Chart 1

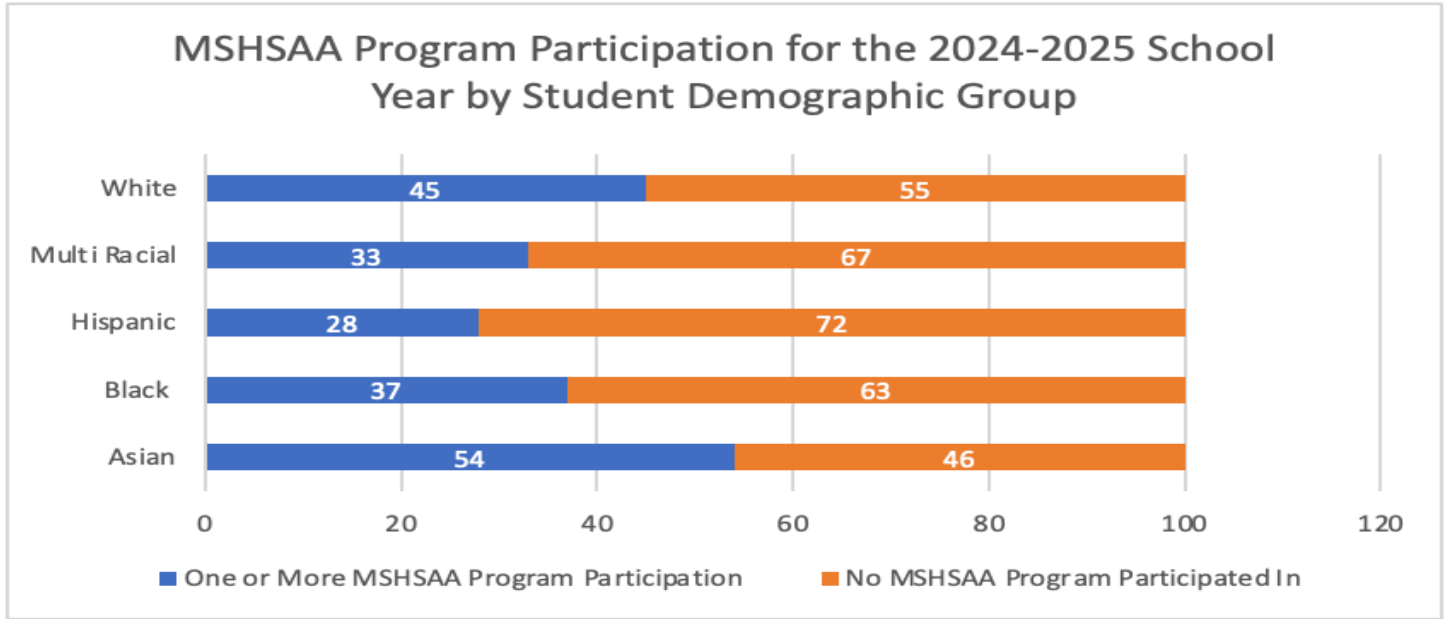

Chart 2

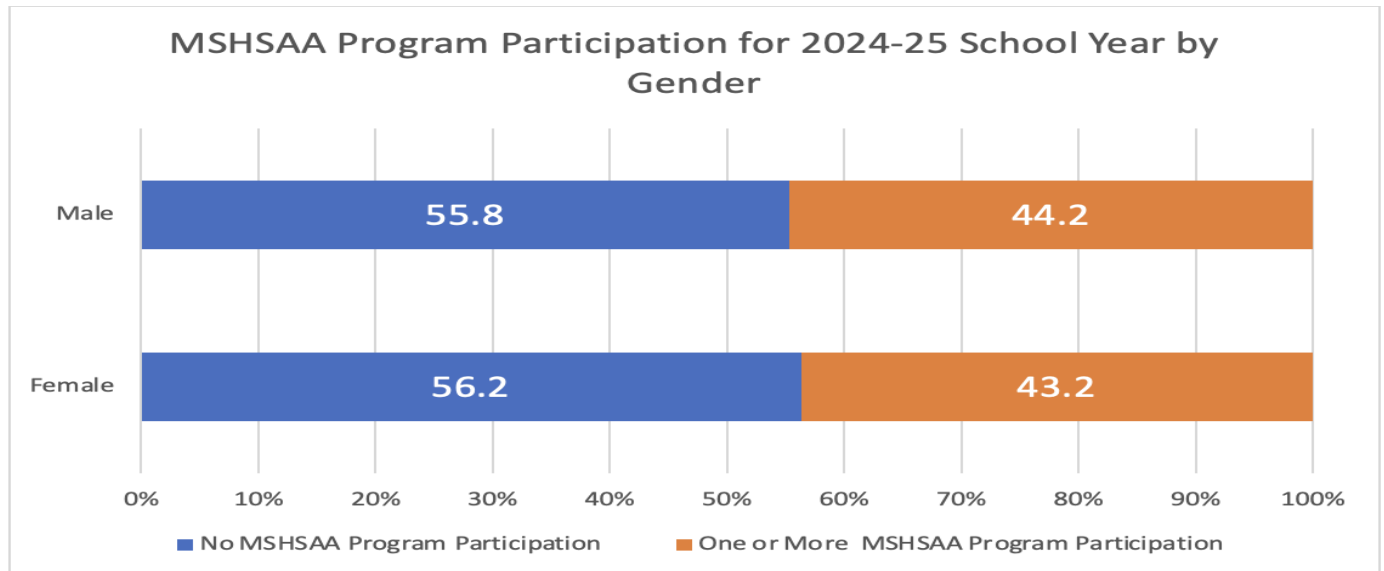


Chart two provides an overview of MSHSAA program participation by student gender. These data help ensure that the programs offered at the high school are meeting the needs of both male and female students. Student

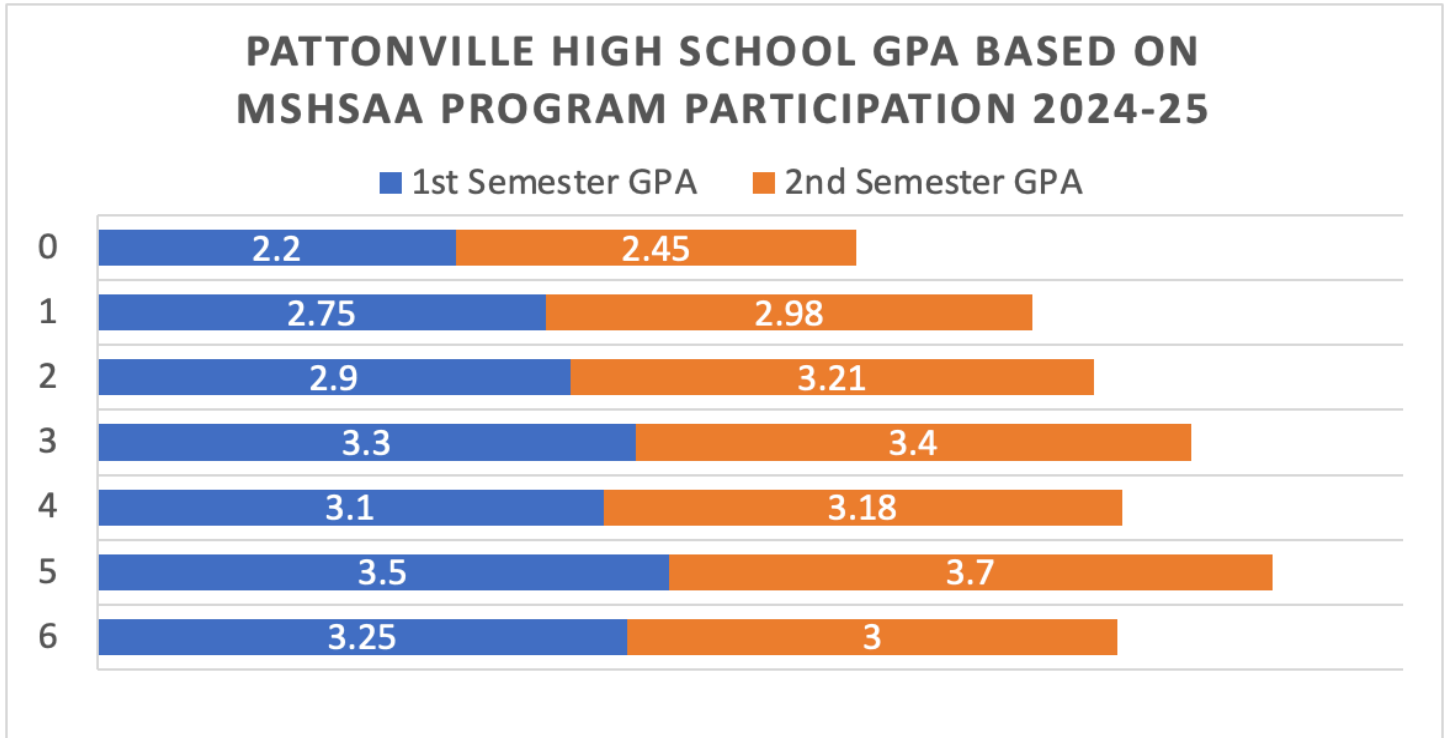

Based on feedback from our recent parent and student surveys, we have identified both areas of strength and opportunities for growth within our programs. Students expressed that participation in activities makes school more enjoyable and helps them set personal goals. Parents highlighted satisfaction with our facilities and the off-season training programs offered at the high school. Additionally, our shared emphasis on sportsmanship was a consistent point of pride reflected in both surveys. These strengths affirm our continued focus in these areas.

The surveys also provided valuable insight into areas for improvement. Parents expressed a desire for expanded leadership opportunities, while students indicated a need for increased motivation and inspiration from coaches and sponsors. In response, we have already taken steps to address these needs by providing additional professional development for our coaches and launching the Pattonville Student Athlete Leadership Council (PSALC) to promote student leadership.

We will continue to review and monitor survey data throughout the school year, with the dual purpose of celebrating successes and identifying areas for further growth. This process will allow us to take intentional, actionable steps to continually enhance the student and parent experience in our programs.

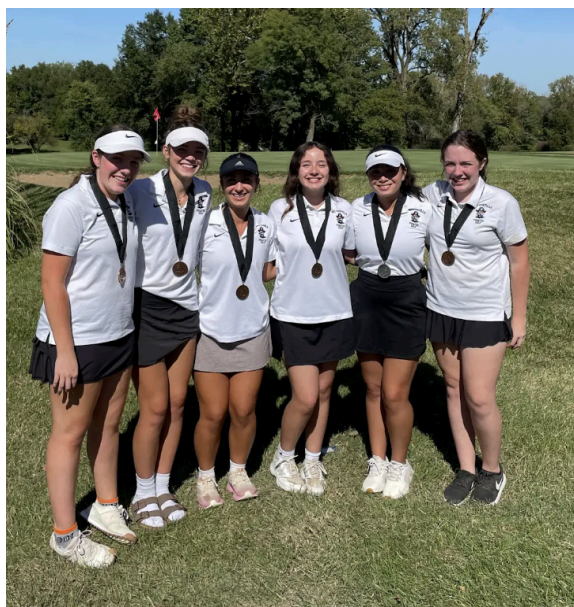

**2024-25 Season Summary:** The Pattonville High School Choirs continue their tradition of excellence, consistently earning top ratings at adjudicated and competitive events while using their voices to serve the community. Our repertoire spans cultures and languages from around the world, representing both modern and historical genres in folk and classical styles. Students develop vocal flexibility to perform in a variety of styles, while also building strong music literacy and ear training skills.

At the State Large Group Festival, our choirs received three Exemplary (1) ratings and one Outstanding (2) rating. Twenty-nine students were selected for the All-District Honor Choir, with six advancing to All-State Auditions. Of those, four students earned placement in the All-State Choir, and two qualified for the State Sight-Reading Bee, placing among the top twelve in Missouri.

At the District Solo and Ensemble Festival, students performed 39 events, earning 10 Exemplary (1) and 14 Outstanding (2) ratings. At the State Solo and Ensemble Festival, they received 4 Gold and 5 Silver ratings.

In addition to our regular choir concerts, we hosted and participated in a variety of special events throughout the year. Our annual Choral Fest brought together over 350 singers from 4th through 12th grade. We collaborated with the PHS Orchestra to perform modern masterworks, and participated in several school events including the International Day Show, Drill Team Variety Show, NHS Valentine Brunch, and the Veterans Day Assembly.

**2024-25 Season Summary:** The Pattonville Speech & Debate team made tremendous strides this year, rebuilding its reputation for excellence through both growth and competitive success. At the start of the season, the team had just six returning members—only two of whom had earned enough points to judge novice competitors. By the end of the year, 22 new students had joined and competed in multiple tournaments, with about a dozen others trying at least one. As we head into next season, we anticipate up to 25 returning members, including 12 eligible to judge—a dramatic increase in depth and leadership potential. This growth helped drive a strong competitive season, with students earning recognition in 14 different events, including 12 of the 15 offered by MSHSAA. Altogether, the team earned 54 awards and placements and was recognized in team sweepstakes at two tournaments, including 3rd Place in Debate Sweepstakes at the Tiger Talk Kickoff in Columbia and 5th Place at MSHSAA Class 2-1 Districts.

Eight entries qualified for MSHSAA State, represented by six different students—four sophomores, one junior, and one senior. Notably, senior Addison Gutschenritter qualified for the maximum four events, and junior Shota Kikuchi earned Academic All-American honors from the National Speech & Debate Association (NSDA). Three students advanced to the final day of the NSDA District Tournament, and the team more than doubled its NSDA strength, growing from 50 to 116 points over the course of the season. With a roster heavily weighted toward freshmen and sophomores who frequently placed in their divisions, the team’s future looks bright.

This year also marked the successful hosting of our own large tournament, drawing nearly 700 entries from 28 schools. While there were a few minor hiccups, the event was smoother and more productive than in years past—another sign of the program's revival. With strong leadership, a deep bench of returning competitors, and a promising novice class, Pattonville Speech & Debate is clearly on the rise and ready for an even stronger season ahead.

## **Pattonville High School MSHSAA Areas of Focus 2025-26**

**We have analyzed our past and current areas of focus and have narrowed them to five key areas that will guide us moving forward regarding athletics/ activities:**

### **Focus Area 1: Continued evaluation regarding the state of the current programming being offered to students**

- **Review all survey data with coaches and sponsors at the conclusion of each season**
  - During annual coaches' meetings, data taken from the end-of-season surveys along with summer camp survey data is reviewed including the areas of strength and areas of growth.
  - Utilize data to analyze, evaluate, and address trends in overall student after-school program participation.
- **Plan for potential facility improvements**
  - Generate ideas for improving aesthetics (graphics, banners, wall quotes, signs). Gather best practice models from other high school and college campuses.
  - Evaluate current facility needs and identify areas of immediate and future need.
  - Work with Business Services to proactively budget for future needs.
  - E-Sports facility upgrades.
  - Blackbox theater addition.
  - New stadium turf/ upper gymnasium scoreboard installation.

### **Focus Area 2: Coach/sponsor professional learning and growth**

- **Identify and implement opportunities for professional development**
  - Continue off-season head coaching/sponsor meetings to plan and prepare for the upcoming seasons. Take proactive measures in anticipating changes in programs.
  - Improve coaching mentor programs where experienced coaches/sponsors can impart knowledge to newer coaches/sponsors.
  - Actively seek avenues (fundraising, co-ops, grants) that will finance further PD.
- **Actively seek highly qualified coaching candidates and sponsors for upcoming vacancies (career fairs, college days, connections with peers)**
  - Through pre and post-season meetings with head coaches, we will be able to identify areas where we may need to fill vacancies in our programs.
  - Pattonville has plenty to offer new teachers, coaches, and sponsors and should continue to be a sought-after district for employment.
  - Partner with PSD Human Resources to gather potential candidates for identified vacancies.
- **Implementation of technology throughout all programs**
  - Pattonville is viewed throughout the area for being an innovator in technology and carrying that into our after-school programs is crucial in maintaining that reputation.
  - Continued district focus on technology implementation by encouraging coaches use of Bloomz,

YouTube, Gipper, Hudl, Neptune and social media platforms while emphasizing student data privacy.

- Incorporate practice reviews, and live streaming events for the community, and track stats by using our Hudl cameras and accounts.
- Encourage coaches to discover and share current and future tech advances that may benefit the program as a whole.

### **Focus Area 3: Improving student readiness for high school athletic/activities success**

- **Implementation of team community service projects. Explore and discover options.**
  - With community service being a requirement for graduation, we will actively seek out ways and encourage high school programs to get involved in the local community.
  - Pattonville School District is unique in having a single, large high school while maintaining a rich history and small community feel. Continuing this provides a great opportunity for our students to make a difference in areas outside of the school setting.
- **Continue to provide tutoring and academic support to students to improve academics (enhance core course GPA program)**
  - Head coaches/sponsors target academic goals to support student achievement during the season and off-season in their program playbook.

  - Collaborate with the community relations department regarding guidance on expanding our footprint online and with social media (Facebook, X, Instagram).
  - Continue to revise the athletics/activity's webpage and athletics/activities event page.
  - Expand 'signing day' experience to promote student athletes and programs.
- **Create a 'game day' environment that is safe and attracts a crowd**
  - Providing a safe, fun-filled, family friendly event will help us market our programs to our community and all Pattonville School District students.
  - Displaying high school programs in a fashion similar to higher education programs will increase student desire to stay in the district and participate when they enter high school.
  - Continue to work with MHPD and the community to engage in improved safety methods.
- **Generate revenue through advertising partnerships**
  - Actively seek advertising partners to create an ongoing generation of funds that can then be used to supplement athletics/activities program funding.
  - Collaborate with the community programs and community relations departments to identify potential community partnerships.
  - Use our current technology to promote our advertisers.
- **Provide offseason and summer opportunities for all**
  - Emphasize our summer programs and encourage coaches to develop summer program models that make camps appealing to the community.
  - Expanding and adjusting programming in response to student and community

input and need.

- **Seek input from parents and the community to inform programming and planning**
  - Use of Qualtrics data received from seasonal surveys completed by parents and students.
  - Continued use of preseason parent meetings that provide opportunities for parents to become familiar with program expectations.

#### **Focus Area 5: Promoting and showcasing student success in after-school programs**

- **Celebrate school history**
  - Bring back former students as speakers to tell their stories and share learned information
  - to help support the current student population.
  - Seek internships and extended learning opportunities for current students with former students in the business world.
  - Revamp our current methods of showcasing our school athletics and activities history and accomplishments at high school building.
  - Coordinate alumni tours during reunion activities.
- **Highlight our students in new and creative ways**
  - Continue to use social media to spotlight students and share news with the community
  - Improve layout of trophy case in main gym lobby, commons and other areas throughout the building.
  - Constant evaluation of Signing Day program seeking avenues to upgrade the student experience.

## **Title IX Compliance Report 2024-25**

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in education programs and activities by recipients of federal financial assistance. In particular, the regulations require institutions to “provide equal athletic opportunity for members of both sexes.” Title IX requires schools to:

1. Offer male and female students’ equal opportunities to play sports
2. Treat male and female athletes fairly
3. Male and female athletes are provided similar help in securing athletic scholarships for college

### **EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES TO PLAY SPORTS**

1. Percentages of participation compared to percentages of enrollment by gender:
  - a. For the 2024-25 school year, 46.4% of the female students participated in one or more MSHSAA programs. Male student participation in MSHSAA programming represented 47.1% of the male student population. That is a slight decrease of 3-4% over the previous year and is in line with neighboring districts in a trend most have seen over the past few years.
2. History and continuing practice of expanding athletic opportunities for female students:
  - a. Pattonville High School offers 12 male sports programs and 13 female sports programs. The programming being offered to both male and female students is in compliance with Title IX regulations.

### **EQUAL BENEFITS AND SERVICES**

1. Overall support:
  - a. Gate receipts are divided up in accordance with Policy IGDF-R with 50% going to the activities department to support operations such as paying for referees, purchasing equipment, tournament fees, and other costs associated with supporting athletics and activities. The remaining 50% is deposited into general fund revenues. All sports can host a banquet with the district providing the facility.
  - b. With recent changes in MSHSAA contest requirements, a greater emphasis is on total games played without tournament restrictions. This will have a zero-sum effect for our programs but will allow for more flexibility in scheduling for all programs.
2. Equipment and Supplies:
  - a. The district provides athletic equipment of similar quality and quantity for both female and male athletes.
  - b. Uniforms are of similar quality and quantity for male and female athletes and are paid for through the athletic department.
  - c. All sports uniforms (male and female) are on a replacement rotation. This rotation has had a recent evaluation in 2021 and minor adjustments have been made. All coaches, male and female, had input in the process.
3. Scheduling of Games and Practice Times:
  - a. Both male and females have an equal amount of suitable practice times.
  - b. The numbers of competitive events are equal and loss of academic time due to practices and games is limited as much as possible for both males and females.
  - c. Male and female MSHSAA teams have the opportunity for post-season and/or league championships. Teams can go to state or national competitions if they qualify. In 2024-25, we hosted conference/district events in boys and girls water polo and baseball. After last season's record-breaking hosting level, we were not allowed to host as many events, per conference/MSHSAA regulations.

4. Travel and Related Expenses:
  - a. The resources allocated for travel accommodations and meals for male and female teams when they travel are the same.
  - b. All male and female athletes are transported to games by bus except for boys' and girls' golf. The golf teams frequently utilize private vehicles to travel to practices and matches.
5. Availability of Coaches and Compensation:
  - a. Coaching PD is offered and available to all coaches.
  - b. The district provides the same quality coaches for male and female athletes and all are paid according to the district stipend policy.
  - c. Quality officials are provided for male and female teams along with support staff and office resources to handle paperwork, etc.
6. Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities:
  - a. Training spaces are evaluated prior to each season to meet the anticipated needs of each program. Each coach/sponsor has input in the implementation of the facility schedule.
  - b. All practice and competitive facilities (including locker rooms) are equally available and equally maintained for both male and female teams.
7. Medical and Training Services:
  - a. Weight training and conditioning facilities are equally available and have uniform quality for male and female athletes.
  - b. Medical personnel and an athletic trainer are provided equally for male and female athletes. We will continue to have a male and female ATC on staff. .
  - c. Insurance is equally available to male and female athletes.
  - d. Off season conditioning is equally available, with male and female coaches and trainers available for instruction.
8. Publicity:
  - a. Male and female sports are provided equitable school level media coverage.
  - b. School's publicity personnel are equally available to male and female teams.
  - c. Social media coverage is available to all and encouraged for each program.
  - d. Media covered Signing Days are open to everyone.
  - e. The cheerleaders, pep band and drill team are equally provided for male and female teams.

**Scholarship Opportunities:**

- In addition to the coaches, Pattonville High School has a college counselor that works with both male and female athletes to help them to secure scholarships for college.

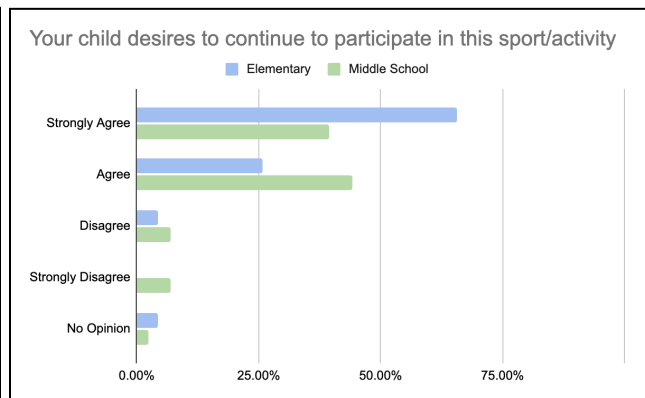
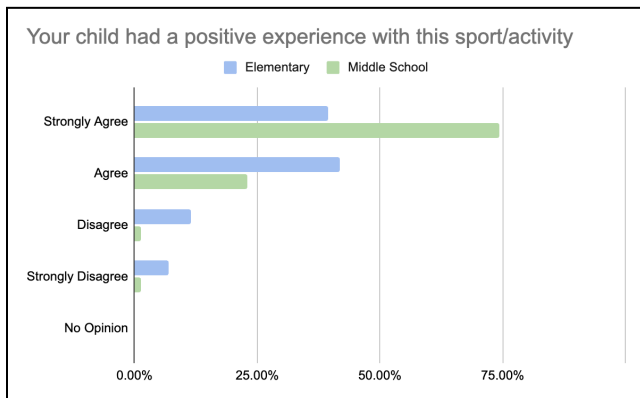
