



PROCLAMATION

Exceptional Children's Week

- WHEREAS: Exceptional children may be identified as students with autism spectrum disorder, emotional and behavioral disabilities, intellectual disabilities, orthopedic impairments, other health impairments, significant development delays, specific learning disabilities, speech/language impairments, traumatic brain injury, visual impairments, and those who are deaf/blind, deaf/hard of hearing who, by reason thereof, require special education and related services, and
- WHEREAS: Being consistent with the pursuit of achievement, it is essential that all children receive equal opportunities to education, and Exceptional children possess the same need to receive a high-quality education, and
