Since 2014, Special Olympics have been held in partnership with Santa Rosa City Schools to hold Special Olympics for our Elementary and Secondary schools. The Special Olympics program since 2014 has become a Sonoma County landmark of the school calendar. It has been expanded to three programs per year and SRCS while the organizer, now shares the hosting duties with other school districts. The MOU allows for a small Stipend for the organizers for their time outside of the school day.		The activities for this MOU are usually 2 events outdoors and one indoor. Due to the current COVID restrictions, the re-evaluation of the indoor setting will be reviewed to match the rates in the school community, the space in the venue and the ability to provide a safe environment before consideration. There is not direct costs to the District or the families. However, staff time and some bussing costs have always been provided to insure all students can participate.			Student and family evaluation of the program is considered the appropriate metric for this program. Increasing the number of schools and classrooms that participate is an important measurement.
