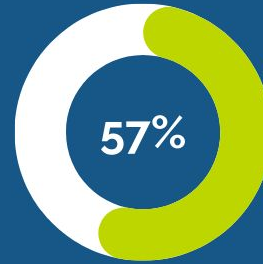
# Read to Achieve Camp

# Walkthrough Data

62 schools | 327 responses



## Learning Targets

Level 1



79% observed evidence that specific learning targets were made explicit to students.

## Engagement

Level 2



95% found that most students were engaged in activities that aligned with specific learning targets.

## Checks for Understanding

Levels 1 & 2



88% observed the teacher utilizing checks for understanding and/or providing feedback to students.

# Survey Results

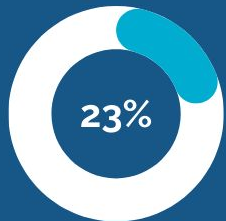

# Power Scholars Grades K-5

- **5 week program** collaboration: WCPSS & YMCA
- Math, Literacy & Enrichment (Field Trips)
- K-5 students from Bugg, Poe, Fox, and River Bend Elementary Schools (2 locations)
- 10 WCPSS Employees & 239 students
- **YMCA:** Salaries, Program Expenses & Field Trips  
**WCPSS:** Facilities, Meals, Transportation & Liaison



## ATTENDANCE

318 Students Invited  
239 Students Attended



## ACADEMIC GAINS (STAR)

- **Literacy:** Students gained 2 months
- **Math:** Students gained 1.5 months

# Credit Recovery Summer School

- 20 Days (June/July)
- Opportunity for students to earn credits for failed courses
- Offered at all high schools
- Transportation, breakfast, and lunch provided at various locations

# 2024-2025 Grades 9-12

## Objective Recovery and Credit Recovery

August 2024-January 2025

- **Objective Recovery** - Teachers provide students with the opportunity to recovery standards and/or objectives in which the student did not demonstrate proficiency.
- **Credit Recovery** - Schools assign students to courses they previously failed to recover the credit.

## STUDENT OUTCOMES

### Objective Recovery

- 5,851 students participated
- 23,001 objectives assigned
- 16,923 objectives successfully recovered



### Credit Recovery

- 2,822 students participated
- 5,661 objectives assigned
- 2,798 courses successfully recovered



# CTE Career Accelerator

## WakeEd Career Accelerator

- Enrollment and Attendance: 841 expressed interest, 622 enrolled, 426 average daily attendance.
- Hosted across 23 sites with the support of 75 staff members.
- Over 35 immersive educational activities, partnering with 50 education and industry leaders.

354 Students Completed All Aspects of Program

# CTE Career Accelerator District C Teamship

- 279 students expressed interest with 196 successfully enrolled.
- Supported by 18 coaches across 8 host sites.
- Engaged with 18 partner businesses to provide real-world experiences.

## STUDENT OUTCOMES

168 Students Completed  
All Aspects of Program

## SURVEY RESULTS

Students reported increased confidence in working on a team and solving complex problems.

93% of business partner survey respondents agree or strongly agree that **they are more likely to consider a student for a job or internship if the student has completed a Teamship experience**



# 2024 EOG/EOC Remediation and Readministration

- DPI provides voluntary summer remediation and re-administration for EOG/EOC tested subjects.
- Students must have earned a passing grade in the course/subject to be eligible for remediation and readministration.
- Purpose is to increase student mastery of standards and strengthen foundational skills in preparation for success in the next year.

# 2024 PreK-12 Extended School Year

- Extended School Year services are provided to students with Individualized Education Programs outside of the regular school year.
- ESY services are provided at 5 Host Sites or Home/Community settings.
- Transportation, Breakfast & Lunch provided at Host Sites.

## STUDENT OUTCOMES

278 students were served at host sites in July 2024.

151 students were served off site at home or in the community.

WCPSS teachers, instructional assistants, speech therapists, occupational therapists, and physical therapists served students during ESY.

# Read to Achieve Camp Grades 2-3

## Program

- **Dates:** April - October 2025
- **Curriculum and Activities:** 12 days (72 hours) of literacy instruction integrating **EL Curriculum and SOLID Start** (Science Oral Language and Literacy Development).
- **Sites:** 64 School Sites
- **2 YMCA Power Scholar Programs: Serving 5 Schools**

## Operational

- Combined some STYR sites to reduce transportation costs
- Headphones and audio splitters to support teachers with small group rotations
- SOLID Start texts
- Sending Save the Date and Invitations



# Power Scholars

## Grades K-5

### Program

- **Dates:** July - August 2025
- **Curriculum and Activities:** A 5-week program offering Math, Literacy, and enrichment activities including field trips, emphasizing a Whole Child Approach to learning.
- **Target Audience:** K-5 students from Bugg, Poe, Fox, River Bend, and Southeast Raleigh Elementary Schools.

### Operational

- **Sites and Resources:** Collaborative effort between WCPSS and the YMCA, managing program expenses, staffing, and field trips.
- **Support Structures:** Instruction led by certified teachers in whole and small group formats, incorporating differentiated literacy instruction and multi-disciplinary activities (P.E., STEM, Art, Music, Yoga).



# Credit Recovery Grades 9-12

## Program

- **Dates:**
  - Modified Calendar: May 30-June 27, 2025
  - Traditional Calendar: July 7-August 1, 2025
- **Curriculum and Activities:** Provides opportunities for high school students to recover credits for previously failed courses using the Edgenuity platform.

## Operational

- Opportunity for students to recover credits for failed courses.
- Offered at all High Schools for students in 9-12 grades.
- Students engage in Credit Recovery through the Edgenuity Platform either On-site, Blended, or Virtual Options.



# EOC/EOC Remediation & Readministration Grades 3-12

## Program

- **Dates:** Differ by Calendar
  - Range from **May 22 - June 30** and will occur on teacher workdays after the final student day.
- **DPI Guidance:** Remains the same as last year.
- **District Guidance** - All ES/MS participate; HS optional.

## Operational

- Additional pay is provided to testing coordinators who work outside their normal school day coordinating the program.
- Guidance was shared with principals in February.
- Schools will share information with families no later than May 16th.



# 2025 PreK-12 Extended School Year

## Program

- **Dates:** July 8-28
  - 15 days of ESY site based instruction
- ESY home/community services per IEP
- Year-Round ESY services offered during extended breaks per IEP

## Operational

- 5 host sites for ESY 2025 for PreK- 12
- Instruction by certified special education teachers
- Services are customized to meet each student's needs based on IEP
- Services may include speech therapy, occupational therapy, or physical therapy





# Next Steps



## Recruit Staff and Student Eligibility

- Gauge summer employment interest and availability and recruit staff.
- Identify eligible students.



## Communication and Enrollment

- Communicate with families and community partners.
- Finalize student enrollment, resources and staffing needs.



## Transportation and Compensation

- Coordinate transportation.
- Coordinate compensation.



## Progress Monitoring

- Continue to revise and implement progress monitoring measures to evaluate impact.



## Board Updates

- Provide Board with an update on impact and effectiveness data in 2025-2026.
