# Georgia Compulsory Attendance Law

- Georgia Compulsory Attendance Law mandates attendance in public, private or home schools programs for children between the ages of six and sixteen.
- New Attendance Requirements (SB 123): SY 2025-2026
  - The District may not expel students solely based on absences
  - Establish a District Attendance Review Team if the District has a chronic absenteeism rate of 10% or higher and one or more school has a school chronic absenteeism rate of 15% or higher 1 (look at prior school year for the 10% absenteeism rate).
  - A student taking tests and physical exams for military service shall be credited as present.
- FCPS District's Attendance Rate for SY 2024-2025 was 95.27%
- The schools' attendance range for SY 2024-2025 was 94.02% (FCHS) to 96.28% (PTCES)

# FCBOE Student Discipline

- FCBOE aims to ensure an orderly educational environment, safeguarding the welfare and safety of all students within the district.
- FCBOE primary goal is to educate, however when student behavior comes in conflict with the rights of others, corrective actions may be necessary.
- Disciplinary consequences are age appropriate and will be in proportion to the severity of the behavior event and will consider the discipline history of the student.
- The FCBOE Code of Conduct provides a systematic approach to behavior correction and is designed to assist students with self discipline.
- 3rd Year of the Cross Functional Action to review Student Code of Conduct (Implemented SY 2024)
- 2nd Year of the Conflict Resolution Course (Implemented SY 2025)
