WCS – Grant – FY24 School-Based Health Center (SBHC) Renovation Grant - Clarke

Recommendation – Action Item

It is recommended that the State Board of Education authorize the State School Superintendent to award a grant to Clarke County Schools at a cost not to exceed \$616,000 in Federal Funds for the renovation and infrastructure of new school-based health centers (SBHC) at Coile Middle School and Classic City High School.

Supports the Following Education Goal or Goals in the Agency Strategic Plan

- Foster a safe, healthy, and positive learning climate in every school.
- Expand educational opportunities and non-academics supports in order to maximize student engagement, meet student needs/interests, and ensure the relevance of learning.

Rationale

This grant will provide renovation and infrastructure funds at \$308,000 each for the SBHCs at Coile Middle School and Classic City High School in Clarke County. The planning team in Clarke County has identified space, a medical sponsor, and secured community support, therefore is ready to begin renovation of these new centers ahead of schedule. Clarke County received two Round 1 SBHC planning grants in June 2023 (\$10,000 each).

Performance

Describe how the grant will be monitored to ensure satisfactory performance: Office of Whole Child Supports staff will continue to perform routine check-ins with Clarke County's planning team throughout the course of the grant period to monitor progress. Budgets and spending will be monitored via the Consolidated Application.

Performance, criteria, and results: Satisfactory performance will be determined by whether the SBHCs are operational from a construction, safety, and facilities standpoint by the end of the grant period.

Performance Metrics: The primary measure of success for this grant will be two fully operational SBHCs.

Summary

Scope of Grant:

Funds will be used to support the build-out of two standalone SBHCs on school grounds. For Coile Middle, the district plans to purchase a modular unit to house the center. For Classic City High, the district has identified a space to renovate within the school building.

Purpose of Grant:

To provide funds that contribute to the establishment of a SBHC that provides comprehensive, primary healthcare to students at Coile Middle School and Classic City High School in Clarke County.

Describe the grant process:

The SBHC planning team in Clarke County has met the primary objectives to move forward in the development of their SBHC. They were awarded \$20,000 for planning in June 2023, and are ready to move forward with phase 2 of the grant, which includes \$308,000 each to Coile Middle and Classic City High for renovation/infrastructure. This is a pre-established amount for renovation funds using the Governor's Office SBHC grant received by GaDOE in Fall 2022.
