One of the partnerships that Special Services has with it's preschool vendors (e.g. HeadStart, North Bay Children's Center) is a new partner to inclusive pre-school placements. As a local 501c3 nonprofit 4Cs are a resource for families, care providers and the community at large. The Community Child Care Council (4Cs) has been working since 1972 to ensure every child in Sonoma County has the care and early education they need. 4Cs links families with the right care, train care providers, administer financial assistance, sponsor the child nutrition program, and advocate at the local, state and national level on behalf of families and children. 4Cs also operate 11 preschools in Sonoma County. Special Services is seeking 3 seats at no cost to the District, but provide Services related to the IEP for these students in the General Education Inclusive setting.			4Cs will provide inclusive seats and the evaluation will be based on their participation in IEP services, thier integration of the preschool students into the classes and their willingness to implement the IEP services.
