


Educational Purpose

North Carolina Final Exam (NCFE) Waiver Request Addendum

Wake County's experience with the NC Final Exams has raised concerns regarding logistics, lost instructional time, and alignment/validity issues. Lost instructional time for administration of NC Final Exams has been significant, particularly for high schools due to procedural requirements and how meeting those testing requirements from the state impacts scheduling and instructional time at the end of each semester. Over the past two years, teachers and principals have also reported a lack of comfort around the absence of performance standards on NCFE exams, the over-reliance on multiple-choice test questions on those tests, as well as significant concerns regarding the alignment to the curriculum. Teachers have also reported frustration with the inability of those assessments to accurately reflect the depth and breadth of the standards that they are teaching, and have suggested that teacher-made exams would be a more authentic reflection of their students' overall student performance against the standards.

Given these concerns, Wake County and Wake NCAE recently surveyed high school principals and over 250 high school teachers regarding their desire to keep or opt out from the NC Final Exams. Over 80% of both groups stated that they would prefer to opt out and return to administering final exams that are created in their Professional Learning Teams. Concerns expressed by educators were related mainly to the potential loss of a consistent, objective, across-school indicator of student achievement growth for Standard 6 in those courses. However, the number of educators expressing those concerns was very small compared to the large majority of respondents who indicated that they would prefer to opt out.

After the initial survey, Wake NCAE gathered additional input from teachers to ensure that the evaluative consequence of the NCFE waiver—i.e. the use of school-wide data for the determination of teachers' Standard 6 scores—was completely understood. The vast majority of teacher respondents reassured Wake NCAE that this was clear to them and did not change their desire for the district to pursue the waiver. There were a small number of respondents who, in light of the clarification, expressed a desire to use data drawn from exams given in their subjects to their own students even if they agreed that the NCFEs were incomplete measures of the work done by their students. Those expressing this concern were few in number, however. As with the initial survey, approximately 80% of respondents were comfortable with the move back to the use of school-wide data Standard 6 scores, again reinforcing that this is the preferred solution for the district. The district will continue to work with Wake NCAE and school principals to ensure that communication around this waiver remains robust throughout the entire process.
