# The Law G.s.115c-419 as amended by SL2021-180 Sect. 7.17(a) 

The State Board of Education shall establish a formula for determining the full-time equivalency (FTE) of a student enrolled in a public school unit of the State for the purposes of providing State funds on a per pupil basis.

The formula shall include the amount of instructional time required for a school day for a full-time student.

## Current Student Accounting

## Average Daily Membership

The sum of the number of days in membership for all non-violating students in individual PSU, divided by the numbers of days in the school month.

A student is in membership for one day if they are scheduled for at least half the instructional day.

A student scheduled for less than one half of the instructional day is not included in membership.

## FTE Formula

## Formula Basics

- Authoritative data source
- Denominator
- Numerator
- Based on Instructional Time
- Point(s) in Time
- By Student/Grade
- By Course (to meet reporting requirements)
- Must be consistent from year to year and be calculated in a timely basis


## Authoritative Data Source

The authoritative source will be the Student Information System (SIS) which is currently on the PowerSchool platform.

## Denominator 300 Minutes

Grounded to the general statute governing school calendar requiring a minimum of 185 days OR 1,025 instructional hours

1,025 hours divided by 185 days $=5.5$ hours

Given variances of schools and to allow flexibility for student needs recommend 5 hours

5 hours = 300 minutes for the denominator

## Numerator: Scheduled Instructional Time

Includes all time a student is receiving instruction. Does not include other supervised time such as:

- Changing classes, homeroom, lunch, pep rallies, and school dances ${ }^{(1) \text {. }}$
- This is consistent with the current average daily membership and consistent with the recommendation for the denominator


## Recommended Point in Time

- Recommend October $1^{\text {st }}$ and April $1^{\text {st }}$
- Allows time for the schedules to be finalized for each semester
- Aligns with other headcount data for special populations


## Formula Summary

FTE =
Total Student Instructional Minutes divided by 300 minutes

1 FTE $=300$ student instructional minutes

Individual student may not exceed 1.0 FTE
