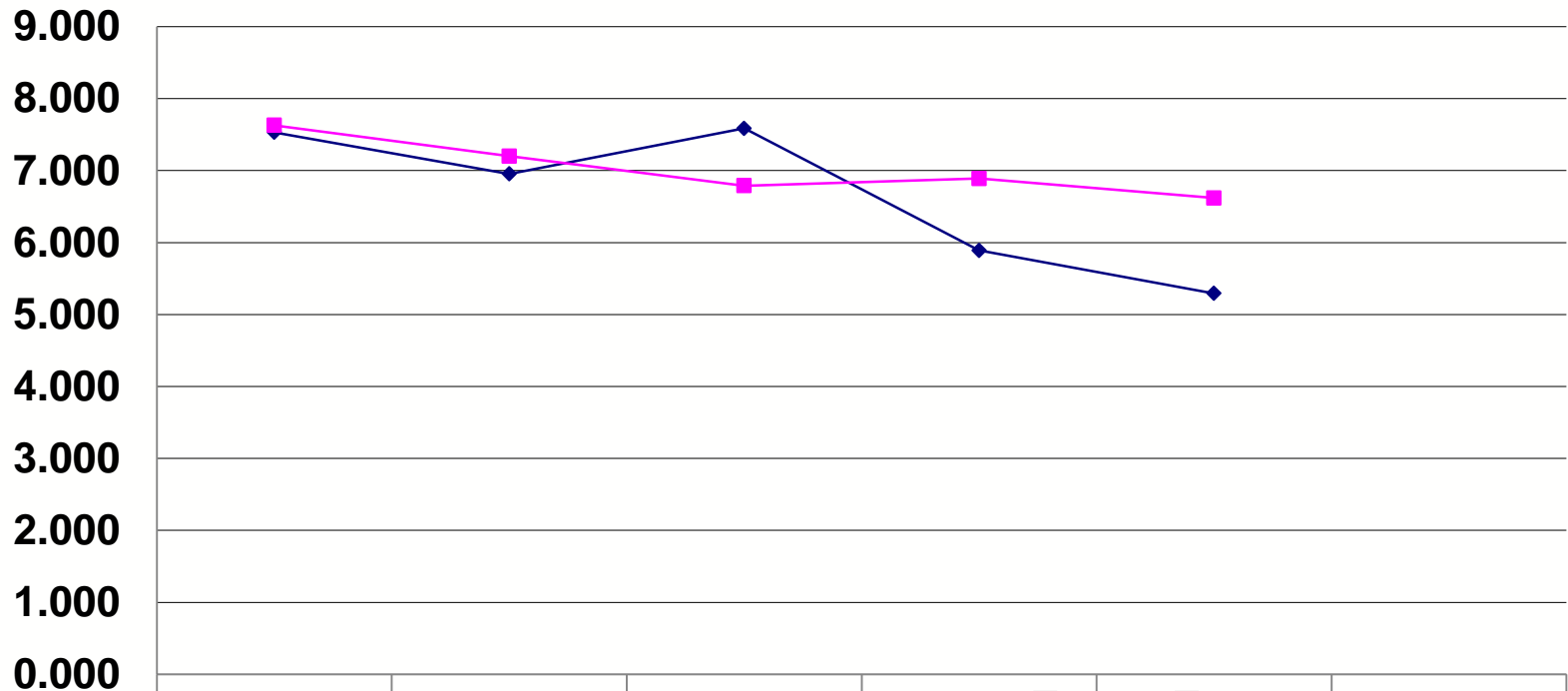
2015 – 2016 NCDPI Annual Report on School Crime and Violence

Student Achievement Meeting
3/13/2017

- Each year all incidents involving 16 criminal offenses are required to be reported to NCDPI.
- The largest number of offenses for 2015-2016 were possession of controlled substances and possession of a weapon.

- For the state in 2015 – 2016, the number of reportable offenses decreased by 3.2% and the rate of incidents per 1000 students dropped by 3.9%.
- For Wake County in 2015-2016, the number of reportable crimes decreased by 8.3% and the rate of incidents per 1000 students dropped by 10.14%.

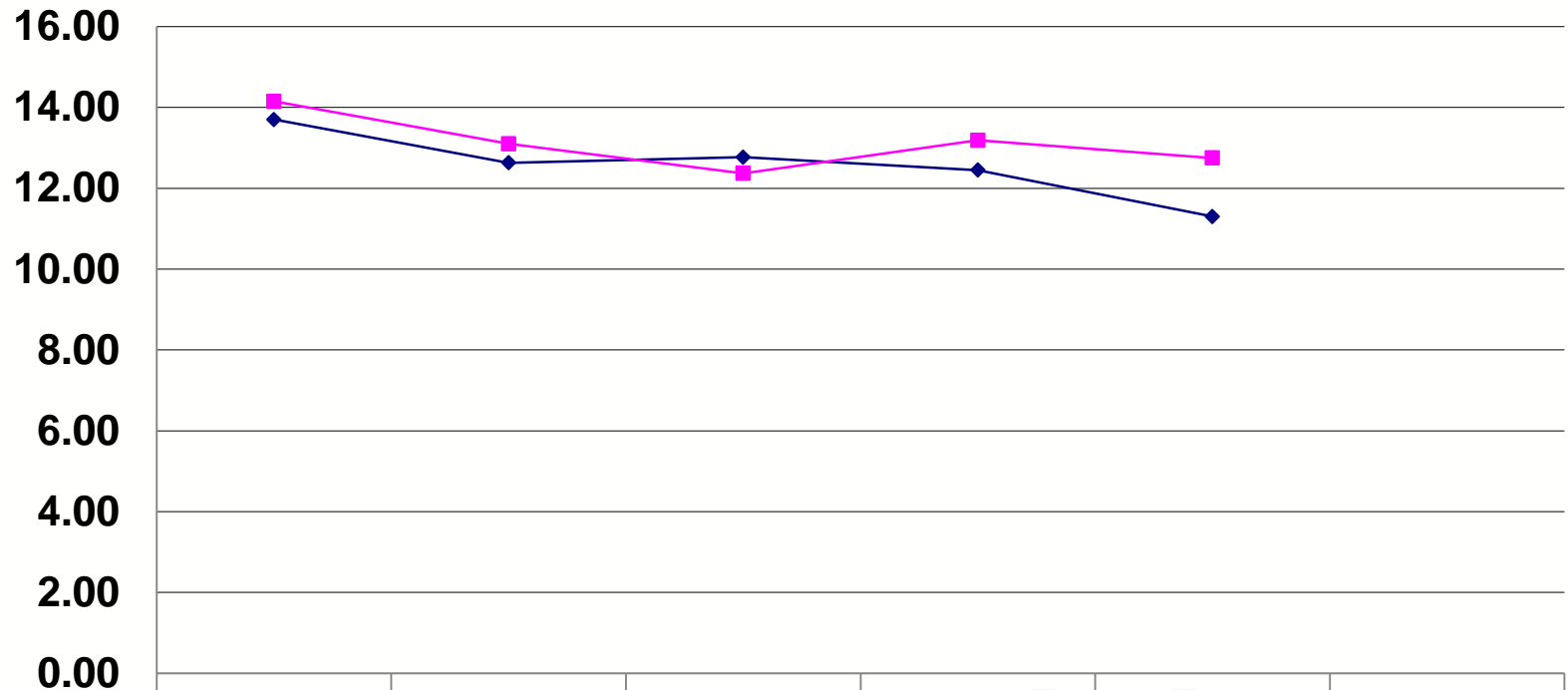
