Explore Learning offers two important apps for students to build on their math success. The first is Reflex, which is a gamified math fact fluency app. Students play games that lead to addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division fact fluency. The second is Frax, which is also gamified. Students play games that develop conceptual understanding of fractions. They explore what fractions really represent, and what is actually happening when we do operations with fractions. This year Frax came out with a "Sector 2" more advanced level and the students were so excited to have more of the "game" to play.			This program is an incentive program for learning addition/subtraction facts 0-10 and multiplication facts 0-12 and can be used by grades 2-6. There is also a great fraction component that focuses on conceptual understanding of fractions. It is called Frax. The company has developed a second sector to Frax which should take the fraction skills a step further. I would be happy to contact Celina at Frax and see if she can offer a zoom workshop for teachers who may not be aware of how to use the program. The reflex portion of the website is very motivating and it tracks data for teachers (fluency reports/histogram for the class, ability to customize what your students work on and goal-setting (green light usage). The kids are pretty motivated by the way it is set up. Even ten minutes a day can really enhance fact fluency.			Expected increase in math assessment scores via local and state assessments.

Paws for Healing was founded in 1998 and now has over 200 active teams visiting over 160 facilities. These include hospitals, mental health facilities, special education classes, adult day care centers, cancer units, hospice and cancer support groups, rehabilitation units, and assisted living facilities. Paws For Reading volunteer teams visit both libraries and school settings.</p>			<p>Paws for Healing provides a Paws For Reading literacy program for Solano, Napa, and Sonoma that called Paws for Reading. Reading teams go to libraries, school classrooms and after-school programs where children read to a canine "Reading Buddy." The goal is to provide a non-judgmental atmosphere in which kids can read without correction or interruption and learn not just to read, but to love reading as well. Additionally, the Read program creates a supportive environment for children so that they may read without correction or interruption.</p> <p>The purpose of Paws for Reading is to make reading an enjoyable experience and to enhance children's literacy skills through reading buddies, one-on-one attention, opportunity and bonus programs.
