PROCESS

As a result of the 2024-25 school consolidation study, it was recommended that Bibb County Schools look at a rezoning study and also an operational efficiency study as an alternative to closing or consolidating schools.

HPM was contracted to perform a demographic study and to work with BCSD staff to develop preliminary attendance zone options. This presentation provides an overview of the attendance zone options for the community to review and provide feedback through an online survey.

HISTORICAL LIVE-IN ENROLLMENT

REVIEW

- PK-12 enrollment in Bibb County Schools has declined from 21,410 in 2020-21 to 20,766 in 2025-26, a decrease of 644 students, or 3%.
- Prior to the 2025-26 school year, enrollment had been stable, increasing by 231 students from 2021-22 to 2024-25.

PROJECTED LIVE-IN ENROLLMENT

REVIEW

- The methodology for this enrollment projection study is based on student residence (live-in)
- Enrollment is projected to decline from 20,766 in the current 2025-26 school year to 19,846 over the next 10 years. This is a decline of 920 students, or 4.4%.
- Elementary enrollment is projected to remain stable, declining by 124 students at its low point.

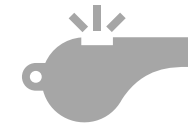

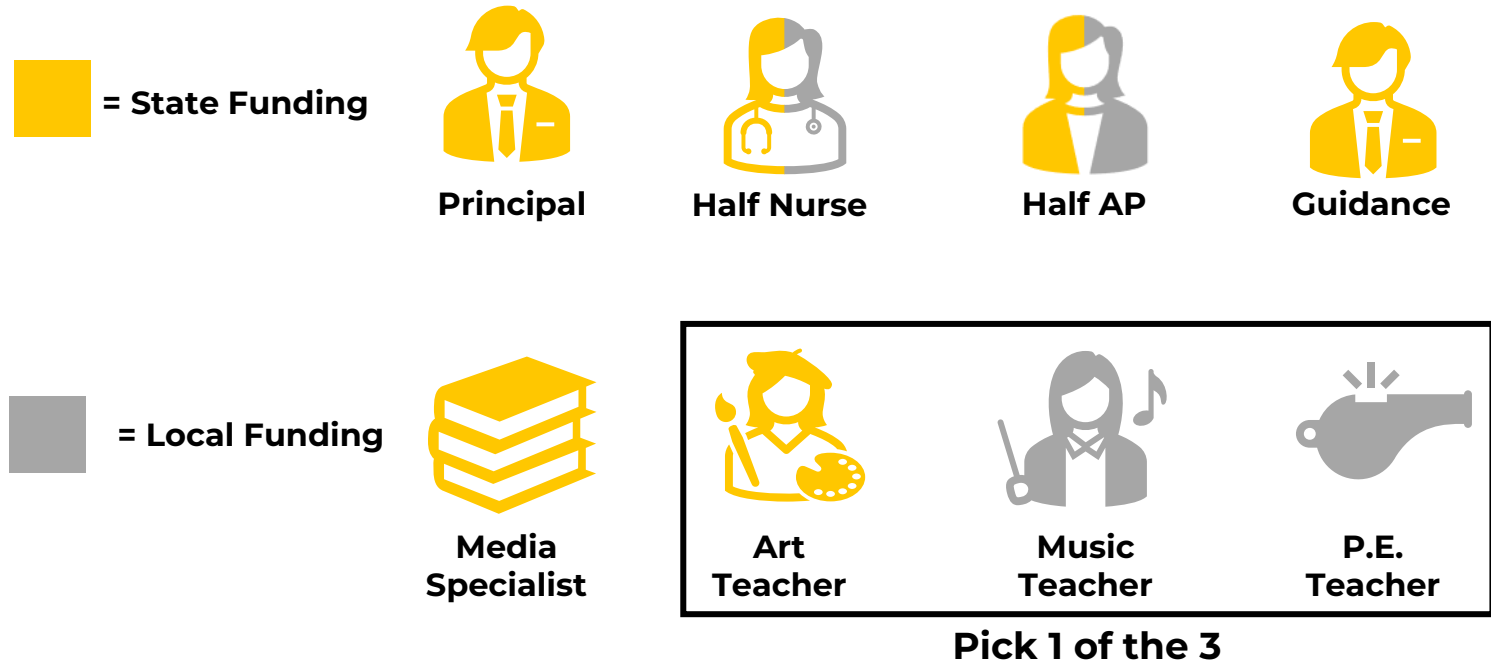

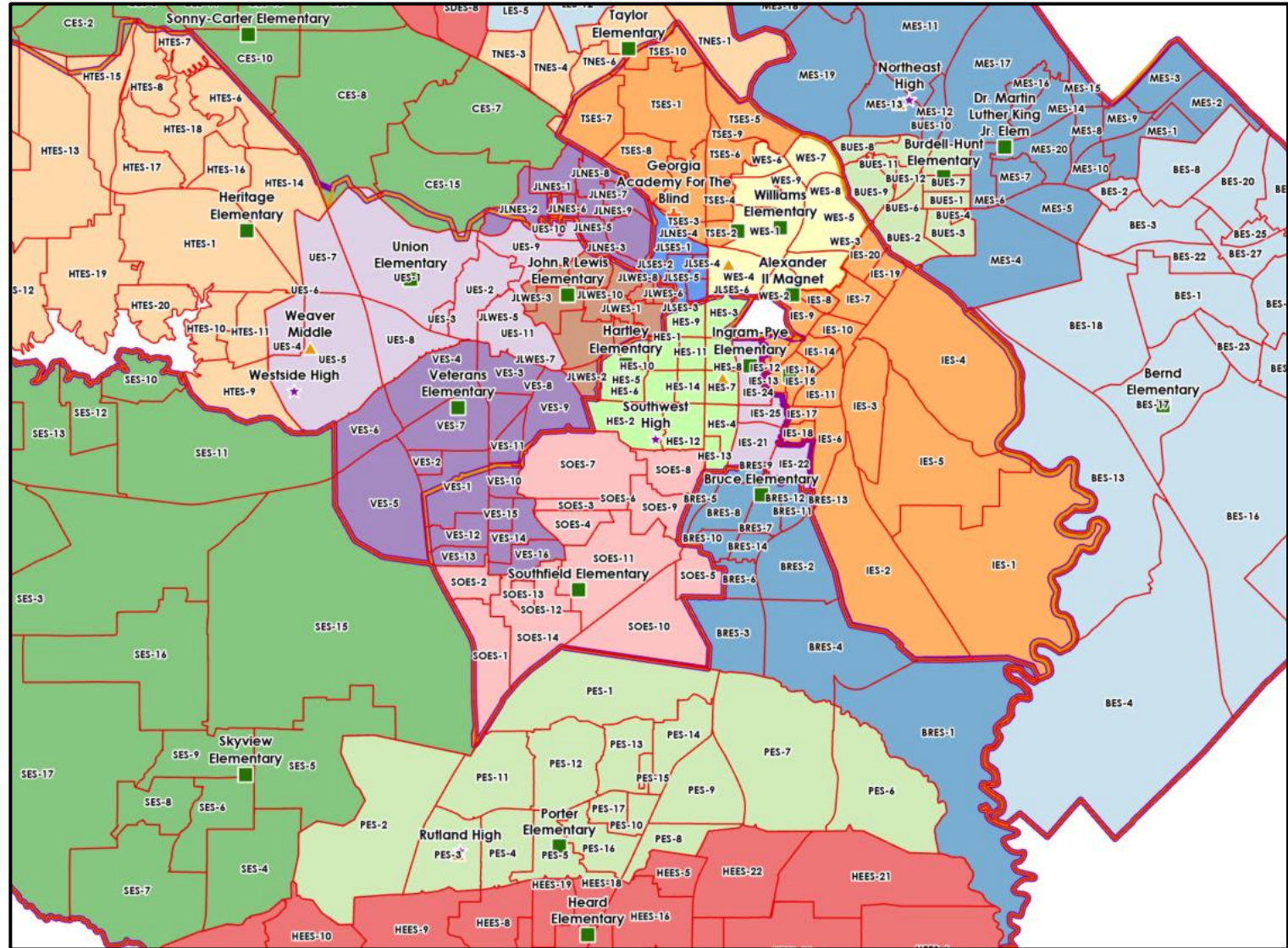

Planning Units

- Lists planning unit #, number of students residing & attending within that area, number of students transferring into that school, and school zone to which that area is currently assigned
- Reassigning a planning unit will update enrollment & utilization in real time

ASSUMPTIONS

- We are using current school year actual student data to calculate impacts of boundary changes.
- We will consider projection data as we make recommendations
- K-12 students that have chosen to attend a school other than their zoned school or were assigned to another school for special education or other services are locked and will not be moved in an attendance zone change scenario.
- PreK students are not locked, and we can model moving PreK programs to other schools (separate boundaries for PK).
- Attendance zone changes will be less impactful on schools that have high percentages of students transferring in from outside of the zone (Miller Magnet Middle, Central HS, Burdell Hunt Magnet)



OBSERVATIONS

- Average enrollment of the elementary schools is 477, if we do not consolidate and want to balance enrollment to get schools closer to 477 which is above the 450 threshold for optimal state funding, we are going to need to take away from schools that are well enrolled (above 600 students).
- There is lots of room in Southfield, Heard, and MLK, but if we put more kids in them, it means we will have more schools under 450.
- If we don't want to consolidate... we can't focus on utilization. We have to look at balancing enrollment numbers.



CURRENT ELEMENTARY ZONES

- Currently 77.6% overall utilization at the 19 zoned elementary schools
- More than 2,600 empty seats
- 9 of 19 zoned elementary schools have a K-5 enrollment below 450 (minimum program state funding)

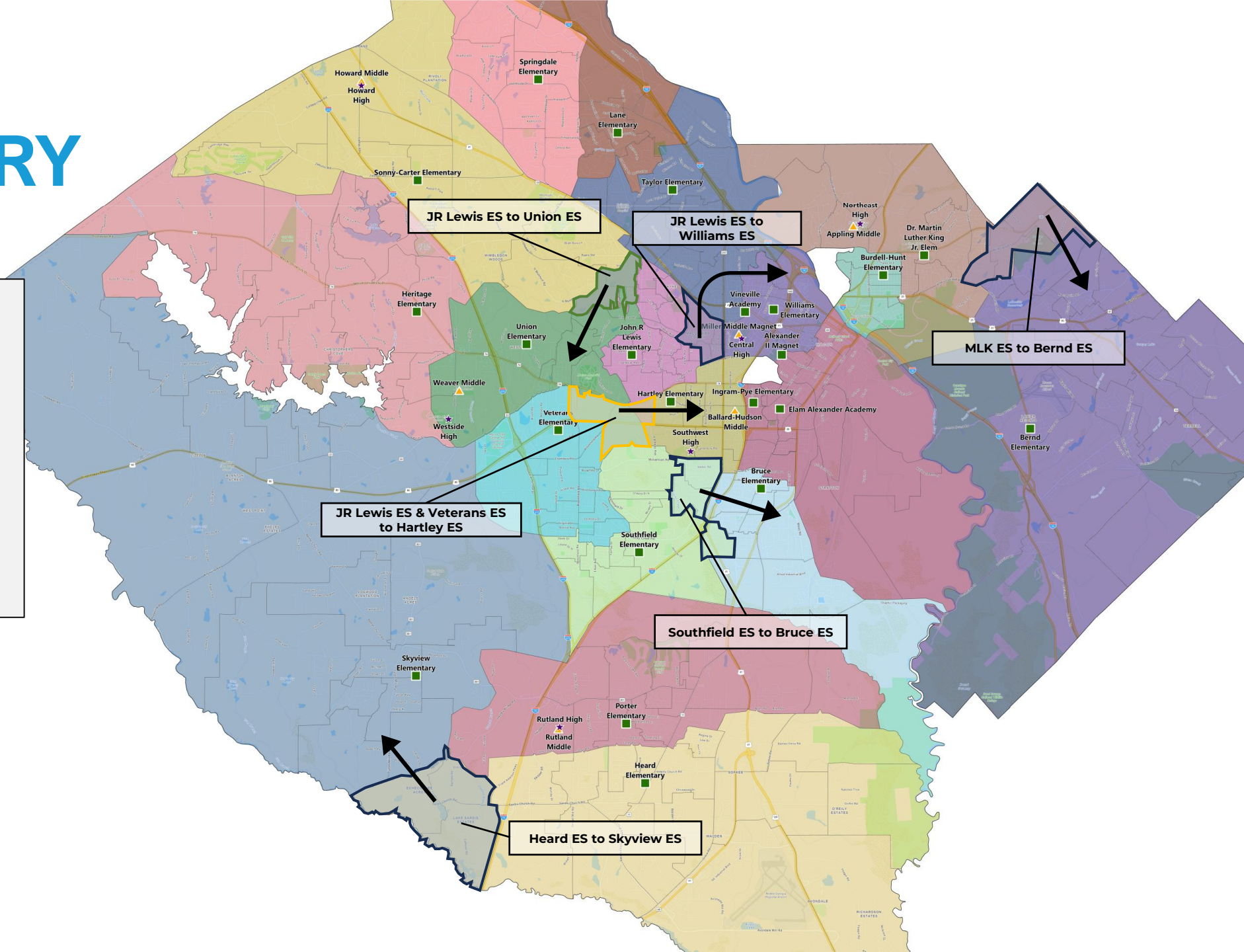
OPTIONS OVERVIEW

OPTION 1 - ELEMENTARY

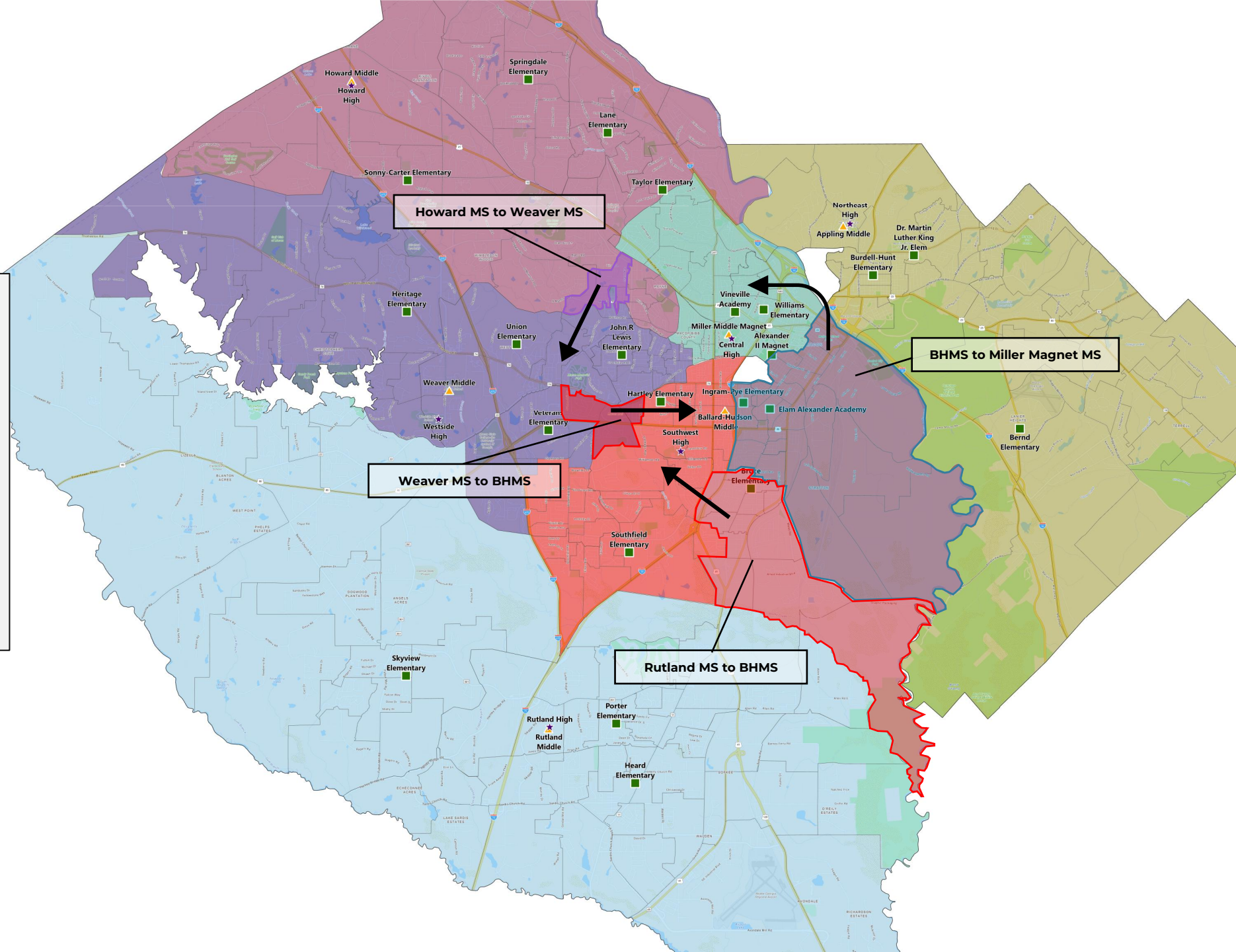
- Option 1 looks at district-wide boundary changes to balance utilization and improve feeder patterns.
- 11 of 19 elementary boundaries and 5 of 6 middle and high school boundaries are impacted.

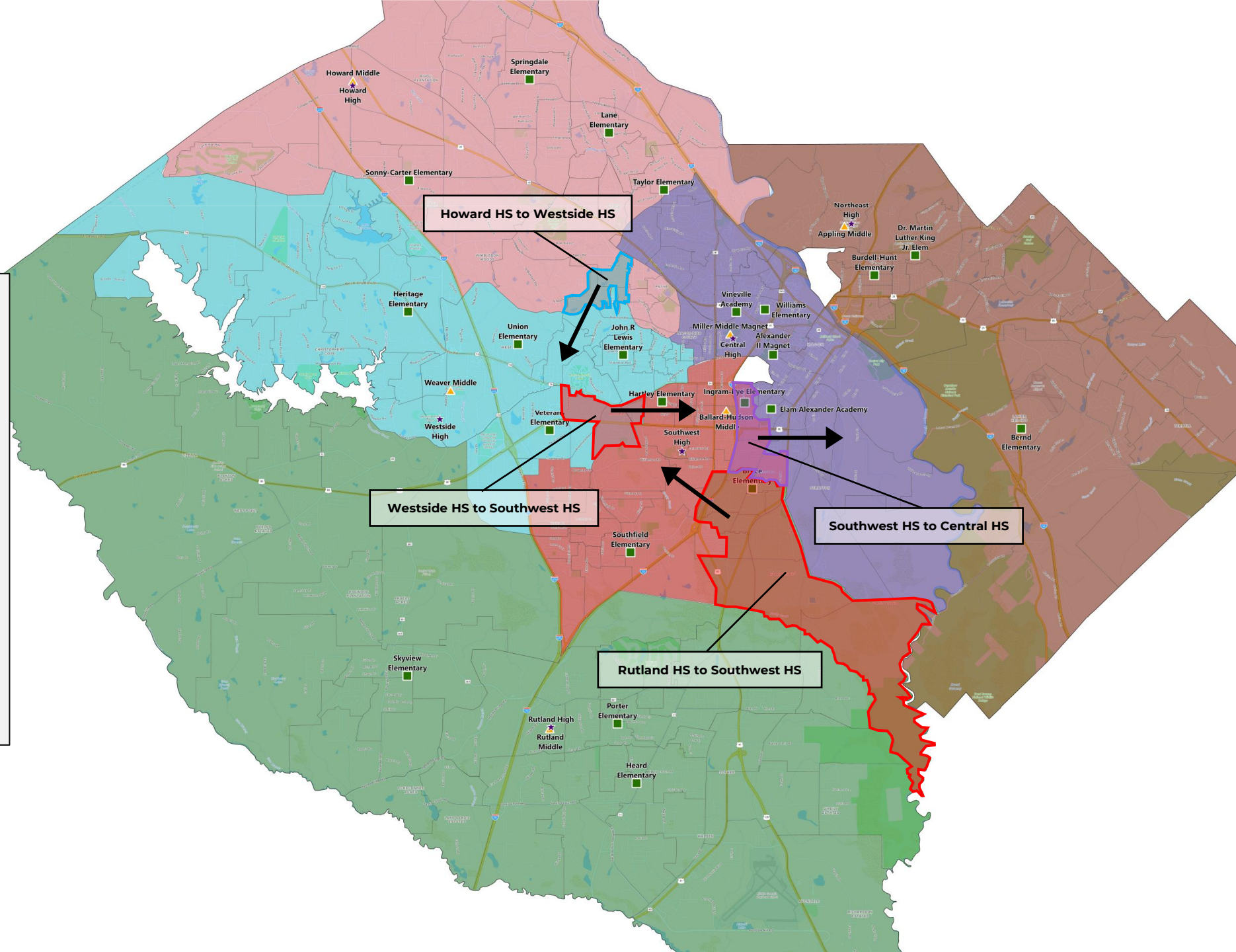
- Ingram ES zone moves from Ballard Hudson MS and Central/SWHS to a 100% feed to Miller MS & Central HS
- Bruce ES zone moves from Rutland Middle/High to Ballard Hudson MS / Southwest HS

OPTION 1 – HIGH

- Ingram ES becomes 100% feed to Miller MS & Central HS (Currently splits between Central HS & Southwest HS)
- Bruce ES zone moves from Rutland Middle/High to Ballard Hudson MS / Southwest HS
- All MS now feed 100% to one high school

OPTION 1 – SUMMARY

Benefits

- Reduces number of zoned elementary schools below 450 (K-5) from 9 to 7
- Howard MS no longer over 100% utilized
- Improvement to feeder patterns
 - No small splits
 - All middle schools feed 100% to 1 high school

Challenges

- District-wide utilization at zoned elementary schools remains at 77.6%, may not be a long-term solution
- Students impacted:
 - 534 ES, 441 MS, 387 HS
- Reduces enrollment at schools that are “well-enrolled”

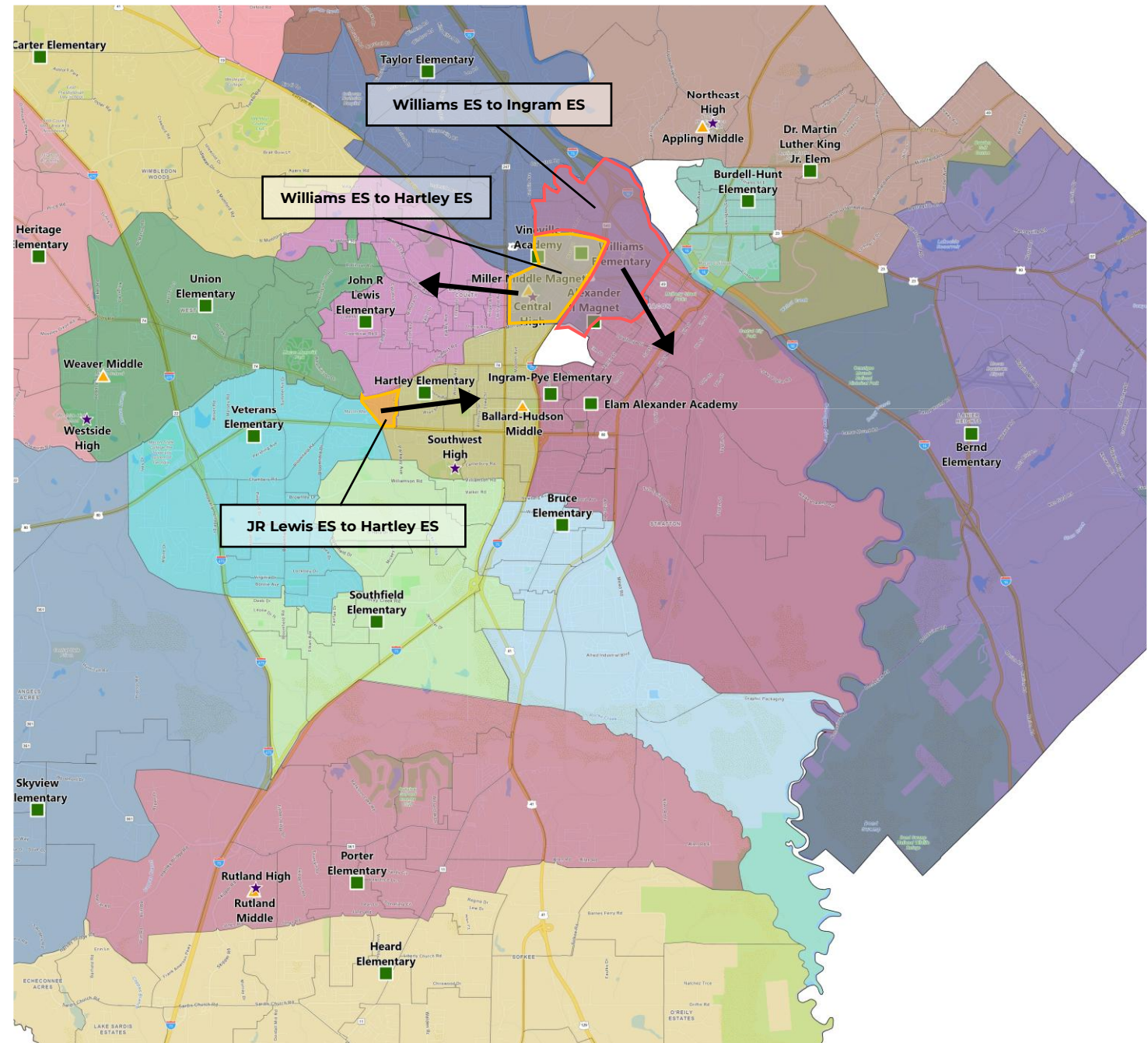
EARLY LEARNING CENTERS

- Option 2A & 2B propose to convert Williams ES to an Early Learning Center
- This allows us to concentrate PreK capital improvement grant funding.
 - Improvements would need to be made to this campus to accommodate this shift.
- Williams ES students redistributed to increase enrollment at neighboring schools



OPTION 2A - ELEMENTARY

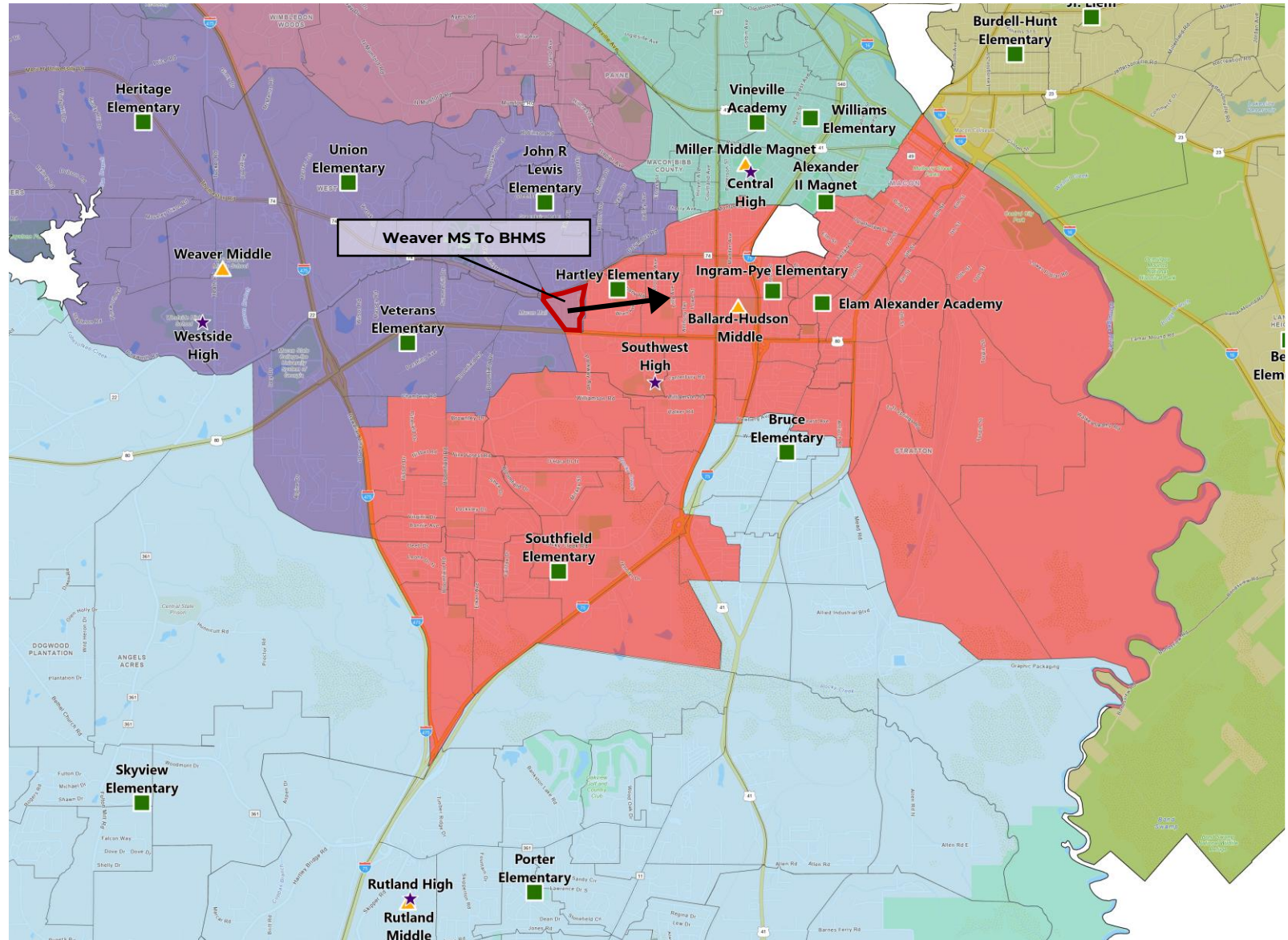
- Option 2A converts Williams ES to an Early Learning Center

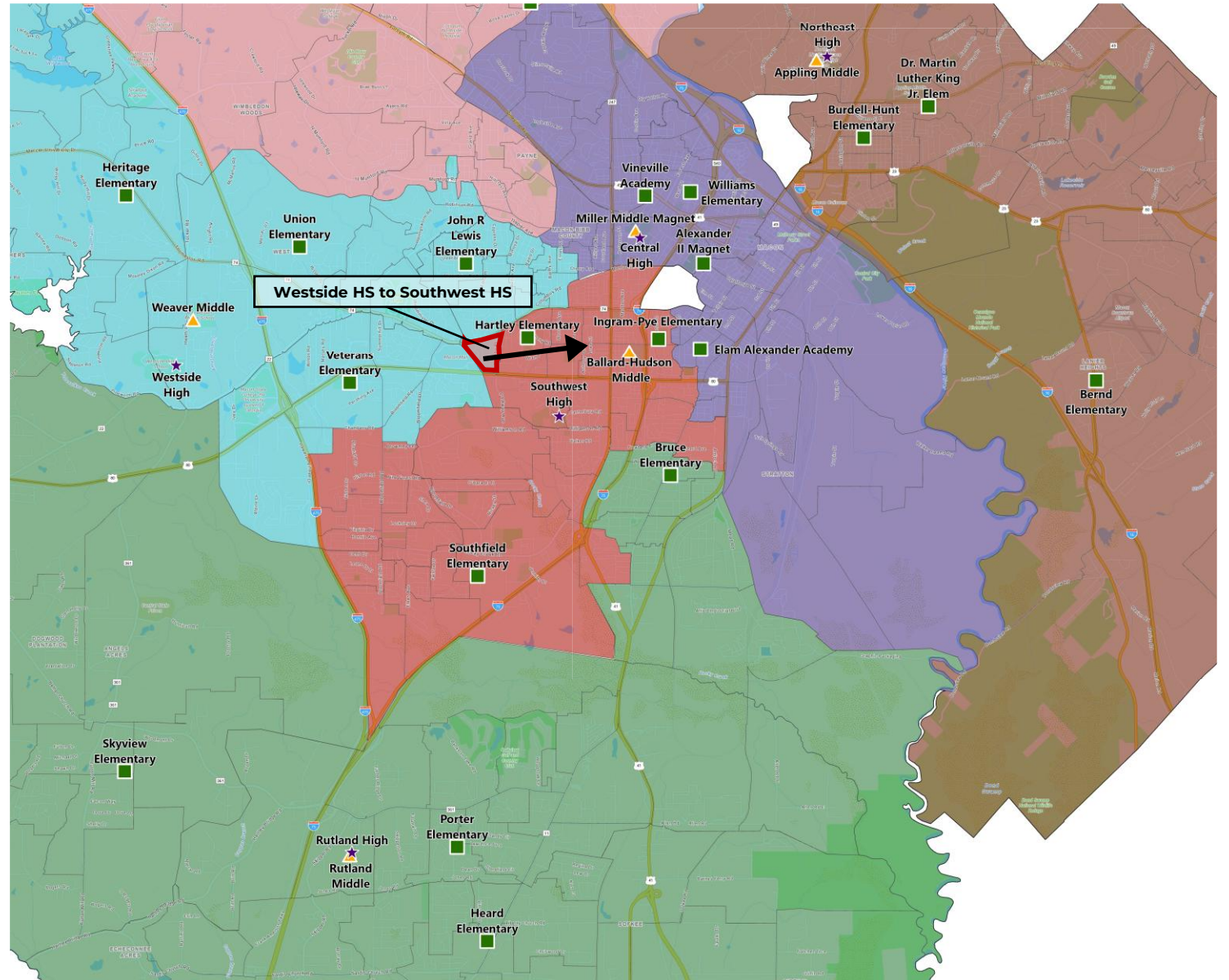

OPTION 2A – SUMMARY

Benefits

- Reduces number of zoned elementary schools below 450 (K-5) from 9 to 6
- Enhances efficiency of PreK operations
- District-wide utilization at zoned elementary schools increases to 80.8%
- Students impacted:
 - 254 ES, 5 MS, 8 HS
 - Small change at MS/HS to avoid a low percentage feeder split

Challenges

- Removes a neighborhood school
- May not be a long-term solution
- Hartley ES & Ingram ES now split to 2 middle schools

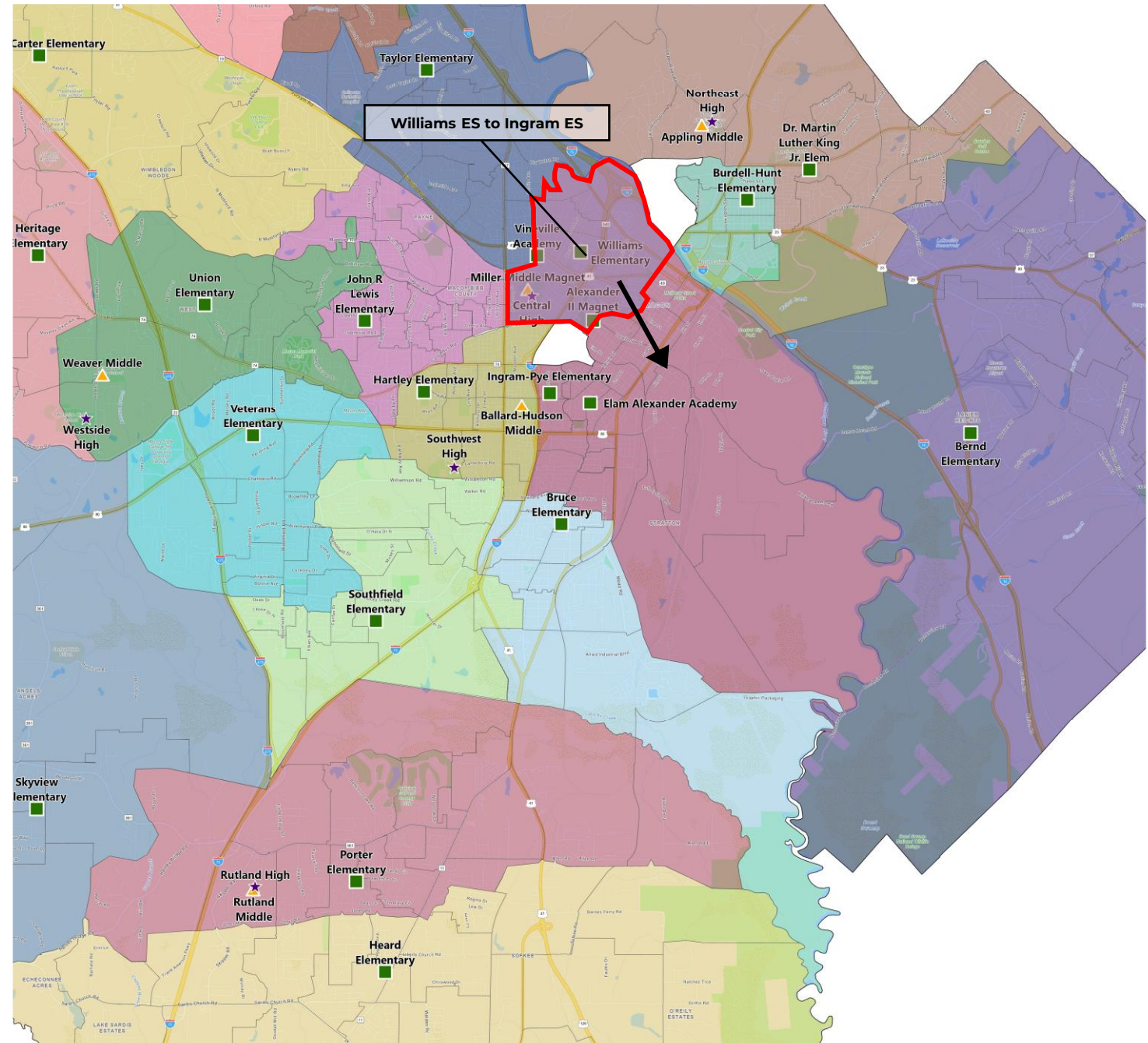

Benefits

- Reduces number of zoned elementary schools below 450 (K-5) from 9 to 7
- Enhances efficiency of PreK operations
- District-wide utilization at zoned elementary schools increases to 80.8%
- Students impacted:
 - 242 ES, 0 MS, 0 HS
 - No changes at middle or high school

Challenges

- Removes a neighborhood school
- May not be a long-term solution
- Ingram ES now splits to 2 middle schools

FAQ's

What happens to the teachers and staff at buildings that are changing enrollment?

- Staffing will be reconfigured using the same allotment process that this district always uses.
 - Schools that are gaining enrollment can expect to gain positions.
 - Schools that are losing enrollment can expect to lose positions.
 - Essentially, the teachers follow the students.

What impact will this have on class sizes, will they go up or down as enrollment changes?

- Class sizes are independent of the school size, if a school gains enrollment, it will also gain a proportional number of teachers.

Why don't we establish attendance zones for our choice schools (Alexander II and Vineville)?

- These are choice programs that parents select for their children.

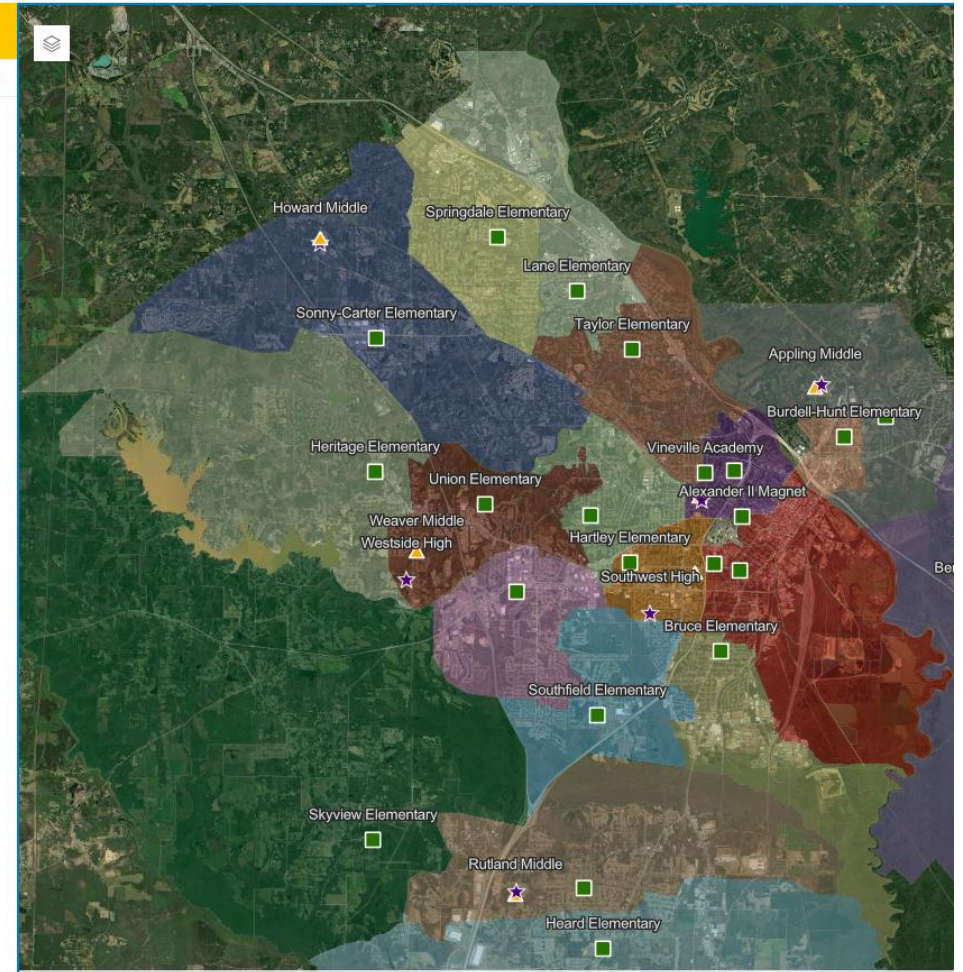
