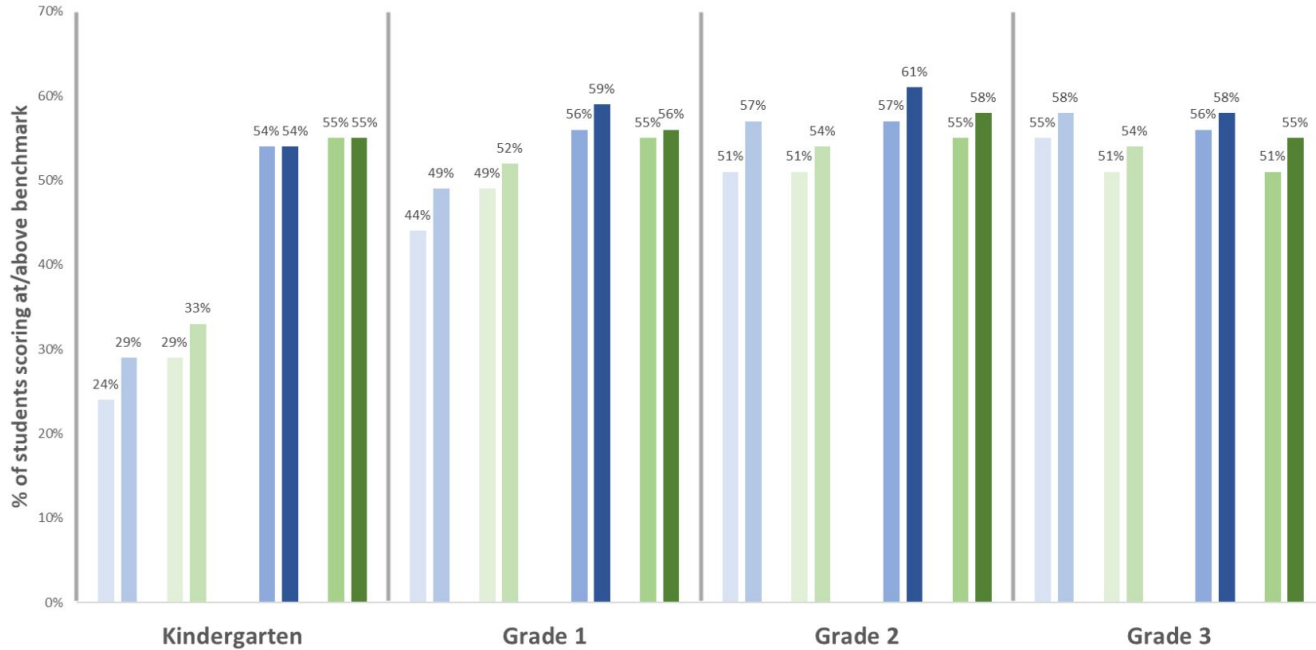

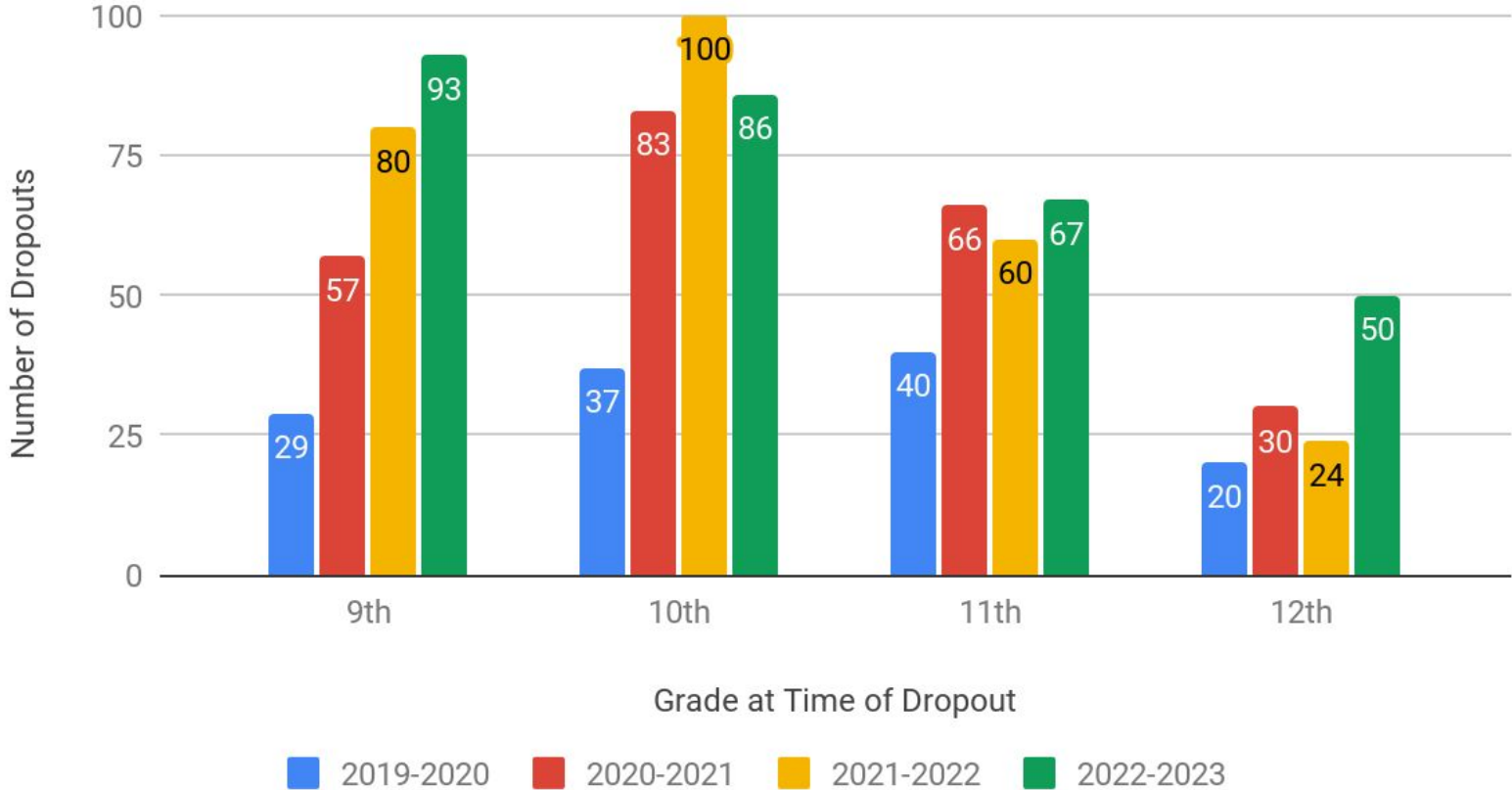

Intervention Efforts



- ▷ Evening Academy
- ▷ Credit Recovery
- ▷ Alternative Graduation Program (AGP)
- ▷ Individual support from Student Services staff
- ▷ Tutoring support
- ▷ Summer school
- ▷ Attendance support
- ▷ Removing barriers by connecting families to other basic need resources (food, housing, etc)
- ▷ Collaboration with international support staff (i.e. Parent Engagement Assistants, Multilingual Newcomer Specialist, International Family Support Specialist)

Response Efforts



- ▷ Resources reviewed with students/caregivers for alternative graduation or job training
- ▷ Phone calls and home visits to re-engage previous students
- ▷ End of summer re-engagement efforts for student re-enrollment
- ▷ Critical conversations with families and students about school and the long term advantages of a high school diploma
- ▷ Outreach efforts in collaboration with international support staff (i.e. Parent Engagement Assistants, Multilingual Newcomer Specialist, International Family Support Specialist)

Celebrations in 2022-2023 Dropout Prevention

- ▷ **17** Students Re-Enrolled for Summer Learning Program
 - **6** of these Students were **Summer Graduates!**
- ▷ **13** Additional Students Re-Enrolled this Fall (prior to day #20)
- ▷ **12** Reported Dropouts have already Re-Enrolled with JCPS
 - **3** previous dropouts were **Winter Graduates!** Several others are on track to graduate in June 2024
