

Board Policy IBB: Charter Schools

A representative from an existing school within the school district, a private individual, a private organization, or a state or local public entity may submit to the Carroll County Board of Education (LBOE) a written proposal (petition) to establish a charter school in accordance with the requirements set forth in the State Board of Education (SBOE) Rule 160-4-9-.05 and its accompanying Guidelines. Home study programs or schools, sectarian schools, religious schools, private for profit schools, existing private schools, or private educational institutions not established, operated or governed by the State of Georgia are prohibited by law from submitting charter petitions.

A charter petitioner shall contact the Superintendent or designee for a complete copy of information regarding the submission of charter petitions for approval in ~~accordance with the timelines established in the chart below:~~ **the timelines established by the Office of Charter School Compliance, which are available on their website ([link here](#)).**

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 20-2-2064(b), the LBOE shall by a majority vote approve or deny a petition no later than ~~ninety (90)~~ **twenty (20)** days after its submission unless the petitioner consents to extend that period.

If the LBOE denies a charter petition, it shall within ~~60~~ **twenty (20)** days provide to the charter petitioner and the **State Board of Education (SBOE)** and **Office of Charter School Compliance (OCSC)** a written explanation setting forth its reasons for denial and a list of deficiencies in the petition. If the reason for denial includes that approval is not in the public interest, such explanation shall include a detailed explanation as to why. A denial does not prevent a petitioner from resubmitting a revised petition that addresses the deficiencies cited in the denial.

If the LBOE approves a charter petition, it shall within thirty (30) days provide a copy of the petition it approved to the ~~SBOE~~ **OCSC** for review ~~by the SBOE.~~

The Superintendent is authorized to develop and enforce administrative regulations needed to ensure compliance with state law and SBOE/SDOE requirements. Such regulations shall provide for an expedited review process for high quality charter school renewal, expansion, and replication.
