

FALL 2021 ENROLLMENT EXPECTATIONS




Key Assumptions:

- 1. DeKalb school-age population did not drop significantly.
- 2. Some, but not all, of the enrollment drop will return Fall 2021.



FALL 2021 ENROLLMENT




What happened?


- 1. Kindergarten was slightly higher than 2020, but other cohorts did not return to precovid levels.
- 2. Enrollment did not recover and only increased by 29 students
- 3. Elementary enrollment was well below expectation, middle and high enrollment was at or above expectation.



A lower enrollment rate is here to stay for next year.



- 1. Elementary enrollment is expected decrease slightly with a larger incoming kindergarten but also a larger cohort graduating to middle school.
- Middle-school enrollment is expected to decrease slightly.
- 3. High-school enrollment is expected to increase slightly.



KEY TAKEAWAYS

- ✓ The enrollment forecast is an important component of budgeting and planning for the next school year.
- ✓ The District's enrollment forecast is based on a robust population forecasting model that has taken into account the enrollment impact of COVID 19.
- ✓ With fewer new and former students enrolling in DCSD, enrollment did not rebound closer to pre-COVID 19 levels as expected.
- ✓ At least for next year, enrollment district-wide is expected to remain at about the same level.
- ✓ The DCSD enrollment forecast for FY23 is 93,700 students, or about the same as FY22 enrollment.
