

PROP 28



Background

In November 2022, California voters passed Proposition 28, the Arts and Music In Schools (AMS) Act, which will provide ongoing annual funding for arts education. In the first year, the 2023/24 school year, California public schools will receive \$938 million for the arts.

Prop 28 AMS is an opportunity for schools and districts to invest in arts education to help all students succeed in school.

Site administrators will work with site staff, gather student and community input to effectively develop a plan for Prop 28 that builds upon sites current art programs in the areas of dance, media arts, music, theatre, and visual arts in every school and grade level.



Building A Plan



Input	Gather feedback from students, staff, community
Current Program	What does arts education look like at your site? Which arts disciplines are being offered?
Planning	What is currently missing in our arts education offerings? What did the input tell us?
Funding	80/20 Rule <ul style="list-style-type: none">● 80% staff working directly with students (teachers, aides)● 20% materials and supplies (instruments, paint, contracts, etc.)
Allocations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Yearly Allocations● You have 3 years to spend current allocations
Remember	New classes are on top of what is currently being offered. We cannot supplant current programs.

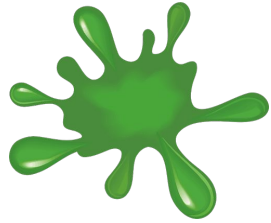

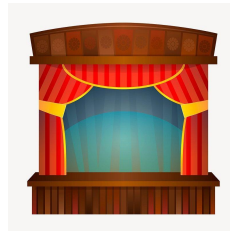
