The goal of the FCUSD Student Care program is to provide a quality before and after school program to parents that is accessible, convenient, safe, and affordable.



October Student Care Wait List

- Carl Sundahl Elementary – *30 students* on wait list
- Folsom Hills Elementary – *22 students* on wait list
- Mangini Ranch Elementary – *39 students* on wait list
- Oak Chan Elementary – *62 students* on wait list
- Riverview STEM Academy – *35 students* on wait list
- Russell Ranch Elementary – *118 students* on wait list

- Wait lists due to lack of facilities and staffing

Actions to Reduce Wait List

- ◉ Team consisting of Sean Martin, Matt Washburn, Geri Wickham, JoAnne Blaisdell, Denise Earl, and Marie Pawlek met with site principals for a needs assessment at each site with a wait list.
 - ◉ Identified facilities for Student Care use – multi at most sites
- ◉ Reposted current available jobs on EdJoin
 - ◉ Outreach to Adult Ed, Los Rios Community Colleges, FCUSD CTE ECE, and Sacramento State regarding job postings

January Student Care Wait List Update

ELO 1st & 2nd Grade during Early/Late :

- Participating Schools: Blanche Sprentz, Cordova Gardens, Cordova Meadows, Gold Ridge, Mangini Ranch - Natoma Station, Oak Chan, Rancho Cordova, Riverview STEM Academy, Russell Ranch, Sandra J. Gallardo, and Williamson Elementary
 - Natoma Station Elementary - *13 students on the wait list*
 - Sandra J. Gallardo Elementary - *15 students on wait list*
- Sandra J Gallardo and Natoma Station have jobs posted on EdJoin for additional staffing

ASES:

- Participating Schools:
 - Cordova Gardens Elementary - *9 students on waitlist*
 - Cordova Meadows Elementary - *17 students on waitlist*
 - Cordova Villa Elementary - *18 students on waitlist*
 - Mills Middle - *21 students on waitlist*
 - Mitchell Middle - *4 students on waitlist*
 - Peter J. Shields Elementary - *5 students on waitlist*
 - Rancho Cordova Elementary - *17 students on waitlist*
 - White Rock Elementary - *18 students on waitlist*
 - Williamson Elementary - *17 students on waitlist*
- Twelve jobs available on EdJoin - have hired two positions since last update in October

Expanded Learning Opportunities Update

Summer School:

- 20-day summer school is currently being planned in coordination with the Curriculum and Instruction Team
- Postings for the summer school position will be on EdJoin soon
 - Starting with administrative staff and then teachers will follow
- Schools are currently identifying students needing additional support

Saturday School:

- Four hour day focused on increasing learning opportunities for underserved populations - i.e. immigrant and EL students
- 11/18 sessions completed so far.
- We have received positive feedback from staff, students, and families.

Expanded Learning Opportunities Update

ELO Program

- Provides funding for afterschool and summer school enrichment programs for transitional kindergarten (TK) through sixth grade as established by Assembly Bill 130.
- Designed to increase access to educational and enrichment services beyond current ASES offerings.
- Will allow schools to increase our service offerings in academics, wellness and enrichment and provide unduplicated (English Learners, meet income or categorical eligibility requirements for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch Program, and foster youth) K-6 students and families the flexibility to participate in a nine hour school day based on their needs and interests.
- ASES and the ELO Program will be considered a single, comprehensive program.
- FCUSD received \$2.5M for the 2021-2022 ELO-P Entitlement.
- The Governor's proposal for 2022-2023 includes an additional \$3.4B for ELO-P.
