II. Official CCRPI Report Card

Erik Cioffi

- a. Presentation - Discussion - about Literacy Indicators and school's focus on Literacy, SAT scores, and CCRPI.
- b. Score and Rank - This year our CCRPI score is 84.1. It is the third highest in our region. Content mastery score is 77.9. Math scores were good. Science scores were not as good as hoped. Changes are being made in an effort to improve science scores. The Progress score measures how much growth students demonstrate in ELA and math. Our score is 91.7. Closing the Gaps - expectation that all students and all subgroups make improvements in achievement rates. Our score is 69.4. The Readiness score is 81.3. Our graduation rate is 94.31 for last year.
- c. Climate Survey - We received 5 stars. This is based on survey results from students, parents, and staff. There are only 2 high schools that received 5 stars in our Pioneer RESA.

III. Facility Reports

- a. Parking lot - The School Board approved the finishing of the CLC parking lot.
- b. Traffic pattern – parent/student concerns
There is a lot of parent pick-up traffic in the student parking lots. We plan to add additional spots and reroute parent pick-up. The belief is that it will be safer for our students and timelier for everyone. Once additional parking spaces are completed, the rerouting of parent pick-up will take place.
