<p>Title I, Part A</p> <p>Improving Academic Achievement/Basic Programs</p>	<p>Title I, Part A federal funds help to meet the educational needs of students in California schools. Funds are used to support effective, evidence-based educational strategies that close the achievement gap and enable students to meet the state's challenging academic standards.</p> <p><i>From the California Department of Education: Title I, Part A</i></p>	<p>Elementary District Preliminary Allocation: \$991,846</p> <p>Secondary District Preliminary Allocation: \$1,787,229</p>
<p>Title II, Part A</p> <p>Supporting Effective Instruction (SEI)</p>	<p>The purpose of Title II, Part A is to increase the academic achievement of all students by helping schools and districts: (1) improve teacher and principal quality through professional development and other activities, and (2) providing low-income and minority students greater access to effective teachers, principals, and other school leaders.</p> <p><i>From the California Department of Education: Title II, Part A</i></p>	<p>Elementary District Preliminary Allocation: \$144,950</p> <p>Secondary District Preliminary Allocation: \$329,743</p>
<p>Title III</p> <p>English Learner Student Subgrant</p>	<p>Funding is made available to eligible local educational agencies (LEAs) to provide supplementary programs and services to English learner (EL) students. The purpose of the subgrants is to assist EL students to acquire English and meet grade-level achievement and graduation goals.</p> <p><i>From the California Department of</i></p>	<p>Elementary District Preliminary Allocation: \$229,494</p> <p>Secondary District Preliminary Allocation: \$172,275</p>

<p>Title III, Part A</p> <p>Immigrant Student Education Subgrant</p>	<p>Title III Immigrant Student Education Program funds are to be specifically targeted to eligible immigrant students and their families through the provision of supplementary programs and services for the underlying purpose of assuring that these students meet the same challenging grade level and graduation standards as mainstream students through enhanced instructional opportunities.</p> <p><i>From the California Department of Education, Title III, Part A</i></p>	<p>Elementary District Preliminary Allocation: \$34,694</p> <p>Secondary District Preliminary Allocation: \$37,576</p>
<p>Title IV, Part A</p> <p>Student Support and Academic Enrichment (SSAE)</p>	<p>The purpose of Title IV, Part A funds is to improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of states, local educational agencies (LEAs), schools, and local communities to (1) provide all students with access to a well-rounded education, (2) improve school conditions for student learning, and (3) improve the use of technology in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students.</p> <p><i>From the California Department of Education, Title IV, Part A</i></p>	<p>Elementary District Preliminary Allocation: \$89,873</p> <p>Secondary District Preliminary Allocation: \$129,484</p>
