


## **Primary Reason for Leaving**




## **Primary Reason for Leaving**










#### Student Mobility for James Monroe Elementary School

#### Home School Ethnicity





# What is Special Education?

Special education is specially designed instruction that addresses the unique needs of a student eligible to receive special education services. Special education is provided at no cost to parents and includes the related services a student needs to access her/his educational program.

## Individuals With Disabilities Act (IDEA) (2004)

Early Stages (ages 0-2): Early Intervention Services includes the family

- Physical
- Speech
- Setting in the Home or Pre-school

**School Age (ages 3-21):** Qualifying students are served a variety of services through an Individualized Education Program (IEP) in the Least Restrictive Environment




#### Percentage of Students identified Special Ed. "SRCS Elem, High




7 Year Comparison Percent of SWD Local & County










#### **SWD Percentages For Feeder Districts to High District**









## Elementary: SWD Home Schools VS. SWD served at their school




# Secondary: SWD Home Schools vs. SWD served at their school Home School Includes NPS & SCOE Placed Students




## **Students Served By SCOE**





## **Graduation Rate Data**

**Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate:** The number of students who graduate from high school in four years with a regular high school diploma divided by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the graduating class. The four-year cohort is based on the number of students who enter grade 9 for the first time adjusted by adding into the cohort any student who transfers in later during grade 9 or during the next three years and subtracting any student from the cohort who transfers out.


**Still Enrolled:** Those cohort students who did not graduate or complete high school by the end of the cohort outcome period who meet one of the following criteria:

- Are re-enrolled as a "fifth year senior" after the end of the cohort period and no later than mid-September of the subsequent academic year.
- Graduated from or otherwise completed high school after the end of the cohort outcome period and no later than mid-September of the subsequent academic year.


**Dropouts:** Those cohort students who (1) do not graduate with a regular high school diploma, (2) do not otherwise complete high school, or (3) are not still enrolled as a "fifth year senior" are considered dropouts.


