

Hello everyone and welcome back! We hope you had a fantastic summer. As we look forward to kicking off the new school year, the technology department has a few things we know will need addressing. Please check out the list below:

- Since upgrading to the new Office 365 software last school year, Microsoft requires Office software (Word, PowerPoint, etc.) to be verified every 30 days. You may notice when you open an application it won't work properly until it's verified. You can fix this by opening Word (or any Office app) and clicking the "sign in" link in the top right of the window and verify your credentials.
- We are asking that you leave all computers in your room on each afternoon of preplanning. This will allow us to send out the most current updates for programs like Chrome, Firefox, etc. We will start the deployment each day after 4:00 p.m. to try and keep interruptions to a minimum.
- Be sure to check the date and time on your Chromebooks. If the date and time are not right, the Chromebook will not allow access to the network.
- Check your Clutter folder in your email for any important emails that may have been directed there. We have created new email rules to help prevent internal emails from going there, but the ones that have made it prior to the rules will still be sitting in the Clutter folder.

Student network accounts are active. If the student was in the system last year their Windows and Chrome logins should be ready to use after the student submits a signed Acceptable Use Procedure form (AUP). We will be working as fast as possible to add new student accounts. The student login format is first name, middle initial, last name (all together) and their password is their lunch code. Remember Chromebook logins use the lcboe.info domain.

We wanted to remind you to please submit tickets to the Web Help Desk. Remember that you do not use @lcboe.net on your credentials for Web Help Desk.

- Please understand that the technology department receives a tremendous amount of work tickets at the beginning of a school year. We are also working to get the renovated buildings ready before school starts. We will be working hard to address all issues in a timely manner, but the time frame may be longer than normal at this time.
- If you have issues that need to be addressed by the technology department, please send a web ticket not an email, phone call, text message, etc. We hope that everyone has a great year.

FINANCE UPDATES:

Employee Self Service system – We will begin using an employee self service system on August 31, 2016. You will need to go online and register so that you can begin using this system. Look for an email with instructions on how to register. The ESS system will allow you to see your deposit information, W4 form, as well as your leave balance. You will also be able to submit changes to your direct deposit, address, and tax status.

Direct deposit - LCBOE has implemented a "no check" policy for the FY17 school year. All of you received your pay through direct deposit or on a pay card for the July payroll. Employee expense reimbursements will also be disbursed through direct deposit.

Payroll Review - The beginning of the school year is also a good time to review your tax withholdings and salary to ensure your pay and deductions are correct.
