Transportation Plan

- 1. Enter description of transportation services offered to pupils, and how it will prioritize planned transportation services for pupils in transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and any of grades 1 - 6 inclusive and pupils who are low income. Plan may provide for the LEA to partner with municipally owned transit system to provide services to middle and high school students. An LEA may provide no-cost transit passes to students.**

The District runs neighborhood elementary schools for grades TK-5. Most students walk to their neighborhood school. The District will offer AC Transit bus passes to TK-5 grade students and their guardians who qualify for free or reduced priced meals and do not attend their neighborhood school.

For students in grades 6-12, the District will work with AC Transit's no-cost Student Transit Pass Program (STPP). The STPP provides free youth Clipper cards to eligible middle and high school students in Alameda County which can be used for unlimited free bus rides in their area (on AC Transit, Union City Transit or LAVTA Wheels), as well as a 50 percent discount on BART trips and youth discounts on other transit systems. The STPP is undergoing a phased expansion to all middle and high schools in Alameda County with bus service over the next two years. The expansion phasing seeks to balance geographic equity across planning areas in the county. This program is currently not available directly to Piedmont students through AC Transit, however, in the meantime, the District will purchase passes for eligible students.

- 2. Enter description of LEA's transportation services that would be accessible to pupils with disabilities, and homeless children and youth.**

The District offers transportation to students with disabilities as required by their Individualized Education Plan (IEP). The principal means of transportation for students with this service in their IEPs is through small vehicle or bus ridership provided by the District's contracted transportation providers. Other transportation options include mileage reimbursement for parents that choose to transport their students, and AC Transit bus passes for older students.

The District offers free AC Transit bus passes to students who are unhoused.

3. Enter description of how unduplicated pupils, would be able to access available home-to-school transportation at no-cost to the pupils.

The District will offer AC Transit bus passes to all students who qualify for free or reduced priced meals and do not attend their neighborhood school. All students qualifying as "unduplicated" will be notified of available resources via the annual registration process.

4. Enter description of the required plan consultation with classified staff, teachers, school administrators, regional local transit authorities, local air pollution control districts and air quality management districts, parents, pupils and other stakeholders.

The District consulted with school district administrators during a Cabinet meeting, and with site administrators, staff and families via the weekly school site bulletins. A survey will be sent to eligible families in advance of 2023-24 school year.

The District consulted with the Bay Area Air Quality Management District through their webpage (<https://www.baaqmd.gov/plans-and-climate/climate-protection/local-government-support/school-district-transportation-service-plans>) and AC Transit through the Alameda County Office of Education.
