

ViewPoint Health (VPH) Overview	
How Students are Served at VPH:	The District’s Special Education Teacher (SET) provides individualized and small-group academic support tailored to each student's current educational needs, during their short-term residential stay while at ViewPoint Health Child and Adolescent Crisis Stabilization Unit.
How Students are Supported at VPH:	The SET collaborates with parents, guardians, and student’s home schools to obtain assignments and develop personalized educational plans. The instructional approach is delivered through tutorial, reinforcing challenging concepts, strengthening foundational skills, and facilitating exploration of other areas of academic interest.
Transition Support:	For students not currently enrolled in school, the SET coordinates with guardians to identify appropriate educational placements. Including facilitating enrollment or reenrollment in traditional school settings or connecting families with local GED programs and alternative education resources. The SET’s work ensures continuity in learning and supports positive academic transitions during and after residential care.
