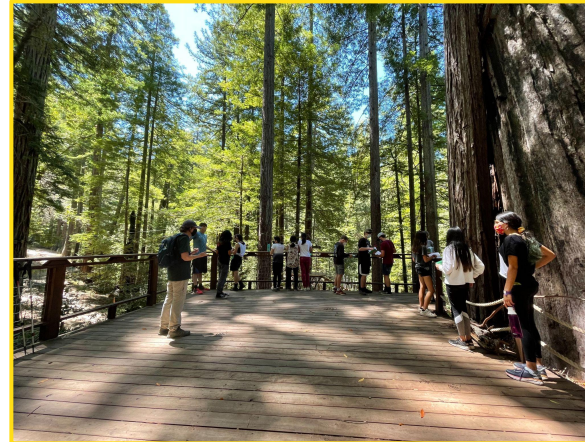
Alliance Redwoods

Locations: Alliance Redwoods Conference Center

Dates: July 7, 8, 13 & 14

Times: 9:30a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

- Open to all incoming 9th-12th grade students
- Students participated in either a Herpetology or Forest Ecology Class each day as well as multiple challenge course activities (zip line, pole jump, tree swing and rock wall)
- Focus on nature, science and personal challenge
- The program served approximately 100 students across the 4 days.

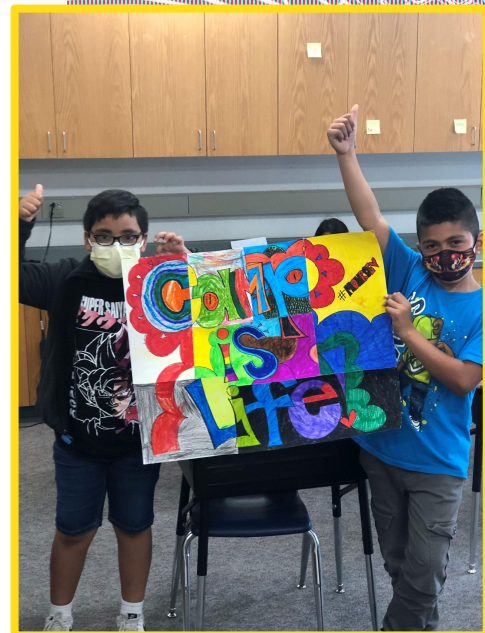
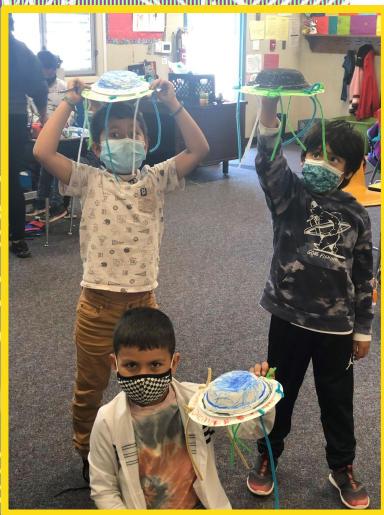



Boys and Girls Club

Locations: Brook Hill and James Monroe Elementary Schools

Dates: June 14 - July 23

- Open to students Grade 1-8
- Focused on day-long summer camp activities, additional learning support including using Let's Go Learn, and Social Emotional Learning
- The program served approximately 160 students throughout the summer

66%

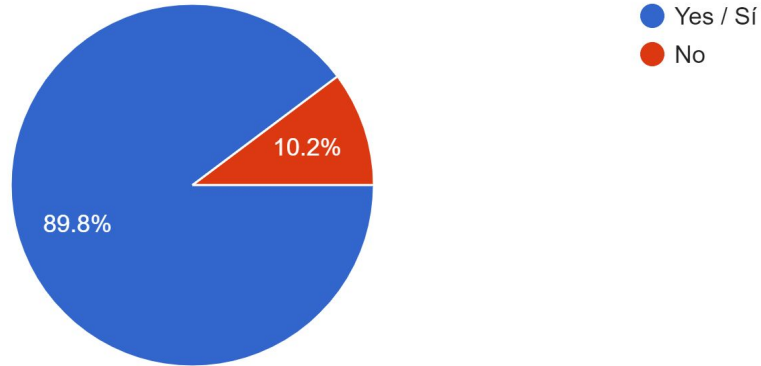
Strongly agree or agree that the program supported the student's academic needs.
