#### **PCBL MASTER TEACHER CADRE NEED TO KNOWS:**

- Rigorous application process which included recommendations from the educator's superintendent/direct supervisor.
- The PCBL MTC will be divided into cohorts across the state led by seasoned educators with vast experience and knowledge in this area.
- In total, approximately 40 hours of learning will be completed between February and June through a combination of pre-work/self study, four in-person sessions and a series of virtual sessions.

#### **WHAT IS PERSONALIZED COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING?**

Competency-Based Learning is an educational model that focuses on students demonstrating mastery of skills and knowledge, rather than just spending a set amount of time on a subject. It's about ensuring students truly understand what they're learning. There are eight essential elements when implementing personalized competency-based learning in the classroom. - **SGHS Agricultural Instructor Chosen for Nourish the Future STEM Initiative** - May 6, 2025 - With the global population now over 8 billion people, feeding and fueling the world has never been a bigger challenge. Meeting this challenge requires innovative approaches to agriculture and developing the next generation of scientists and leaders through education.

Ste. Genevieve County R-II is excited to share that Dr. Hannah Fritsche-Donze, an agricultural education instructor at SGHS, has been selected to participate in the Teacher Leader Community, a prestigious leadership program from Nourish the Future designed to address these critical needs.

Nourish the Future is a national STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) initiative connecting students to modern agriculture. Its mission is to help teachers inspire their students to learn science, solve problems, and see the possibilities of careers in agriculture.

Dr. Fritsche-Donze was selected as one of only 32 teachers nationwide to participate in the year-long fellowship supported by partners like the United Soybean Board, the National Corn Growers Association, and Bayer. Industry partners fund the Nourish the Future program to help farmers educate the public on modern farming and the science behind their practices.

Nourish the Future education lead Heather Bryan summed up the importance of connecting the agriculture industry to the classroom, "Effective STEM teaching requires real-world context, which students and teachers find accessible in agriculture."

The year-long fellowship provides Dr. Fritsche-Donze with a comprehensive professional development experience, including a behind-the-scenes tour of the research happening at Bayer Crop Science in St. Louis, and attendance at the nation's leading agriculture conference: Commodity Classic. Dr. Fritsche-Donze will receive free classroom resources, specialized training in leadership and curriculum development, and access to additional

industry experts from companies like Syngenta. As a key component of the program, Dr. Fritsche-Donze will develop and present a professional development session to share the science of agriculture with colleagues in Missouri.

"Learning science through agriculture inspires students to pursue critical scientific careers—many of which are currently unfilled in the agriculture industry," added Bryan.

"Through this program, Dr. Fritsche-Donze is opening up new opportunities for students and her colleagues and enhancing the way we teach science."

- **Author Dave Fiedler Brings Missouri's WWII POW History to Life for Students -**

December 2, 2024 - On Oct. 29, author and historian Dave Fiedler brought a unique chapter of Missouri's history to life during a presentation for middle school and high school students in the Performing Arts Center. Known for his extensive research on Prisoner of War (POW) camps in Missouri, Fiedler engaged students with fascinating stories about German and Italian POWs held in the state during World War II. Students, including members of the German Club, had the chance to hear about the experiences of the 15,000 prisoners held in more than two dozen camps across Missouri from 1942 to 1946. Fiedler, the author of "The Enemy Among Us: POWs in Missouri During WWII", provided a richly detailed account of these camps, incorporating first-hand stories, maps, photos, and illustrations from his book. During his presentation, Fiedler explained how POWs were treated well, earning wages for jobs in laundries, barbershops, and bakeries—mirroring the treatment of U.S. soldiers. He shared surprising moments of history, such as the POWs' crucial role in flood relief efforts during the spring of 1943. For 36 hours, these prisoners worked tirelessly in a sandbag brigade to save the town from rising rivers, revolutionizing the POW work program in the process. Fiedler also highlighted moments of camaraderie and cultural exchange, such as Italian prisoners singing cheerfully as they worked and the lasting positive impressions many POWs had of their time in the United States. Several even chose to return to the U.S. as immigrants after the war. Following his presentation, students eagerly asked questions, exploring topics like the social and economic impact of POWs in Missouri and the enduring legacy of these camps. This was an incredible opportunity for students to connect with their community's history in a meaningful way. Fiedler's presentation deepened students' understanding of a little-known yet impactful chapter of WWII history. Events like this help foster appreciation for the diverse stories that have shaped Missouri and the world.

"They have left a lasting mark on their professions, on their communities, and on the lives of others. By recognizing them today, we not only celebrate their achievements—we inspire all of you to believe that your own hard work, dedication, and character will be recognized in the future."

- **COACH DENNIS DRUMM, '72** Coach Dennis Drumm, a 1972 alumnus of Ste. Genevieve High School, has exemplified leadership, character, achievement, service, and role model suitability throughout his distinguished 32-year career in education and coaching. His dedication to athletics and his community has left an enduring legacy.

**Leadership:** From the very start of his coaching journey in 1970, Coach Drumm displayed remarkable leadership by volunteering with the Ste. Genevieve Gym

Hockey League and the Ste. Gen Yanks men's baseball team. These formative experiences set the foundation for a lifetime of guiding and inspiring others. After earning his degree in education from Southeast Missouri State University (SEMO), he officially began his career in coaching high school sports, dedicating himself to teaching, mentoring, and leading by example. His leadership extended beyond coaching to include a role as athletic director, where he oversaw programs that positively impacted countless student-athletes. Even after retirement, Coach Drumm continues to demonstrate leadership within the Ste. Genevieve volleyball community by officiating and coaching United States Volleyball Association (USVBA) events and supporting the high school program.

**Character:** Coach Drumm's emphasis on character development has been a cornerstone of his coaching philosophy. Through decades of teaching and coaching, he instilled in his students and athletes the values of respect, teamwork, hard work, and sportsmanship. He encouraged humility in victory and grace in defeat, leaving a lasting impression on the young people under his guidance.

**Achievement:** Coach Drumm's accomplishments are nothing short of extraordinary. His individual honors include multiple Coach of the Year titles in volleyball, basketball, and baseball, spanning decades of success. In 2013, he was awarded the Peggy Johnson Award by the Missouri High School Volleyball Coaches Association, recognizing his exceptional contribution to promoting volleyball in the state. In 2023, his impact on the sport was further solidified with his induction into the Missouri High School Volleyball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. His teams achieved remarkable success as well, with numerous conference championships, district titles, and state-level accomplishments in volleyball, girls' basketball, and baseball. His career coaching record stands at an impressive 864-632-44, with volleyball being his longest-tenured sport. Even in retirement, he added to his achievements by coaching USVBA teams for seven additional years, earning further accolades.

**Service:** Coach Drumm has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to serving his community through various organizations, including the Sons of the American Legion, the Ste. Genevieve Catholic Parish Board, the Knights of Columbus, and the Ste. Genevieve Elks. His professional affiliations include memberships in the Missouri High School Volleyball Coaches Association, the National Federation of State High School Associations, and the Missouri Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association. His dedication to these organizations highlights his passion for service and his desire to contribute meaningfully to the lives of others.

**Role Model Suitability:** Coach Drumm has consistently modeled the importance of sportsmanship, a positive attitude, and a strong work ethic. His ability to set high goals and inspire others to achieve them has made him a guiding figure for both his students and colleagues. Today, Coach Drumm continues to be a vital part of the Ste. Genevieve community, promoting volleyball and serving as an inspirational figure to all who know him. Married to his wife Linda for 47 years, he is the proud father of two successful daughters.

Coach Drumm credits much of his success to the mentors and support he received within the Ste. Genevieve school system. Influential figures such as Joe Shirey, Vernon Huck, and Mike Sherry helped shape his passion for sports and coaching. Peggy Johnson, his first mentor in volleyball, played a pivotal role in his journey, and receiving the Peggy Johnson Award remains one of his proudest accomplishments.

- **DR. CLINT WOLK, '00** Dr. Clint Wolk, a 2000 graduate of Ste. Genevieve High School, exemplifies leadership, character, achievement, service, and role model suitability in his professional and personal endeavors. As a three-time state wrestling champion, salutatorian of his graduating class, and a committed community leader, Dr. Wolk has left an indelible mark on his alma mater and hometown.

**Leadership:** While at SGHS, Dr. Wolk's leadership was evident as captain of both the varsity football and wrestling teams. These experiences set the stage for a life dedicated to guiding others. After graduating, he continued his leadership journey by serving on the Chamber of Commerce Board and the First State Community Bank Board. In 2024, his contributions to mentoring and coaching local youth were celebrated when he was awarded the Presidential Leader Award at the Chamber of Commerce's 100th Anniversary Gala. His ability to inspire, organize, and lead others has made a lasting impact on his community.

**Character:** Dr. Wolk is known for his dedication, compassion, and unwavering commitment to his community. His drive to positively impact the lives of Ste. Genevieve youth is evident in everything he does. Organized and detail-oriented, he approaches his responsibilities with a level of care and diligence that inspires those around him.

**Achievement:** Dr. Wolk's achievements in both academics and athletics are exceptional. As the only wrestler in SGHS history to win three state championships, he demonstrated unparalleled determination and discipline in an individual sport. Remarkably, he achieved this while maintaining a 4.0 GPA and graduating as salutatorian of his class. After SGHS, he earned his doctorate in optometry from the University of Missouri–St. Louis (UMSL) in 2007, furthering his commitment to excellence in his chosen field.

**Service:** After completing his studies, Dr. Wolk returned to Ste. Genevieve to provide optometric care through his practice, Ste. Genevieve Vision Care. Beyond his professional contributions, he has made a profound impact through his volunteer work. Since 2013, he has coached youth sports—including football, baseball, softball, and wrestling—for 11 months out of the year. In 2019, he founded the Ste. Gen Vision League, a five-week community youth wrestling program designed to introduce children to the sport in a shorter, less demanding format. The program has grown from 80 participants in its first year to 140 in 2023, including boys and girls. His ability to remember every participant's name, weight, and wrestling style, demonstrates his remarkable dedication to the program and the young athletes it serves.

**Role Model Suitability:** Dr. Wolk's passion for mentoring youth goes beyond teaching them how to play a sport. He instills values such as self-confidence, resilience, teamwork, and responsibility, all while earning the trust of those he coaches. His dedication to shaping respectful, driven leaders has touched countless lives in the Ste. Genevieve community. Coaching four different sports has provided him with opportunities to connect with a wide range of young people, fostering a culture of hard work and respect that will have a lasting influence. His deep love for Ste. Genevieve and its success is evident in every aspect of his work and volunteerism. Through his leadership, character, and service, he has made an enduring contribution to his community.

- **COACH BRIAN JETT** Coach Brian Jett's leadership, character, and dedication have left an indelible legacy at Ste. Genevieve High School. As the first recipient of the Hall of Fame Dragon Award, his contributions as a coach, mentor, and advocate for students epitomize what it means to inspire and support young people both in and out of the classroom.

**Leadership:** In 1995, Coach Jett launched the Ste. Genevieve cross country program with a bold vision and a selfless spirit, volunteering his time to ensure its success. Despite not receiving compensation, he poured his energy into early mornings and late afternoons, driven by his belief in the potential of every student. He implemented a rigorous program that included 6 a.m. practices, summer running camps in West Plains, and a high-mileage philosophy that pushed athletes beyond their limits. Even during the "off-season," Coach Jett remained a steadfast source of encouragement and guidance, fostering a culture of resilience and determination.

**Character:** Coach Jett's unwavering commitment to prioritizing his students' well-being stands as a testament to his integrity and courage. At one time, district policies posed challenges to meeting the dietary needs of his runners, and Coach Jett quietly took action to ensure they had the resources required to perform and thrive. His steadfast dedication to doing what was right, even in the face of potential consequences, earned him the enduring trust and respect of his athletes. Many of those he mentored continue to stay connected with him today, a reflection of the profound and lasting impact he had on their lives.

**Achievement:** Coach Jett's accolades include being a seven-time Missouri Track & Cross Country Coaches Association Coach of the Year and the National Federation High School Coaches Association Sectional Coach of the Year. His contributions were recognized on Sept. 17, 2024, when he was inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame. His coaching record is nothing short of remarkable. His teams earned a total of seven state titles, including six in girls' cross country and one in girls' track. His boys' cross country and track teams also secured numerous accolades, including two Final Four finishes in cross country and a state runner-up finish in boys' track. His athletes consistently achieved success at the highest levels, with 158 earning All-State honors under his guidance—56 in cross country and 102 in track and field. Beyond the high

school level, Coach Jett mentored athletes who went on to earn college scholarships, including a former All-American now representing Puma professionally.

**Service:** For over two decades, Coach Jett dedicated himself to the Ste. Genevieve community, creating not just successful teams but a sense of family among his athletes. His influence extended far beyond competition; he helped students find purpose, stay in school, and develop life skills that transcended the sport. As a parent once shared, “You saved my boys and kept them in school.” Coach Jett’s commitment to the personal and athletic growth of his students was transformative, fostering a lifelong bond between coach and athlete.

**Role Model Suitability:** Coach Jett’s passion for coaching extended beyond results on the track. He taught his athletes to take responsibility, push their limits, and strive for excellence in all aspects of life. His selfless leadership and belief in his students created an environment where young people felt supported, empowered, and motivated to succeed. He modeled the values of hard work, perseverance, and compassion, becoming a beacon of inspiration for his athletes and the larger community. Coach Jett’s legacy lies in the lives he touched and the community he built. As a coach, mentor, and advocate, he set the standard for what it means to lead with heart, passion, and soul.

- **SGHS Hosts 35th Annual Dan Clark Honors Banquet** - April 28, 2025 - On Wednesday, April 16, Ste. Genevieve High School celebrated its students' academic honors for the 2024-2025 school year at the 35th annual Dan Clark Honors Banquet at the Ste. Genevieve Elks Lodge.

At this year's event, junior Eleanor McKlin, gave the opening remarks. The guest performers for the evening were chorale students Damian Dickerson, who sang "Road to Mandalay" by Oley Speaks, and London White-Hume, who sang "The Vagabond by Ralph" Vaughan Williams. Damian and London both qualified for state this year with exemplary ratings at the district solo and ensemble event.

The guest speaker for the evening was Mr. David Bova, a 1990 graduate of SGHS. After high school, he continued his education at both the University of Missouri-Columbia (MIZZOU) and Southeast Missouri State University (SEMO). David spent 25 years in retail management before joining the City of Ste. Genevieve, where he currently serves as Assistant City Administrator. For more than a decade, he has served on the Ste. Genevieve R-II Board of Education—seven years as board president—demonstrating his deep commitment to our students and community. David and his wife, Julie, have three daughters—Kara, Allison, and Alexis—and one granddaughter, Autumn. Their family's connection to service and education continues to shape and strengthen our school community.

Mr. Bova spoke to students about the lasting impact Ste. Genevieve High School has had on his life and the impact he hopes it will have on theirs. He shared that when he makes decisions as a member of the school board—whether casting votes or discussing difficult topics—he often reflects on the spirit of SGHS: its success, ambition, teamwork, and pride. Mr. Bova encouraged students to recognize that they are now the keepers of that spirit. He described SGHS as a place that offered him happiness, learning, friendship, and support—a place that felt like home and continues to feel that way today. He reminded students that family is not limited to parents and grandparents; it also includes friends, teachers, coaches, principals, and assistant principals who support and celebrate their success.

"You each carry a responsibility to do your best for yourself and for your SGHS family," he said. "You are Ste. Gen Dragons, and with that name comes the expectation that you will

strive for excellence in everything you do—whether in college, trade school, military service, or entering the workforce.” Mr. Bova encouraged students not to undervalue their own abilities, and reminded them that wherever life takes them, they carry the legacy of SGHS—and the responsibility to live with pride, purpose, and excellence.

Next was the presentation of the Patched Overalls Experience, a project managed by Mr. Tyson Schaffner, that offers one student each year the opportunity to fulfill a dream experience between their junior and senior year. - **SADD Sponsors Mock Vehicle Accident** - May 8, 2025 - On Friday, May 2, Ste. SADD faculty sponsor Bre Uzzell expressed her appreciation for the community collaboration that makes this event possible each year. “We’re grateful to all of our local emergency services for taking the time to create a meaningful and memorable experience for our students,” she said. “This event can save lives by helping students think twice before making dangerous decisions behind the wheel.” The event serves as an important reminder during a season often filled with celebrations—encouraging students to protect themselves and others by making safe choices on the road.

### Goal 1: ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Description: Empower all members of our Dragon Family to continuously progress toward tailored learning goals.
- Objective: Data Collection and Analysis
- Strategy – Use of Data: All K-12 faculty will use data to guide instruction, learning, and assessment.
  1. Action Step: Use development training, resources, NWEA/GLA/EOC released items, and interim assessments to create NWEA/GLA/EOC-like common formative assessments to better prepare students for state assessments.
  2. Action Step: Use Student Learning Objectives (SLO) to create SMART goals that focus on student growth.
  3. Action Step: Use data from NWEA to help guide instruction, student learning, and assessment.
  4. Action Step: Use academic and attendance data to identify at-risk students entering SGHS as ninth grade students or those transferring into the district after completing ninth grade.
- Strategy – Data Collection/Analysis: The district will utilize assessment software and technology tools for data collection and analysis to assist with student performance monitoring and district needs.
  1. Action Step: Select and implement assessment tools capable of test generation and progress monitoring.
  2. Action Step: Maintain an online textbook database, appropriate subscription based resources, and student portal for student access.

- Strategy - High Expectations: High expectations for teaching, learning of basic skills (especially in mathematics and reading), and the issuance of grades on a regular basis are conveyed to faculty, staff, and students.

1. Action Step: Principals – Use weekly bulletins and/or monthly faculty meetings to clearly communicate high performance expectations.

2. Action Step: Principals – Communicate daily announcements using a variety of methods (email, announcements, PowerSchool, etc.).

3. Action Step: Faculty – Maintain and update student grades weekly in the district student information system.

- Strategy – Collaborative Lessons: Provide collaborative lessons that teach students to use critical thinking skills and ethical research methods.

1. Action Step: Continue to support and encourage cultural education and exposure through a variety of collaboration efforts including global collaborations, virtual experiences, etc.

2. Action Step: Library Media Specialists, Counselors, School Resource Officer, and School Social Worker – Conduct library orientation and lessons covering internet, app, and social media safety, and digital citizenship etiquette.

- Strategy – Curriculum: The faculty and guidance counselors will, on a rotating basis, be given time to review, revise, and update curriculum. Appropriate instructional equipment, materials, and supplies will be provided annually to implement newly revised curricula.

1. Action Step: Faculty – Use the budgetary process to order materials/supplies needed for the implementation of curriculum in the classroom.

- Strategy – Lesson Plans: All faculty will complete lesson plans that are cross-referenced to local curriculum maps and the Missouri Learning Standards to implement the written, board

approved curriculum.

1. Action Step: SGHS Faculty – Complete/maintain online resources/plans that are cross-referenced to local curriculum maps and the Missouri Learning Standards.

2. Action Step: Principals – Review lesson plans when appropriate and work with faculty who show poor planning.

- Strategy – Professional Development/Life-Long Learning: The district recognizes the relationship between professional growth and student achievement. The district, therefore, commits to encourage and assist the faculty in their pursuit of life-long learning, advanced degrees/certifications, and professional development opportunities that address differentiated instruction, instructional strategies, EOC grade/course level expectations, at-risk student needs, and improved reading and writing skills to bring about improved assessment results.

3. Action Step: SGHS – Continue to implement and monitor the effectiveness of the Dragon FIRE program that provides two weekly 35-minute periods of tutoring and mentoring for students.

4. Action Step: School Social Worker – Work with parents, SG R-II SRO, staff and community resources to build connections and help students solve and cope with problems in their lives.

5. Action Step: School Social Worker – Work with parents, teachers, SRO, and school administrators to develop plans and strategies to improve students' academic performance, attendance, and social development.

- Objective: Technology Integration
- Strategy – Use of Technology: Faculty and administration will use up-to-date technology tools and resources to develop inquiry-based curricula and instruction to support curriculum objectives. Tools and resources are readily available for faculty and student use. Training in the use of the tools and resources (such as eMINTS or equivalent) is provided and continually supported.

3. Action Step: Faculty – Analyze state and common assessment data and use this information to seek professional development opportunities that will enhance instruction.

2. Action Step: Set up student shadow experiences for students interested in attending the Ste. Genevieve R-II School District. Shadow experiences will be facilitated by counselor contact or

requests from parents/guardians during time frames that building leaders (principals, counselors, and teachers) deem appropriate.

3. Action Step: New student to SGHS – Provide technology training for new students who are transitioning to SGHS through peer mentoring through our School Development Seminar.

4. Action Step: SGHS Counselor and Principals – In the fall, hold an evening parent orientation meeting for all 9th grade students and their parents to get to know SGHS.

5. Action Step: SGHS Mentor Students and 9th Grade Counselor – Continually train mentor students. Mentor students are 12th grade students who will meet with and mentor weekly 9th grade students during advisory throughout the school year. They will also lead their advisory during Mentor Games throughout the second semester. Mentor students assist the counselors with new student mixers and transitioning new students.

6. Action Step: 9th Grade Counselor – Hold an orientation program before school begins to help new 9th grade students acquaint themselves with the building, expectations, and procedures at SGHS.

7. Action Step: SGHS Mentor Students – Hold a New Student Mixer activity at the beginning of each school year.
