State Board Policy DBDG-001

- Lays out criteria for teachers to earn the digital badge
 - Document goals
 - 100 hours of PD
 - Capstone project
- Lists other educators that can earn the digital badge
- DBDG-001 last updated in 2015



History of the Global Educator Digital Badge

- 2011 SBE Global Education Task Force
 - Goal: to assess the state’s effort to produce “globally competitive” graduates ready to live, work, and contribute in an interconnected world
- Released a report in January 2013 which included:
 - 6 major findings
 - 5 commitments



New Global Educator Digital Badge Process

- Aligned to the Professional Teaching Standards, PISA Global Competence Framework, and Portrait of a Graduate Durable Skills
- 6 microcredentials
 - Canvas hub
 - Options for evidence
 - Reflection on alignment and impact on student learning
- Portfolio
 - All 6 microcredentials
 - Reflection on how the process has impacted their teaching
- Badge
 - Open education resources will be posted
