District Office staff will ensure that contractors are qualified/vetted prior to proposal and bid submissions. To date, 87 contractors (for projects over \$1M) and roughly 80 contractors (for projects under \$200K- CUPCCAA) are on the District's Qualified Contractors Lists.
