
As we celebrated the 100th day of school in the 2016-2017 school year, principals were asked to reflect upon the "One Hundred Things We Love About Our School."






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

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Certificated Staff (Teachers, Counselors, Media Specialists, etc.) and Para Professionals,

We are currently accepting <u>TRANSFER applications</u> from current LCSS employees for the 2017-18 school year.

Any current certificated employee of the Laurens County Board of Education who wishes to be considered for a transfer to another campus for the FY18 school year must submit his or her request to do so by completing two important steps on or before February 24, 2017.

*First,* employees must create an account in SEARCH SOFT (the link is on the LCSS website homepage) and complete a **TRANSFER** APPLICATION.

Secondly, anyone who seeks a transfer within district for FY18, or anticipates wanting a transfer within Laurens County should a position become available, must submit a letter with an original signature to the potential receiving principal and the letter must be copied (cc) to the current principal and the Director of HR.

As an example if you currently teach first grade at NWLE but wish to be considered if an opening in Kindergarten or First or Second Grade were to come open at ELE, you would need to create a transfer application in SEARCHSOFT **AND** you would need to write Dr. Moorman a letter stating your desire to transfer should there be an opening <u>and</u> you would need to send Dr. Duke and Dr. Greer a copy of the letter (email or interoffice mail is fine).

#### **PBIS in Laurens County**

The Department of Education states, "Proactively teaching behavioral expectations and acknowledging students for following them is a much more positive approach than waiting for misbehavior to occur before responding." Laurens County is embracing this concept as we prepare to launch Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) during the 2017-2018 school year.

Currently, PBIS teams have been established at each school. These teams have received DOE training two full days thus far. These teams are meeting monthly to review discipline data and current discipline policies and procedures in anticipation of the full PBIS implementation next school year. Furthermore, they are using this data to identify students who need additional intervention in the areas of social and emotional skills.

According to the DOE, the installation of PBIS has a great impact on a school's overall climate rating. Of the schools implementing, data indicates the following:

PBIS schools earning 1 star = 6 schools (2%)

PBIS schools earning 2 stars = 8 schools (2.8%)

PBIS schools earning 3 stars = 31 schools (11%)

PBIS schools earning 4 stars = 113 schools (40%)

PBIS schools earning 5 stars = 126 schools (44%)



PBIS in not a "phase." The state of Georgia is steadily increasing the number of schools that are being trained to implement this framework with fidelity. Currently, 50% of GA districts, representing 900 + schools, are on board with improving the climate of their schools through the use of PBIS. Keep in mind as we launch PBIS that it is not a quick fix. This is a 3-5 year process that requires support of ALL school personnel. If you have questions, ask your administrator who represents your school as the PBIS Coach. I can hardly wait to see the positive impact this implementation will have on the students and staff of Laurens County.




### Thinking about retirement....
