
Sonoma County Case Information: Then 1-12-22



Voluntary "Pool" Testing Updates

Currently, 5592 signed up for Weekly Pool testing

Last week, 2/7-2/11, we administered 4,992 tests

Last Week it was determined that 14 were found positive

Based on Community Case Rates will recommend reducing to twice Monthly testing effective: March 28th

- Voluntary Asymptomatic PCR Testing remains at Lewis Early Learning Academy
 Mon Thursday 2:30 5 pm
- Rapid Sonoma County Symptomatic / Asymptomatic Testing open to Public Monday & Friday 8:30 am - 3:30 pm

Substantive CAL/OSHA Changes

- Employee Booster Requirement
 - Test twice weekly
 - February 1 date moved to March 1:
- Employee Weekly "Self-Testing" Testing
 - (6) "COVID-19 test" means a test for SARS-CoV-2 that is:

((C) Not both self-administered and self-read unless observed by the employer or an authorized telehealth proctor. Examples of tests that satisfy this requirement include tests with specimens that are processed by a laboratory (including home or on-site collected specimens which are processed either individually or as pooled specimens), proctored over-the-counter tests, point of care tests, and tests where specimen collection and processing is either done or observed by an employer.

New Mask Clarifications

• For example, face coverings may be tightly woven fabric or non-woven material of <u>at least two layers</u>, but such masks should not let light pass through when held up to a light source. Gaiters now may be worn, but must have two layers of fabric or be folded to make two layers. A <u>face covering must completely cover the nose and mouth</u> and be secured to the head, cannot have any slits or holes, and must fit snugly.



SRCS Response to "Surge" Appendix A: "Substantial Tier"

Effective 2/24

- Remove Daily health screener through Parent Square for students and employees
- Remove Temperature taking for Indoor sports events
- Allow Indoor Event capacity per guidelines (Under 1,000)
- Allow In-person meetings that maintain other precautions e.g. Masking, Ventilation,
 Spacing when possible

In conjunction with lower COVID-19 Community Rates effective March 28th begin twice monthly voluntary student "pool" testing.
