## 2019-20 Cohort Graduation Rate Executive Summary

## Background Information

The rules for calculating the cohort graduation rate meet the requirements of the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The cohort graduation rate is defined as the percentage of students in the adjusted cohort who graduate within four years with a regular high school diploma. To generate the 2019-20 cohort, first-time $9^{\text {th }}$ graders were identified in 2016-17. The cohort was then adjusted by adding any students who transferred into the cohort after $9^{\text {th }}$ grade and subtracting any students who transferred out, migrated to another county, transferred to a prison or juvenile facility, or are deceased.

The disaggregated cohort graduation rate results are presented online on the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction website. The results are available by individual school and school district. There are also links to supplementary documents that explain the calculations used for the four-year and five-year cohort graduation rates and a longitudinal cohort graduation rate spreadsheet is available for the 2005-06 to 2019-20 school years.
