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This partnership supports the Chief Turnaround Office's strategic support structure as identified in the First Priority Act (HB338). The partnership with No Kid Hungry/ Share Our Strength (NKH/SOS) provides:

1. A systematic approach to execute individual health assessments, - with the goal of coordinating available community and state resources to support the identified school(s)
2. Funding to hire a Health and Wellness Coordinator to oversee individual health assessments
3. Technical assistance to remove barriers to strengthen school breakfast and afterschool meal programs.

Summary of Scope of Work



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- Provide a Health and Wellness Coordinator with a Bachelor's degree and at least 5-7 years minimum experience in school setting, specifically nutrition programs or nursing.
- Facilitate coordinated student health and wellness efforts for all network students aligned to identified seven health barriers (asthma, hearing, vision, oral, mental/behavioral health, nutrition and language communication)
- Address issues related to the implementation of school breakfast, including customizing the delivery model, developing implementation plans, developing and implementing plans for engaging school stakeholders, and assistance with applying for grant funding.

Summary of Scope of Work



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- Assist with coordination and facilitation of community education training.
- Identify and recruit afterschool programs and summer meals sites in target districts to provide technical assistance.
- Identify local sponsors for community-based programs (when applicable: with school non-academic support staff).
- Provide technical assistance to schools to develop nutrition improvement plan with a focus on strengthening school breakfast or afterschool meal programs.
