Classlink also provides analytics for the usage of online resources to enable financial decisions for renewals.		The use of online instructional resources has increased dramatically since the beginning of the pandemic and the current trend is that this model is going to continue and expand as school districts adapt to more flexible instructional paradigms including online instruction. SRCS renewed the contract last year to enable staff and students to easily access with one password most of SRCS approved online resources, including textbooks. Through integration with different School Information Systems, including Aeries, ClassLink enables SRCS to stay compliant with licensing requirements ensuring that the correct licenses are distributed to the correct users. ClassLink can provide useful insights about the use of the online resources that corroborated with student achievement analytics at different schools can guide the purchasing/renewal process for these resources. Since ClassLink is such a central part of enabling student access to instructional materials we recommend perpetual renewal of this license. All articles have have embedded Common Core aligned quizzes checking for comprehension. Several of our district adopted CCD units include articles from Newsela. Teachers are able to create classes and assign reading-level specific articles to individual student, or download printable PDF copies of the articles. Teachers in grades 3-12 will have access to the Newsela PRO version which allows for the creation of student binders and more. In addition, the addendum includes professional development and teacher training to the services listed above.		Newsela is a content program that is not sponsored by a textbook publisher and can be accessed by all teachers. The content is updated daily, has multiple reading levels, articles are available in English and Spanish, has multiple reading levels and covers a wide array of topics providing and information rich platform that a teacher in any discipline can use to support student literacy. This addendum continues to provide professional development and teacher training to support staff in effective usage as a resource and tool for student achievement.
