1. Services.

(a) DISTRICT's Responsibilities and Duties:

District will provide appropriate program facilities, including access to the multi-purpose room, library, computer lab, fields and grounds, and at least three classrooms (at least one indoor space per 20 students).

District will identify one district-level employee to act as site liaison between the District and Boys & Girls Clubs of Sonoma-Marin (The Clubs). District employees will formally meet with the Club representative prior to the start of and during the Summer Program as needed.

In order to provide seamless integration, administrators will be orientated on their roles and responsibilities through collaboration with The Clubs and District.

The District administrator will comply with the assurance of meeting with Club directors regularly.

The District will provide healthy snacks and lunch to participating students.

District will co-develop indicators for a successful program evaluation with The Clubs.

District level liaisons and administrators will invite The Clubs staff to accompany School staff at BEST Plus, Restorative Practices, and other behavior management training with School and District.

District will be responsible for providing custodial supplies used by The Clubs staff & Club Members.

District's contract manager will meet monthly with The Clubs and the administrator at least weekly with each Club Director.

The District will coordinate and be responsible for the technology needed for academic learning opportunities (Let's Go Learn, additional enrichment opportunities).

(b) Contractor's Responsibilities and Duties

Boys & Girls Clubs of Sonoma-Marin will provide a Summer School program at Burbank and Biella Elementary Schools.

The Clubs will provide direct services in the model outlined below or in a CDE sanctioned amended model to accommodate COVID-19 health & safety protocols. The Clubs will comply with all county & state health orders in the delivery of the summer program.

The Clubs will provide parent information, registration, and communication.

The Clubs will provide all materials necessary to run the summer program. School site supplies will not be utilized for the running of the summer program.

The Clubs will maintain timely records for attendance, fiscal reporting, and program evaluation.

The Clubs will establish a sign-in, sign-out procedure that records what time the student leaves the program and with whom to ensure student safety. The Clubs will help ensure that students report directly to The Clubs upon dismissal and will implement a system to verify absences from the after-school program for student safety purposes.

The Clubs will co-develop indicators of successful program evaluation with the District.

The Clubs will work together with The District to ensure that the program contains a balance of components, including educational literacy, enrichment, and a safe physical and emotional environment. The daily schedule, hours of operation, and daily attending students will be mutually agreed upon depending on the school's instructional model.

The Club will have 1 professional development day to be trained to utilize academic and social-emotional programs.

Children will participate in structured activities designed to improve and enhance literacy and other academic content areas, communication, and decision-making skills. The group leaders will incorporate learning through group instruction.

The Club will be solely responsible for staff in their employ under this agreement. Club certifies that staff providing services are adequately trained and prepared and provided with appropriate staff development.

The Club will ensure that all Club employees meet Santa Rosa City Schools' minimum requirements for the instructional assistant position, save current District employees whose compliance requirements will be monitored by the District.

Priority enrollment will be given to homeless and foster youth per EC sections 8483[c][1][A] and 8483[d][1][A].

Club and administrator will confer regarding summer program student attendance and discipline issues and actions, including removal from the program.

The Club will comply with the assurance of meeting with site principals on a regular basis. The Club will follow the same level of discipline expectations, rules, BEST Plus, and Restorative Practices in order to maintain student behavior consistent with the school culture during school hours.

2. Term. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this CONTRACT on June 6, 2022, and will continue through July 29, 2022, subject to revision and renewal with BOARD approval in subsequent years. Pursuant to Education Code §17596, in no event shall this CONTRACT exceed a term of five (5) years.

3. Compensation. DISTRICT agrees to pay CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this CONTRACT a total fee not to exceed Three Hundred Thirty Thousand Two Hundred Forty Dollars (\$330,240). DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions:

The State reimbursement rate for ASES programs is \$258 per week for a 6-hour program using an ADA model. SRCS shall pay the Vendor that rate. The ADA will be reported to the State and Federal Department by the Vendor twice, once for June 2022 and once for July of 2022, for student attendance in the program for that month. Upon successful confirmation, the Vendor will be paid within 15 business days after certification of the ADA.

4. Expected Outcomes (Deliverables). DISTRICT expects the following outcomes from the services performed by CONTRACTOR pursuant to this CONTRACT (What was the positive impact on the students? How will/is it measured?):

The Clubs will use these indicators in concert with the District's goal to create & construct a viable argument and align these goals to Sonoma County's Cradle to Career (C2C) goal areas.

1. The Club will be evaluated by weekly check-in with the Summer School Principal and occasional site visitations.
2. If the Summer School Principal has any concerns, she will express them in an email to the Club director. If not resolved by the next weekly check-in, there will be a formal meeting with the signatories to the contract or designees to discuss the next steps.

Five Key Elements for Positive Youth Development (C2C Goal 3).

1. A safe, positive environment is built throughout the entire The Clubs.
2. The Clubs maintain a focus on FUN for Members of all ages.
3. The Clubs encourage the development of supportive relationships, not only between members and caring adults but peer-to-peer as well.
4. The Clubs provides all members opportunities to be actively engaged in the Clubs Experiences and sets high expectations.
5. The Clubs offers recognition for Members, both formally and informally, for their successes and accomplishments.

PRIORITY OUTCOME #1 - Members will achieve Academic Success. (C2C Goal 2 & 4).

1. The Clubs Members will use the program Let's Go Learn as part of a summer learning intervention and assessment program. The Summer School Principal will coordinate the training, computers and lesson planning.
2. The Clubs Members will participate in KidzLit and Silent Reading daily.
3. The Clubs Members will have access to HYLAS (High Yield Learning Activities) daily to practice reading, writing, speaking, math, & scientific inquiry (including My Skills Tutor & Study Island).

6. Expenses. Except as set forth herein, DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT.

7. Independent Contractor. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this CONTRACT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation, Workers' Compensation, Health and Welfare Benefits, Paid Vacation, Retirement Program Participation, or any other employee benefits. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security, and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S employees.

8. Materials. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR'S services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

9. Taxes. Federal Internal Revenue Service's regulations require that school districts report all payments to individuals for CONTRACTOR services. CONTRACTOR agrees to file federal and state tax returns and pay all applicable state and federal taxes on amounts paid pursuant to this CONTRACT. In the event DISTRICT is audited for compliance regarding any applicable taxes, CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish DISTRICT with proof of payment of taxes on these earnings.

10. Indemnification:

- (a) CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, defend with counsel acceptable to DISTRICT, and hold harmless to the full extent permitted by law, DISTRICT and its Board of Trustees, officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, claims, expenses and costs (including, without limitation, attorney fees and costs and fees of litigation) (collectively, "Liability") of every nature arising out of or in connection with CONTRACTOR'S performance or failure to perform its obligations under this CONTRACT, except such Liability caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT. This indemnification obligation is not limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages or compensation payable to or for CONTRACTOR or its agents under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts. Notwithstanding the foregoing, however, in the event that a court determines that liability with respect to any Liability was caused or contributed to by the negligent act, error, omission or the willful misconduct of DISTRICT, liability will be apportioned between CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT with regard to such Liability based upon the parties' respective degrees of culpability, as determined by the court, and CONTRACTOR'S duty to indemnify DISTRICT with respect to satisfaction of the judgment only (but not to costs of defense previously incurred by CONTRACTOR) will be limited accordingly.
- (b) CONTRACTOR shall be liable to DISTRICT for any loss or damage to DISTRICT property arising from or in connection with CONTRACTOR'S performance hereunder, if and to the extent caused by CONTRACTOR or any agent or representative

of CONTRACTOR.

11. Insurance: With respect to the performance of work under this CONTRACT, CONTRACTOR shall maintain and shall require all of its subcontractors, if any, to maintain insurance as indicated below:

(a) Worker's compensation insurance with statutory limits as required by the Labor Code or the State of California. The policy shall be endorsed with the following specific language: "This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to the DISTRICT".

(b) Commercial or Comprehensive General Liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage using an occurrence policy form, in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate. Such insurance shall include, but not be limited to premises and operations liability, independent CONTRACTOR's liability, and personal injury liability.

(c) Automobile liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit for each occurrence. Such insurance shall include coverage for owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles.

(d) Each such comprehensive or commercial general liability and automobile liability insurance policy shall be endorsed with the following specific language:

(1) DISTRICT, its officers and employees, is named as additional insured for all liability arising out of the operations by or on behalf of the named insured in the performance of this CONTRACT.

(2) The inclusion of more than one insured shall not operate to impair the rights of one insured against another insured, and the coverage afforded shall apply as though separate policies had been issued to each insured, but the inclusion of more than one insured shall not operate to increase the limits of the company's liability.

(3) The insurance provided herein is primary coverage to DISTRICT with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained by DISTRICT and no insurance held or owned by DISTRICT shall be called upon to contribute to a loss.

(4) This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to DISTRICT.

(e) Sexual Abuse and Molestation coverage in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, with an annual aggregate of \$2,000,000, endorsed with the following specific language: "This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to DISTRICT." **[Required if Contractor will be directly supervising children]**

(f) Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions) Insurance for all activities of the CONTRACTOR arising out of or in connection with this CONTRACT is an amount no less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit for each occurrence endorsed with the following specific language: "This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to DISTRICT." **[Required if Professional Services is checked on first page]**

(g) Documentation: The following documentation shall be submitted to the DISTRICT:

(1) Properly executed certificates of insurance clearly evidencing all coverages, limits, and endorsements required above. The certificates shall be submitted prior to commencement of services under this CONTRACT.

(2) Signed copies of the specified endorsements for each policy. Said endorsement copies shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of execution of this CONTRACT.

(3) Upon DISTRICT'S written request, certified copies of insurance policies. Such policy copies shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of DISTRICT'S request.

(h) Policy Obligations: CONTRACTOR'S indemnity and other obligations shall not be limited by the foregoing insurance requirements.

(i) Material Breach: If CONTRACTOR, for any reason, fails to maintain insurance coverage, which is required pursuant to this CONTRACT; the same shall be deemed a material breach of contract. DISTRICT, at its sole option, may terminate this CONTRACT and obtain damages from the CONTRACTOR resulting from the breach. Alternatively, DISTRICT may purchase such required insurance coverage, and without further notice to CONTRACTOR, County may deduct from sums due to CONTRACTOR any premium costs advanced by DISTRICT for such insurance. These remedies shall be in addition to any other remedies available to DISTRICT.

12. Termination:

(a) DISTRICT may terminate this CONTRACT without cause by giving thirty (30) calendar days written notice to CONTRACTOR. In the event DISTRICT elects to terminate the CONTRACT without cause, it shall pay CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered to such date.

(b) If either party fails to perform any of its obligations hereunder, within the time and in the manner hereunder provided or otherwise violates any of the terms of the CONTRACT, either party may immediately terminate this CONTRACT by giving written notice of such termination, stating the reason for such termination. In such event, CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to receive payment for all services satisfactorily rendered, provided, however, that there shall be deducted from such amount the amount of liquidated damages, if any, sustained by DISTRICT by virtue of any breach of the CONTRACT by CONTRACTOR.

13. Fingerprints. The DISTRICT has considered the totality of the services to be provided under this CONTRACT and has determined that CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S employees are subject to the fingerprinting requirements of Education Code section 45125.1. CONTRACTOR shall submit fingerprints for review by the Department of Justice and authorize DISTRICT to receive subsequent arrest and conviction notifications.

14. Confidentiality. CONTRACTOR acknowledges the protections afforded to student health and related information under regulations adopted pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), student records under the Family Educational Rights and privacy Act (FERPA), and under provisions of state law and DISTRICT policy relating to privacy. CONTRACTOR shall ensure that all activities undertaken pursuant to this CONTRACT comply with these requirements.

15. Ownership of Work Product: DISTRICT shall be the owner of and shall be entitled to immediate possession of accurate reproducible copies of any work product gathered or computed by CONTRACTOR prior to termination of this CONTRACT by DISTRICT or upon completion of the work pursuant to this CONTRACT.

16. Assignment. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this CONTRACT shall be performed solely by CONTRACTOR and shall not be assigned or transferred by the CONTRACTOR to any third party or employee/agent of CONTRACTOR without the DISTRICT'S prior written consent.

17. Compliance with Applicable Laws. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT'S general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR'S business, equipment, and personnel engaged in operations covered by this CONTRACT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.

18. Permits/Licenses. CONTRACTOR shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this CONTRACT.

19. Entire CONTRACT/Amendment. This CONTRACT and any attachments constitute the entire CONTRACT among the parties to it and supersede any prior or contemporaneous understanding or CONTRACT with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties. Should the CONTRACT terms conflict with any amendments attached hereto, this CONTRACT shall govern.

20. Notice. All notices or demands to be given under this CONTRACT by either to the other shall be in writing and given either by (a) personal service or (b) by postage prepaid U.S. Mail, registered or certified, return receipt requested. Service of notice or demand shall be considered given when received if personally served or, if mailed, on the second day after deposited at any U.S. Post Office. The address to which either party may give notices or demands may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. 21. Nondiscrimination. CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations in regard to nondiscrimination in employment because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, medical condition, handicap, or other prohibited basis. All nondiscrimination rules or regulations required by law to be included in this CONTRACT are incorporated by this reference.

22. Extra (Changed) Work. Only the Superintendent may authorize extra (and/or changed) work, which shall be in writing and thereafter ratified by the Board. The parties expressly recognize that DISTRICT and DISTRICT personnel are without authorization either to order extra (and/or changed) work or to waive contract requirements. Failure of the CONTRACTOR to secure proper authorization for extra work shall constitute a waiver of any and all right to adjustment in the contract price or contract time due to such

unauthorized extra work and the CONTRACTOR thereafter shall be entitled to no compensation whatsoever for the performance of such work.

23. Conflict of Interest. CONTRACTOR represents that it presently has no interest, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services contemplated by this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR further represents that in the performance of this CONTRACT, no person having such interest will be employed. If CONTRACTOR participates in the planning, development, or negotiation of a contract for the District, CONTRACTOR may not subsequently acquire a financial interest in that contract in violation of Government Code section 1090.

24. Severability. If any term, condition, or provision of this CONTRACT is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.

25. Governing Law. The terms and conditions of this CONTRACT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Sonoma County, California, and no other place.

2. Term. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this CONTRACT on July 25, 2022, and will continue through July 29, 2022, subject to revision and renewal with BOARD approval in subsequent years. Pursuant to Education Code §17596, in no event shall this CONTRACT exceed a term of five (5) years.

3. Compensation. DISTRICT agrees to pay CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this CONTRACT a total fee not to exceed 2,637.00 Dollars (\$2,637.00) DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions:

COS will submit an invoice to CCLA Office Manager at the start of the Summer Session.



Memorandum of Understanding

Between

Santa Rosa City Schools District (SRCS) – Elsie Allen High School (EAHS)

And

Sonoma State University (SSU)

Elsie Allen High School, part of the Santa Rosa City Schools District, and Sonoma State University, desire to establish a relationship between the two institutions who agree to cooperate with each other as follows:

Scope of Cooperation

Subject to mutual consent, the areas of cooperation will include academic and support services offered by both institutions to carry out the development and implementation of the University Center at Elsie Allen High School. Such services will include the following:

- a. Both institutions agree to provide staff to work as part of the Advisory Board for the University Center program.
- b. SRCS will develop and distribute promotional materials for the University Center, conduct county-wide recruitments and interview all applicants for the program. SRCS will be responsible for assuring continued enrollment in the University Center.
- c. SRCS will ensure that all students successfully complete the equivalent of advanced algebra (Math 3), a second year of world language and two laboratory science courses before starting classes at SSU. Students must be exempt from remediation or forgo English and math courses until remediation measures are fulfilled. SRCS a-g coursework will be completed with a minimum 3.0 grade point average and no grade below a C-.
- d. SRCS will provide a part-time program coordinator.
- e. SRCS will provide transportation for University Center students to and from SSU.
- f. SSU will provide information and counseling regarding the college application and financial aid processes.
- g. SSU will organize and host campus visits and an annual Fall Orientation for University Center students and parents.
- h. SSU may enroll up to 120 students per semester from the University Center program at a minimal cost to the student as allowed under the “Early Entrants” agreement with the Chancellor's Office.
- i. SSU will identify courses for enrollment by University Center students. Students will have a registration 1 priority.
- j. SSU will guarantee entrance to the institution to all University Center graduates who meet the minimum eligibility index, as identified by Sonoma State University.
- k. University Center students will be permitted to enroll in up to 6 units per semester at SSU.

The terms for each specific service or activity implemented under this *Memorandum of Understanding* shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of that activity. Any such agreements entered into, as outlined above, will form appendixes to this *Memorandum of Understanding*. 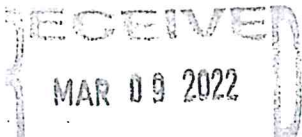

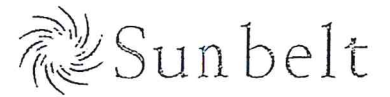

1. Services.

(a) DISTRICT's Responsibilities and Duties:

1. Support the coordination of weeklong camp participation of SRCS students, ages 6-13, to LandPaths outdoor education locations, including working with school site administration on invites to students
2. Communicate regularly with LandPaths personnel for program/service coordination
3. Provide LandPaths student/guardian information so that families may complete registration with LandPaths staff

(b) CONTRACTOR's Responsibilities and Duties:

2. Coordinate with landowners and land/resource management agencies
3. Provide highly trained outdoor education staff, as well as necessary tools and materials needed to implement safe and engaging outdoor camp programs for youth
4. Follow and communicate with District regarding any agreed upon safety protocols
5. Communicate with families and support the process of registration with parents/guardians
6. Providing staffing at central location (Helen Lehman School) for bus pick up and drop off

2. Term. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this CONTRACT on March 31, 2022, and will continue through July 31, 2022, subject to revision and renewal with BOARD approval in subsequent years. Pursuant to Education Code §17596, in no event shall this CONTRACT exceed a term of five (5) years.

3. 90% of parents will report that their child expressed enthusiasm for attending camp each day.

6. Expenses. Except as set forth herein, DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT.

7. Independent Contractor. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this CONTRACT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her

employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation, Workers' Compensation, Health and Welfare Benefits, Paid Vacation, Retirement Program Participation, or any other employee benefits. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security, and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S employees.

8. Materials. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR'S services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

9. Taxes. Federal Internal Revenue Service's regulations require that school districts report all payments to individuals for CONTRACTOR services. CONTRACTOR agrees to file federal and state tax returns and pay all applicable state and federal taxes on amounts paid pursuant to this CONTRACT. In the event DISTRICT is audited for compliance regarding any applicable taxes, CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish DISTRICT with proof of payment of taxes on these earnings.

10. Indemnification:

- (a) CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, defend with counsel acceptable to DISTRICT, and hold harmless to the full extent permitted by law, DISTRICT and its Board of Trustees, officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, claims, expenses and costs (including, without limitation, attorney fees and costs and fees of litigation) (collectively, "Liability") of every nature arising out of or in connection with CONTRACTOR'S performance or failure to perform its obligations under this CONTRACT, except such Liability caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT. This indemnification obligation is not limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages or compensation payable to or for CONTRACTOR or its agents under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.
- (b) CONTRACTOR shall be liable to DISTRICT for any loss or damage to DISTRICT property arising from or in connection with CONTRACTOR'S performance hereunder.

11. Insurance: With respect to the performance of work under this CONTRACT, CONTRACTOR shall maintain and shall require all of its subcontractors, if any, to maintain insurance as indicated below:

(a) Worker's compensation insurance with statutory limits as required by the Labor Code or the State of California. The policy shall be endorsed with the following specific language: "This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to the DISTRICT".

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(c) Automobile liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit for each occurrence. Such insurance shall include coverage for owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles.

(d) Each such comprehensive or commercial general liability and automobile liability insurance policy shall be endorsed with the following specific language:

(1) DISTRICT, its officers and employees, is named as additional insured for all liability arising out of the operations by or on behalf of the named insured in the performance of this CONTRACT.

(2) The inclusion of more than one insured shall not operate to impair the rights of one insured against another insured, and the coverage afforded shall apply as though separate policies had been issued to each insured, but the inclusion of more than one insured shall not operate to increase the limits of the company's liability.

(3) The insurance provided herein is primary coverage to DISTRICT with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained by DISTRICT and no insurance held or owned by DISTRICT shall be called upon to contribute to a loss.

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(g) Documentation: The following documentation shall be submitted to the DISTRICT:

(1) Properly executed certificates of insurance clearly evidencing all coverages, limits, and endorsements required above. The certificates shall be submitted prior to commencement of services under this CONTRACT.

(2) Signed copies of the specified endorsements for each policy. Said endorsement copies shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of execution of this CONTRACT.



1. Services.

(a) DISTRICT's Responsibilities and Duties:

The District will collaborate with SSU EXCEL for Youth in offering summer classes to SRCS students. This will include:

- Providing 1 SRCS staff for the 2-week program: June 13-24
- Provide a school site at which to offer classes to SRCS students – Helen Lehman Elementary
- Provide lunch for students during program
- Promote the program
 - Distribute marketing materials (i.e., catalog) and registration forms
- Incorporate policies and forms provided by EXCEL for Youth for registration, student packets, and tracking
- Register students
- Provide rosters, contact information, and medical history forms (special needs, if applicable) to EXCEL for Youth at least two weeks prior to start date.
- Meet via phone and/or on-site with EXCEL program coordinator and EXCEL staff as needed
- Share in the fielding of inquiries and emails
- Follow all safety protocols related to COVID-19 as reviewed and approved by district's COVID Coordinator

(b) CONTRACTOR's Responsibilities and Duties:

EXCEL for Youth and the Sonoma State School of Extended and International Education will provide and pay for the following:

- Instructors
- Class Materials and Supplies
- Staffing (EXCEL Program Coordinator, On-site Coordinator and 1 EXCEL staff assistant)
- T-shirts (one for each student participant)
- Generate and provide schedule of classes & support, as needed, the registration process
- Provide policies and forms to SRCS District for registration and coordination purposes
- Meet via phone and/or on-site with SRCS staff and administrators as needed
- Share in the fielding of inquiries and emails
- Provide marketing materials for copying and distribution
- Support SSU staff in the process of district clearance, for example fingerprinting
- Follow all safety protocols related to COVID-19 as reviewed and approved by district's COVID Coordinator

2. Term. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this CONTRACT on March 31, 2022, and will continue through June 30, 2022, subject to revision and renewal with BOARD approval in subsequent years. Pursuant to Education Code §17596, in no event shall this CONTRACT exceed a term of five (5) years.

3. Compensation. DISTRICT agrees to pay CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this CONTRACT a total fee not to exceed One Hundred Four Thousand Dollars (\$104,000). DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions:

The District shall pay the Independent Contractor upon receipt of an invoice after the completion of the services described above.

4. Expected Outcomes (Deliverables). DISTRICT expects the following outcomes from the services performed by CONTRACTOR pursuant to this CONTRACT (What was the positive impact on the students? How will/is it measured?):

- 400 students, currently in grades 3rd-7th, will have the opportunity to be enrolled in a summer class offering
- 400 students will have the opportunity to engage in a 3-hour class that supports content standards in an interactive, engaging learning environment

5. Alignment with DISTRICT Strategic Plan. This CONTRACT supports the following Strategic Plan Goals (check all that apply):

- Provides a coherent, rigorous, and relevant teaching and learning program to graduate college and career ready students.

6. Expenses. Except as set forth herein, DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT.

7. Independent Contractor. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this CONTRACT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT'S employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation, Workers' Compensation, Health and Welfare Benefits, Paid Vacation, Retirement Program Participation, or any other employee benefits. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR

shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security, and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S employees.

8. Materials. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR'S services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

9. Taxes. Federal Internal Revenue Service's regulations require that school districts report all payments to individuals for CONTRACTOR services. CONTRACTOR agrees to file federal and state tax returns and pay all applicable state and federal taxes on amounts paid pursuant to this CONTRACT. In the event DISTRICT is audited for compliance regarding any applicable taxes, CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish DISTRICT with proof of payment of taxes on these earnings.

10. Indemnification:

- (a) CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, defend DISTRICT, and hold harmless to the full extent permitted by law, DISTRICT and its Board of Trustees, officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, claims, expenses and costs (collectively, "Liability") of every nature arising out of or in connection with CONTRACTOR'S performance or failure to perform its obligations under this CONTRACT, except such Liability caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT. This indemnification obligation is not limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages or compensation payable to or for CONTRACTOR or its agents under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.
- (b) CONTRACTOR shall be liable to DISTRICT for any loss or damage to DISTRICT property arising from or in connection with CONTRACTOR'S performance hereunder.

11. Insurance: With respect to the performance of work under this CONTRACT, CONTRACTOR shall maintain and shall require all of its subcontractors, if any, to maintain insurance as indicated below:

(a) Worker's compensation insurance with statutory limits as required by the Labor Code or the State of California. The policy shall be endorsed with the following specific language: "This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to the DISTRICT".

(b) Commercial or Comprehensive General Liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage using an occurrence policy form, in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate. Such insurance shall include, but not be limited to premises and operations liability, independent CONTRACTOR's liability, and personal injury liability.

(c) Each such comprehensive or commercial general liability policy shall be endorsed with the following specific language:

(1) DISTRICT, its officers and employees, is named as additional insured for all liability arising out of the operations by or on behalf of the named insured in the performance of this CONTRACT.

(2) The inclusion of more than one insured shall not operate to impair the rights of one insured against another insured, and the coverage afforded shall apply as though separate policies had been issued to each insured, but the inclusion of more than one insured shall not operate to increase the limits of the company's liability.

(3) The insurance provided herein is primary coverage to DISTRICT with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained by DISTRICT and no insurance held or owned by DISTRICT shall be called upon to contribute to a loss.

(4) This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to DISTRICT.

(e) Sexual Abuse and Molestation coverage in an amount no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, with an annual aggregate of \$2,000,000, endorsed with the following specific language: "This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to DISTRICT" **[Required if contractor will be directly supervising children]**

(f) Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions) Insurance for all activities of the CONTRACTOR arising out of or in connection with this CONTRACT is an amount no less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit for each occurrence endorsed with the following specific language: "This policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice to DISTRICT." **[Required if Professional Services is checked on first page]**

(g) Documentation: The following documentation shall be submitted to the DISTRICT:

(1) Properly executed certificates of insurance clearly evidencing all coverages, limits, and endorsements required above. The certificates shall be submitted prior to commencement of services under this CONTRACT.

(2) Signed copies of the specified endorsements for each policy. Said endorsement copies shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of execution of this CONTRACT.

(3) Upon DISTRICT'S written request, certified copies of insurance policies. Such policy copies shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of DISTRICT'S request.

(h) Policy Obligations: CONTRACTOR'S indemnity and other obligations shall not be limited by the foregoing insurance requirements.

(i) Material Breach: If CONTRACTOR, for any reason, fails to maintain insurance coverage, which is required pursuant to this CONTRACT; the same shall be deemed a material breach of contract. DISTRICT, at its sole option, may terminate this CONTRACT and obtain damages from the CONTRACTOR resulting from the breach. Alternatively, DISTRICT may purchase such required insurance coverage, and without further notice to CONTRACTOR, County may deduct from sums due to CONTRACTOR any premium costs advanced by DISTRICT for such insurance. These remedies shall be in addition to any other remedies available to DISTRICT.

12. Termination:

(a) DISTRICT may terminate this CONTRACT without cause by giving thirty (30) calendar days written notice to CONTRACTOR. In the event DISTRICT elects to terminate the CONTRACT

without cause, it shall pay CONTRACTOR for program class materials and supplies and services satisfactorily rendered to such date.

(b) If either party fails to perform any of its obligations hereunder, within the time and in the manner hereunder provided or otherwise violates any of the terms of the CONTRACT, either party may immediately terminate this CONTRACT by giving written notice of such termination, stating the reason for such termination. In such event, CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to receive payment for all program class materials and supplies and services satisfactorily rendered, provided, however, that there shall be deducted from such amount the amount of liquidated damages, if any, sustained by DISTRICT by virtue of any breach of the CONTRACT by CONTRACTOR.

13. Fingerprints. The DISTRICT has considered the totality of the services to be provided under this CONTRACT and has determined that CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S employees to the fingerprinting requirements of Education Code section 45125.1. CONTRACTOR shall submit fingerprints for review by the Department of Justice and authorize DISTRICT to receive subsequent arrest and conviction notifications. CONTRACTOR will provide verification to the DISTRICT of fingerprint clearance for their employees.

14. Confidentiality. CONTRACTOR acknowledges the protections afforded to student health and related information under regulations adopted pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), student records under the Family Educational Rights and privacy Act (FERPA), and under provisions of state law and DISTRICT policy relating to privacy. CONTRACTOR shall ensure that all activities undertaken pursuant to this CONTRACT comply with these requirements. District understands that Contractor is a California State University and is therefore subject to the California Public Records Act.

15. Ownership of Work Product: DISTRICT shall be the owner of and shall be entitled to immediate possession of accurate reproducible copies of any work product gathered or computed by CONTRACTOR prior to termination of this CONTRACT by DISTRICT or upon completion of the work pursuant to this CONTRACT.

16. Assignment. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this CONTRACT shall be performed solely by CONTRACTOR and shall not be assigned or transferred by the CONTRACTOR to any third party or employee/agent of CONTRACTOR without the DISTRICT'S prior written consent.

17. Compliance with Applicable Laws. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT'S general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR'S business, equipment, and personnel engaged in operations covered by this CONTRACT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.

18. Permits/Licenses. CONTRACTOR shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this CONTRACT.

19. Entire CONTRACT/Amendment. This CONTRACT and any attachments constitute the entire CONTRACT among the parties to it and supersede any prior or contemporaneous understanding or CONTRACT with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties. Should the CONTRACT terms conflict with any amendments attached hereto, this CONTRACT shall govern.

20. Notice. All notices or demands to be given under this CONTRACT by either to the other shall be in writing and given either by (a) personal service or (b) by postage prepaid U.S. Mail, registered or

certified, return receipt requested. Service of notice or demand shall be considered given when received if personally served or, if mailed, on the second day after deposited at any U.S. Post Office. The address to which either party may give notices or demands may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section. 21. Nondiscrimination. CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations in regard to nondiscrimination in employment because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, medical condition, handicap, or other prohibited basis. All nondiscrimination rules or regulations required by law to be included in this CONTRACT are incorporated by this reference.

22. Extra (Changed) Work. Only the Superintendent may authorize extra (and/or changed) work, which shall be in writing and thereafter ratified by the Board. The parties expressly recognize that DISTRICT and DISTRICT personnel are without authorization either to order extra (and/or changed) work or to waive contract requirements. Failure of the CONTRACTOR to secure proper authorization for extra work shall constitute a waiver of any and all right to adjustment in the contract price or contract time due to such unauthorized extra work and the CONTRACTOR thereafter shall be entitled to no compensation whatsoever for the performance of such work.

23. Conflict of Interest. CONTRACTOR represents that it presently has no interest, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services contemplated by this CONTRACT. CONTRACTOR further represents that in the performance of this CONTRACT, no person having such interest will be employed. If CONTRACTOR participates in the planning, development, or negotiation of a contract for the District, CONTRACTOR may not subsequently acquire a financial interest in that contract in violation of Government Code section 1090.

24. Severability. If any term, condition, or provision of this CONTRACT is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.

25. Governing Law. The terms and conditions of this CONTRACT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Sonoma County, California, and no other place.


