

PART A – Base Level Funding

- 6. Future Farmers of America Constitution and By-Laws
 - Provide a copy of the current Chapter Constitution and Bylaws with the election of officers highlighted.
- 7. Future Farmers of America Meetings
 - Use meeting manager in AET or provide minutes for a minimum of six-chapter meetings.
- 8. Agriculture Advisory Committee
 - Provide meeting minutes for two Agriculture Advisory Committee meetings.

PART B – Additional Funding

LEA's may qualify for additional funding based on their ability to meet specific classroom, leadership, and experiential learning (SAE) criteria. It is not necessary for a program to meet all criteria in each category to be eligible to receive additional funding. Verification of meeting criteria will be taken from entries in the Agricultural Experience Tracker (AET). The AET report will be developed based on data as of June 30. Funding in each section will be based on the number of points accumulated in that section. This report will be used to complete Part B and will be included as part of the application.

Based on the 2022-23 Agricultural Education Incentive Grant Report, and points accumulated, the LEA may qualify for base level funding through the classroom section, leadership section, and experiential learning (SAE) section.

An LEA shall qualify for Part B funding in each section if they meet the predetermined base level. Bonus funding is earned if a program exceeds the predetermined base level by twenty percent (20%). LEA's meeting the base level shall receive \$2,250 plus \$250 per qualified teacher. LEA's meeting the bonus level shall receive an additional \$2,250 plus an additional \$250 per qualified teacher.

Note: An LEA may qualify for Level A, Level B, or no funding in each section but shall not qualify for both funding levels in a section. Example: The LEA qualifies for Level A funding in the Classroom Section, Level B in the Leadership Section and no funding in the SAE section.

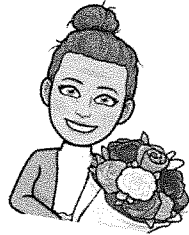
Course Description

This CTE, AG, UC VAPA approved course(P) is designed to allow students to apply an artistic approach to floral art. The course emphasizes the necessary knowledge and skills to provide the student with a perceptual base leading to understanding artistic perception, creative expression, historical and cultural context(s); aesthetic valuing and connections, relations, and applications of the visual arts through the use of flowers and other mediums. While also being rooted in the arts this course students will also be instructed in basic botany, and introductory horticultural practices. This course is multifaceted to educate the arts and careers in the floral industry. Students will connect and apply what is learned in floral art to develop employable skills in the floral industry. Lastly, students enrolled in this course are also members of the FFA program at SRHS.

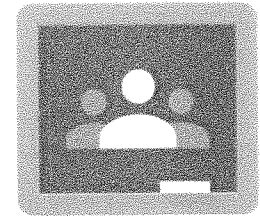
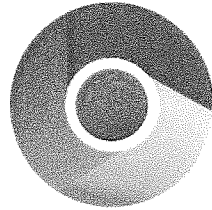
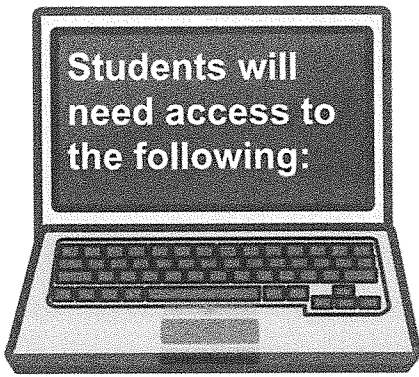
Cell Phone Policy

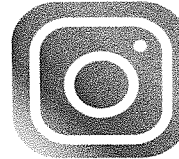
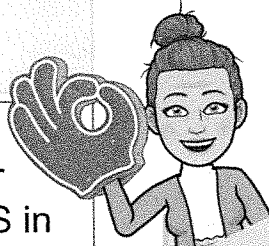

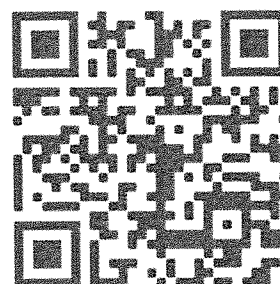

Constitution of Santa Rosa Chapter of F.F.A. California #3
Revised October 1, 2022

Article I – Name and Purposes

Section A. The name of this organization shall be the “Santa Rosa Chapter of Future Farmers of America”. Members are hereinafter referred to as “Future Farmers of America” and the letters “FFA”, may be used to designate the chapter, its activities, or members thereof.

Section B. The purposes for which this chapter is formed are as follows:

1. To develop competent, aggressive, rural, and agriculture leadership.
2. To create and nurture a love of agriculture
3. To strengthen the confidence of young men and women in themselves and in their work
4. To create more interest in intelligent choice of agricultural occupations.
5. To encourage members in development of individual agricultural programs and establishment in career technical education
6. To participate in worthy undertakings for the improvement of agriculture.
7. To develop character, train for good ethics, be a community servant and foster patriotism.
8. To participate in cooperative effort.
9. To encourage and practice thrift.
10. To encourage improvement in scholarship.
11. To provide and encourage the development of organized activities.

Article II – Organization

Section A. The Santa Rosa Chapter of Future Farmers of America is a chartered local unit of the California Association of Future Farmers of America which is chartered by the national organization of Future Farmers of America.

Section B. This Chapter accepts in full the provisions in the constitution and bylaws of the California State Association of Future Farmers of America as well as those of the national organization of Future Farmers of America.

Article III – Membership

Section A. Membership in this chapter shall be of three kinds (1) Active: (2) Associate: and (3) Honorary, as defined by the national FFA constitution.

Section B. The regular work of this Chapter shall be carried on by the active membership.

Section C. Active members in good standing may vote on all business brought before the chapter. An active member shall be considered in good standing when:

1. Member attends local chapter meetings with reasonable regularity
2. Members show an interest in, and take part in the affairs of the chapter
3. Member or site pays dues regularly or through a learning activity program sponsored by the Incentive Grant.

Section D. Names of applicants for membership shall be filed with the membership committee.

Article IV – Emblems

Section A. The emblem of the FFA shall be the emblem for the chapter

Section B. Emblems used by the members shall be uniform and those obtained from concerns officially designated by the national organization of FFA.

Article V – Membership Degrees and Privileges

Section A. There shall be four grades of active membership in this chapter. These grades are: (1) the Green Hand Degree, (2) the Chapter Degree, (3) the State Degree, and (4) the American Degree.

All “Green Hands” are entitled to wear the regulation bronze pin. All members holding the Degree of Chapter Farmer are entitled to wear the silver emblem degree pin. All members holding the State Farmer Degree are entitled to wear the regulation gold emblem charm. All members holding the American Farmer Degree are entitled to wear the regulation good emblem key.

Section B. Green Hand Degree. Minimum qualifications for election:

1. Be regularly enrolled in a class in agriculture, a member of the Career Education Department at SRHS and have satisfactory and acceptable plans for a program of supervised farming.
2. Be familiar with the purposes of the FFA and the program of work of the local chapter.
3. Recite from memory the Creed of the Future Farmers of America.

Section C. Chapter Farmer Degree. Minimum Qualifications for election:

1. Must have held the degree of Green Hand for at least one year immediately preceding election to the Degree of Chapter Farmer and have a record of satisfactory participation in activities of the local chapter.
2. Must have satisfactorily completed at least one year of instruction in agriculture, have in operation an improved supervised agricultural experience program, and be regularly enrolled in an agriculture class.

3. Be familiar with the purposes and programs of work of the state association and national organization
4. Be familiar with the provisions of the constitution of the local chapter.
5. Be familiar with parliamentary procedure.
6. Be able to lead a group discussion for fifteen minutes
7. Must have earned by his own efforts from his supervised farming program and deposited in a bank or otherwise productively invested at least \$150.00 or 100 hours

Section D. State Farmer Degree. Minimum qualifications for election:

1. Qualifications for the State Farmer Degree are those set forth in the constitution of the State Association.

Section E. American Farmer Degree. Minimum Qualification for election:

1. Qualifications for the American Farmer Degree are those set forth in the constitution of the National Association of Future Farmers of America

Article VI – Officers

Section A. The Primary officers of the chapter shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter, Sentinel and Advisor. The Advisor shall be a teacher of career technical agriculture in the school where the chapter is located. Additional officers may be added to carry out the chapter program of work. These offices may include Historian, Greenhand liaison and Committee Chairs as designated in the the National FFA committee organization. Those additional office positions may be voted in or appointed by the FFA advisor.

Section B. Officers shall be elected annually after completing an application, submitting a video and by member vote. A total of the score collected with elect the officer team.

Section C. Honorary members shall not vote nor shall they hold any officer in the chapter except that of advisor

Section D. Chapter officers must hold the Degree of at least Greenhad, with the expectation they would earn a Chapter degree in the year they hold office.

Section F. Officers must maintain a “C” average in accordance with school district policy.

Article VII – Meetings

Section A. Regular chapter meetings shall be held once a month during the school year. Special meetings may be called at any time.

Section B. Two delegates shall be elected annually from the active membership to represent the chapter at the State Convention. Other delegates may be named as necessary in order to have a proper representation at various other FFA meetings within the State.

Article VIII – Dues

Article A. Local dues in this chapter shall be fixed annually by a majority vote of the active members

Section B. Full local, state and national dues shall be paid by all active members or through the learning activity packet program.

Section C. No members shall be considered as active and in good standing unless he pays full local, state and national FFA dues

Article IX – Amendments

Section A. This constitution may be amended or changed at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the active members present providing it is not in conflict with the State Association constitution or that of the national organization of FFA.

Section B. Bylaws may be adopted to fit the needs of the chapter at any regular chapter meeting by a two-thirds vote of the active members present providing such bylaws conflict in no way with the constitution and bylaws of either State Association or the national organization.

BY-LAWS

Article I. Chapter Officers

Sec. A. Elections as prescribed in the Constitution under Article X.

Sec. B. Duties and Responsibilities

1. President
 - a. It shall be the duty of the President to preside over all meetings of the Santa Rosa FFA; over all executive meetings.
 - b. The President shall appoint all special committees and may serve as an ex-officio member of these committees.
2. Vice-President shall assume all duties of the President in event that the office becomes vacant. He shall preside over all meetings in the absence of the President and shall assume other duties of the President as are assigned by the Chapter Advisor
3. Secretary shall perform duties common to such an office as keeping accurate records in the minutes of the chapter
4. Treasurer shall collect dues and head the finance committee in program of work
5. Reporter. The duty of the Reporter shall be to publicize any and all events of the chapter in local papers, radio, etc., and State FFA Magazine. The Reporter shall also help put up displays on the FFA
6. Sentinel. The duty of sentinel shall be to greet guests, seat delegates, arrange material, displays of the FFA and assist the President

Article II. Committees

Sec. A. There shall be an executive Committee consisting of the current elected chapter officers and advisor.

The duties of the Executive Committee shall be to interview all prospective officers, delegates and set up meetings for the chapter.

Sec. B. The Executive Committee shall have a voice in the disciplinary actions of an officer or member

Only a 2/3 majority vote of the executive Committee with the Advisor consenting, can an officer be removed from office

Sec. C. The Executive Committee shall, with the Advisor present, make up the annual program of work and committees, therein.

Sec. D. The Acting Chairman may upon his discretion appoint committees as necessary.

Article III. Activities

Sec. A. All activities must be cleared by the school administration.

Sec. B. All rules and regulations at any judging contest or other FFA function shall be as provisions in State FFA Constitution and By-Laws.

 - Only need one physical science - many students choose not to take advanced science

Review Elements of a Highly Effective Program

- Focus on industry relationships, work based learning, and internships
- Request that Advisory provide input to improve areas with an “emerging practice” score - overall scored as a quality program, but acknowledge room for growth
- Teachers identified counseling issues and lack of support for students in CTE and agriculture classes
 - Need to work towards building better relationships and showcasing the benefits of the program
 - CTE Counselor would meet many of these needs

- ▣ CTE Department is more populated than ArtQuest and there is an ArtQuest Counselor
- Major support needed my Advisory to advocate for CTE Counselor
- There are no CTE Counseling positions in the district, but there is a College and Career counselor at each site
- Request was made by Advisory Committee to invite all Administrators
 - Dr. Clissold and Mr. Weber were invited, but not in attendance

Program Review - Fall 2023

- In-Person Program review is happening with the Department of Education in the Fall
- Advisory will be invited to lunch with the Regional Supervisor during the review
 - Advisory requested an email with the date and time as soon as it is planned

New Course Discussion - Ag Systems Management

- Proposal for project driven capstone class with practical application
 - No action needed tonight, but will revisit for approval in the Fall
- Addition of this class will allow Agriscience Pathway to be articulated with SRJC
 - Need 3 years of ag science and a 50 hour agriscience project
 - Earth Science does not meet any of the standards that need to be covered for articulation
- Majority of schools in this region offer this course
 - St. Helena, Healdsburg, and Eureka will be models for this course
